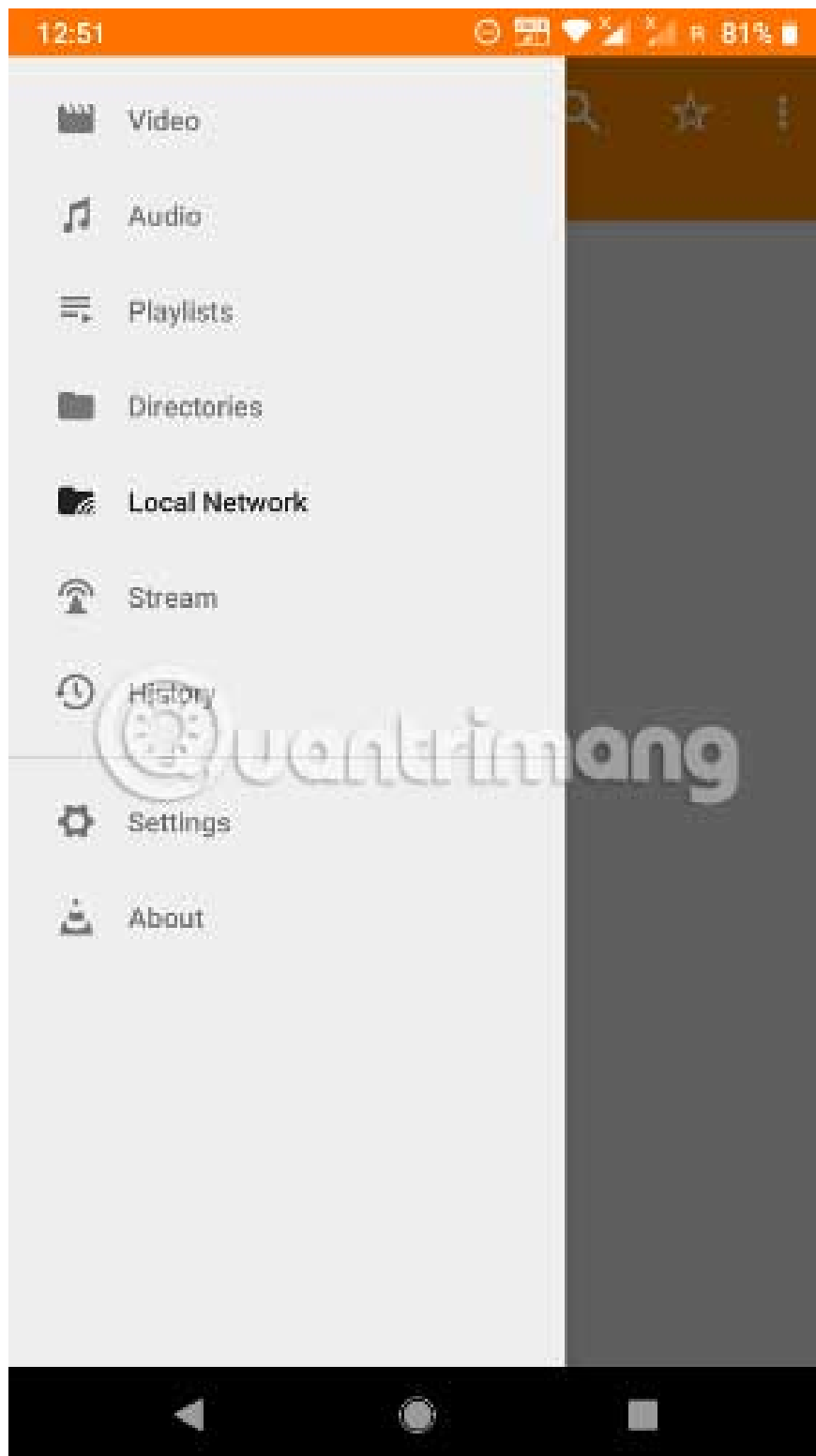

VLC is not only an excellent video player but also a great DLNA receiver, allowing you to easily find files stored on local media server and play them. From there, you can use the VLC streaming function to stream content to Chromecast or other streaming devices.



