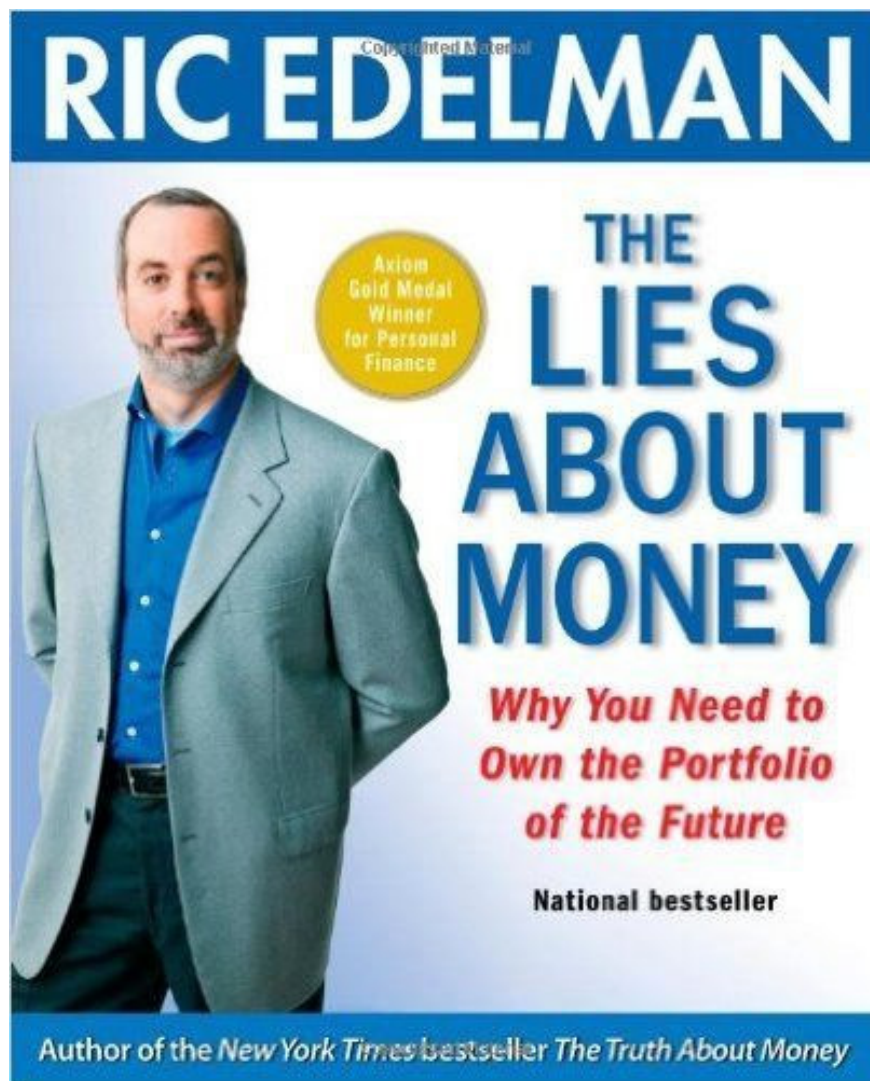

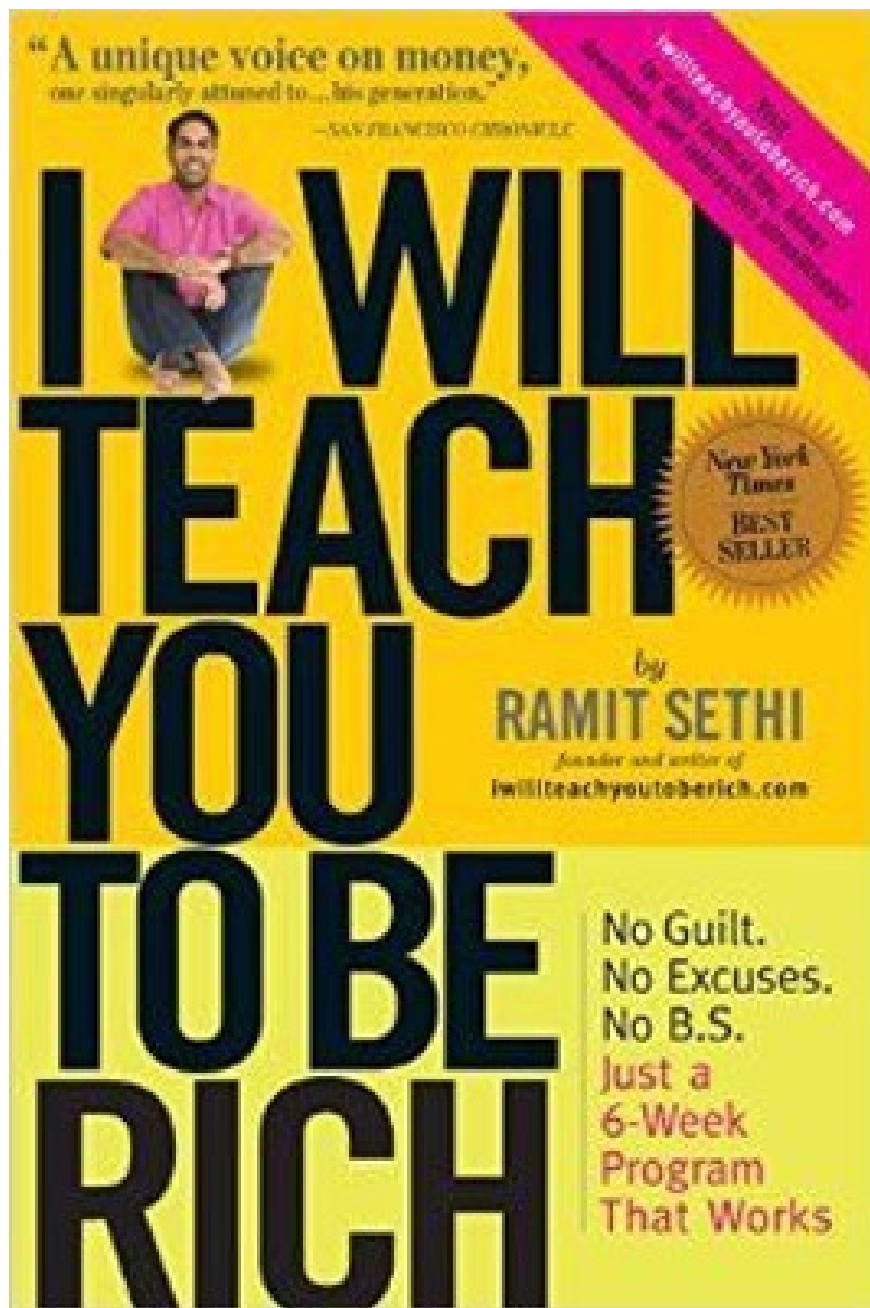

