But there are also a number of toolbars that aim to make your web browsing more efficient and enjoyable.

Here, we would like to point to 10 of the best-known toolbars today. All of these toolbars are configurable and compatible with Internet Explorer and some other popular web browsers. And of course they are all free apps.

Google Toolbar 3.0 ([Http://toolbar.google.com](http://toolbar.google.com))

The Google Toolbar is still one of the top apps. The toolbar lets you access existing Google features from any web page and gives you the ability to search content in web pages with Google's search engine. Besides, Google Toolbar also gives you pop-up ad blocking, automatic filtering of forms, genuine error checking, translation and auto-link feature that allows linking street name addresses City to Google online map.

You can also integrate Google Toolbar with Google Desktop Search to make it easier to access resources on your computer and to launch applications. The Google Toolbar also has a version for Firefox. Of course, Google Toolbar is best compatible with Internet Explorer.

Yahoo! Toolbar (<http://toolbar.yahoo.com>)

Yahoo! The Toolbar gives you the ability to block pop-up ads and anti-spyware features. Just like the Google Toolbar, Yahoo! Toolbar gives you easy access to Yahoo! like Yahoo! Music Engine, news or weather information.

However, to access and use those services, you need to have a Yahoo! account. Recently, Yahoo! has just released a toolbar version for open source Firefox browser. However, this version lacks some features compared to the version for Internet Explorer.

A-ToolBar 3.0 gives users up to 50 different tools - an amazing number. However contrary to what users expect from this tool's 'multipurpose' feature, the usefulness of A-ToolBar features is not the same - some are really useful but others are not. For example, a bio-beat chart feature or a love calculation tool may not be included in your list of frequently used features, but a desktop search or desktop tool. Currency conversion is really useful for anyone.

Besides, a full collection of 20 web and web tools will also make the advanced users happy. The pop-up ad blocking feature, the metasearching feature along with the ability to add new search engines to the toolbar make A-ToolBar truly an A + open application.

Quero Toolbar (<http://www.quero.at>)

Small and simple, the Quero toolbar focuses on its 'search expertise' rather than providing a range of tools that are rarely used or confusing to users. Instead of taking up valuable desktop space, Quero replaced the standard address bar in Internet Explorer.

Using the Quero toolbar users can choose between 12 useful search engines or built-in Flash tools along with the ability to block pop-up ads. Besides, Quero also allows users to use the shortcut or 'find-as-you-type' search function - to search directly when you enter a keyword. Perhaps the most distinctive feature in Quero is the 'zoom' capability - enlarging what is displayed on the screen, a feature designed for people with visual impairments.

jetToolBar (<http://www.cowonamerica.com>)

jetToolBar is rated as a very well designed toolbar. The toolbar occupies a 'very humble' position on the desktop with functions that allow organizers to quickly find and launch web application programs. Application shortcuts

are organized according to dozens of different tabbed items that make accessing them more convenient.

Besides the buttons on the toolbar can also be increased or decreased in size with seven different levels make users easier to read and observe them. jetToolBar is completely at your fingertips, the toolbar supports comprehensive customization features that allow you to drag-and-drop different buttons or items quite easily or you can lock the bar tool into a certain corner of the desktop. If you have a microphone, you can also run software with your own sound.

Advanced Searchbar (<http://www.advancedsearchbar.com>)

Although the name of this toolbar may not attract your attention, it certainly does. Advanced Searchbar gives you about 100 different search engines, 60 news providers, and more than three dozen email applications.

Advanced Searchbar is also equipped with many popular spyware scanning applications, instant messenger blogs and senders. Icons on the toolbar allow you to easily access many different feature applications including file splitting, RSS reading, computer, weather forecast, pop-style ad blocking. -up or translate web .

Viewpoint Toolbar (<http://www.viewpoint.com/pub>)

Viewpoint Toolbar gives you a unique and very time-saving way to surf the web and search by allowing you to preview your search results with thumbnail images in real time and with Content annotation texts. You can easily store, search and share favorite addresses using the same method.

The toolbar also makes it convenient for you to access and store important website addresses. Of course, Viewpoint Toolbar also has features like pop-up ads blocking or digital photo management application.

The Fur toolbar turns Internet sites into your own website by giving you 5GB of space on Furl's server to store any websites you have visited and then you can access them. Re-upload these sites on Furl's server with any Internet-connected computer. You can share these websites or keep them for yourself. This is truly an ideal solution for students and researchers.

Copernic Meta (<http://www.copernic.com>)

This is really an ideal search engine for web researchers. This tool does a thorough search (metasearch) of web pages, photos, audio, multimedia files, news, auctions . Moreover, you may not need to open it. The browser, you can conduct search from any one application at any time via a 'Copernic box' on the Start menu bar.

Besides Copernic also supports special items such as Web, Shopping, Dictionary or Thesaurus with the ability to perform searches on multiple search engines at the same time as the above topic. You can also add and manage your own search engines, set shortcuts or search for information by selecting keywords directly in the site.

Blinkx (<http://www.blinkx.com>)