The app has a simple, easy-to-see interface and has grown tremendously since the beta launch a few years ago. Although VLC on Android is not as well known as on PC, it is still a top choice.

## 2. Plex

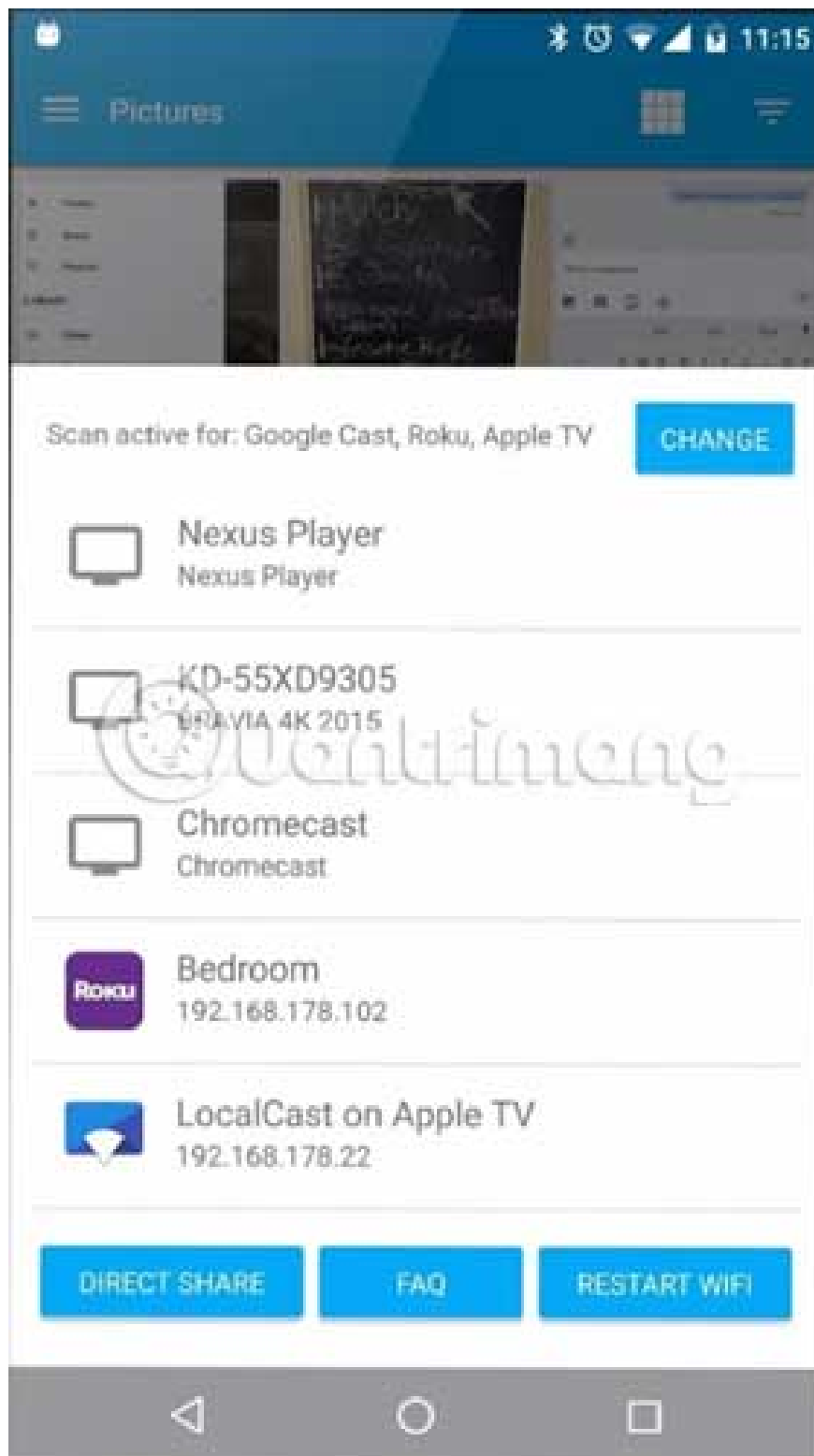
Plex is one of the best streaming media apps today. Its interface is very elegant. Plex downloads all kinds of metadata for your media, to make it look 'polished' and professional. On top of that, Plex can also be enabled to act as a DLNA server ( **Settings> Server> DLNA** ) so you can connect wirelessly to all DLNA-certified home devices and provide Give them the frontend - whether it's an Android tablet or an Android TV device.



Plex comes with all the best streaming media features like playlists shared between devices, continues to play videos on various Plex devices, uses Android devices as a remote control for Plex TV and Moreover.

### **3. LocalCast**

One of the apps set up specifically for home streaming on today's list, LocalCast has the ability to connect to DLNA, UPnP and even Samba devices to stream content from phones to throughout the house. If you have a Chromecast, LocalCast lets you pan and zoom photos quickly. Besides, LocalCast is also integrated with Opensubtitle.org, allowing you to quickly download subtitles for movies.



LocalCast works with popular devices like Chromecast, Amazon Fire TV, game consoles and all major Smart TV brands. LocalCast tends to stream video with higher quality output than Google apps like Google Photos, has its own web browser that you can stream and stream from your home network storage device, making it great. Awesome and easy to use.

## 4. Kodi

No article on streaming apps can skip mentioning one of the most popular options - Kodi. Kodi is a media center application not designed specifically for DLNA streaming, but more geared toward UPnP technology, but you can set it up this way if you like.



The biggest benefit of Kodi, for Android users, is that it's appealing thanks to add-ons from official channels like YouTube and many major sports channels, to archives that allow you to access channels around world. Naturally, Kodi is also great for streaming local storage media.

Kodi's "specialty" is video and user interface designed in that direction, but you can also use it to view photos and listen to the radio. If you're looking to stream music, there are other better options.

## 5. Hi-Fi Cast + DLNA

Hi-Fi Cast + DLNA is dedicated to music and supports playback of most popular music file formats - MP3, AAC, FLAC, WAV - to Google Home devices, as well as other devices that support DLNA streaming .



You can set all the different order for your tracks, whether it's individual tracks, artists or albums, and you can play music from Android devices or other DLNA devices that contain music. If you want to stream music, this is the best option.

## 6. MediaMonkey

MediaMonkey allows you to sync and stream media across multiple devices via WiFi, UPnP, Bluetooth and of course DLNA. What makes MediaMonkey stand out is its clean interface and loads of media management tools that help keep the library organized, like managing playlists, editing multiple files and bookmarks, and so on.



You need to pay for extras like using unlimited DLNA, but spending a few dollars on one of the most complete streaming apps is well worth it.

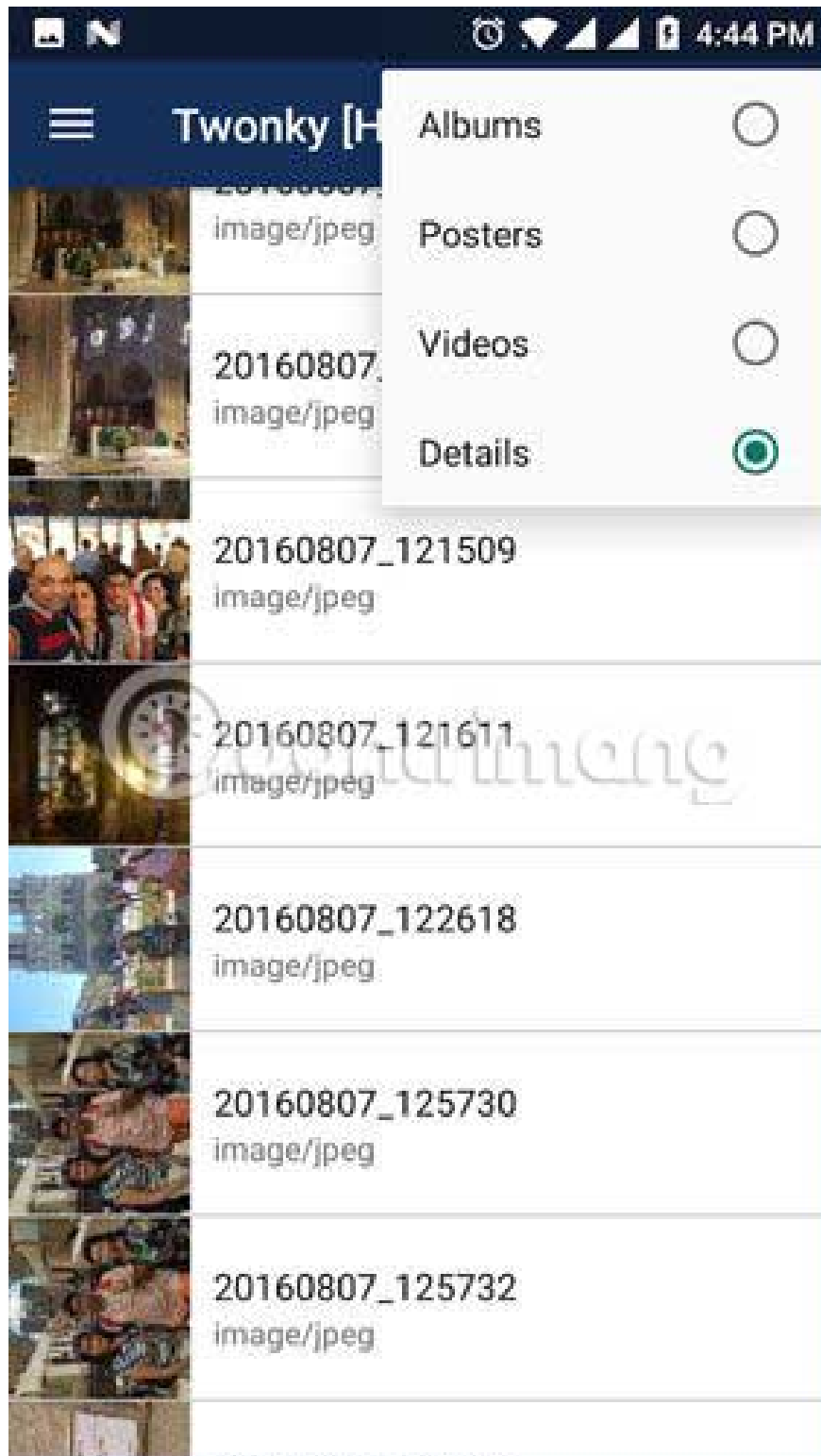
## 7. BubbleUPnP



BubbleUPnP UPnP / DLNA allows you to stream content right from your device to a compatible DLNA device. BubbleUPnP supports Chromecast, all TVs support DLNA and the latest generation of game consoles. Different from basic streaming, BubbleUPnP also comes with features like play queue, editable playlist, scrobbling (using the songs you have heard through the media player and sending information for improvement. ), as well as editing those songs), sleep timer and other sorting modes. 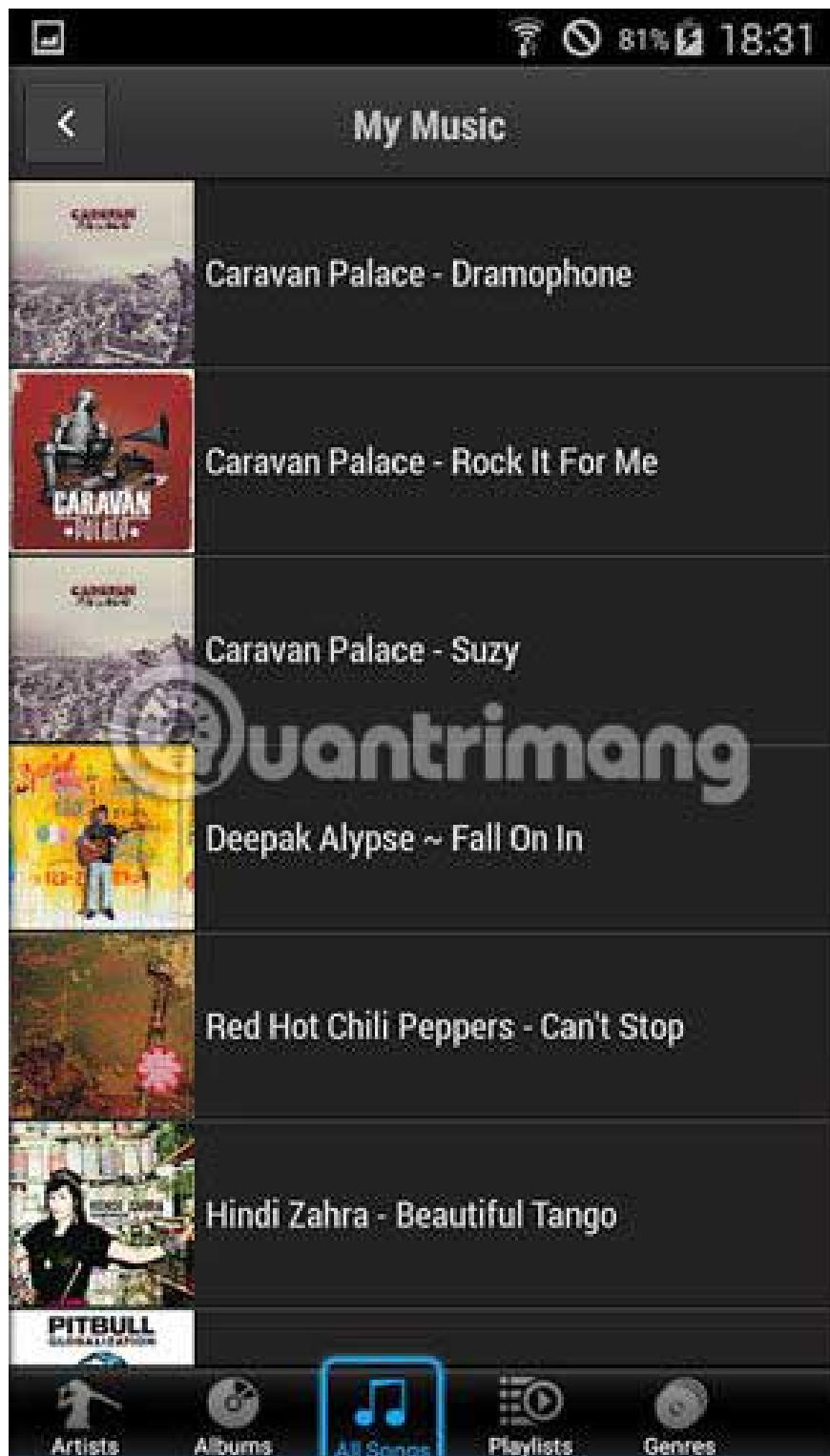
The biggest advantage is free BubbleUPnP!

## 8. MediaHouse UPnP / DLNA Browser



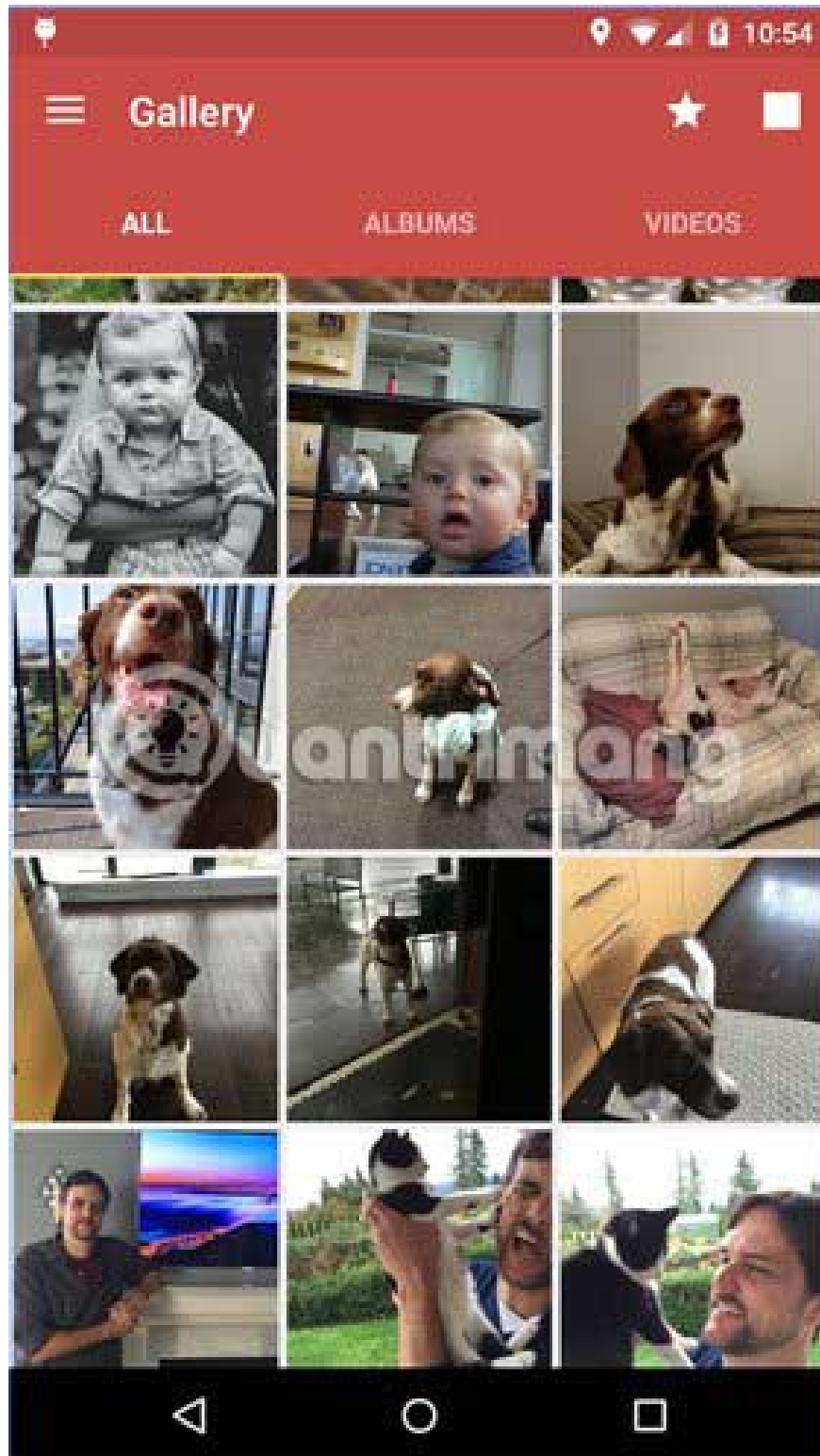
If you want to have more features, consider MediaHouse UPnP / DLNA Browser. This app has several DLNA streaming features to help you stream videos and music the way you want. For example, it automatically scans WiFi networks for devices that support DLNA so you can connect to them. MediaHouse UPnP / DLNA Browser divides scanned devices into two categories: The first is the device you can stream your content to and the second is the device you can stream content from. MediaHouse UPnP / DLNA Browser supports creating playlists for music files, has image viewer and operates in landscape mode.

## **9. iMediaShare Personal**



If you want a DLNA app with a great interface, give iMediaShare Personal a try. The app allows you to stream digital media right from your Android device to a big TV without any cables. While the media is being played on the TV, the application acts as a remote for you to control it. iMediaShare Personal allows you to control playback with operations such as pause, forward, etc. using hand gestures.

## 10. AllCast



While all of the apps listed up to this point have the ability to transfer content to any device, AllCast offers the highest compatibility. AllCast can stream media to Chromecast, Amazon Fire TV, Apple TV, Xbox 360 and Xbox One, PS4, as well as other DLNA-enabled devices. AllCast can also stream from Dropbox, allowing you to stream content without having to download it first.

Setting yourself up for DLNA streaming might sound 'tricky', as it involves an acronym for a long and complex tech term, but doing that is actually quite easy.