2. I Teach You To Be Rich - Sethi, Ramit

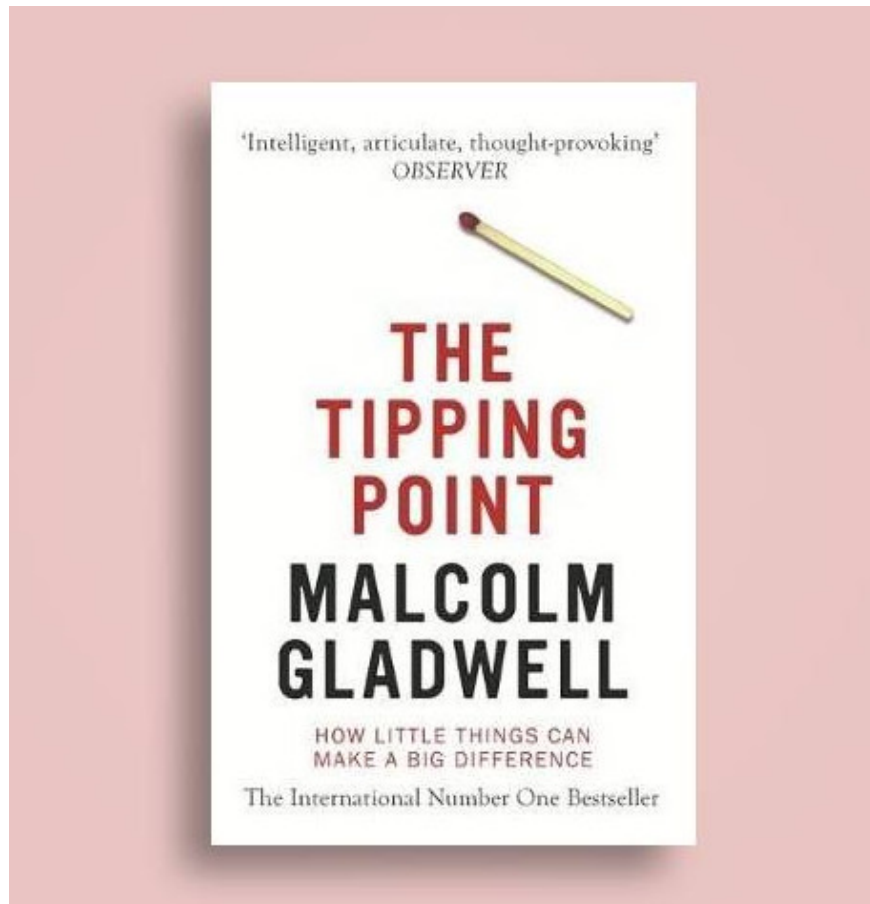

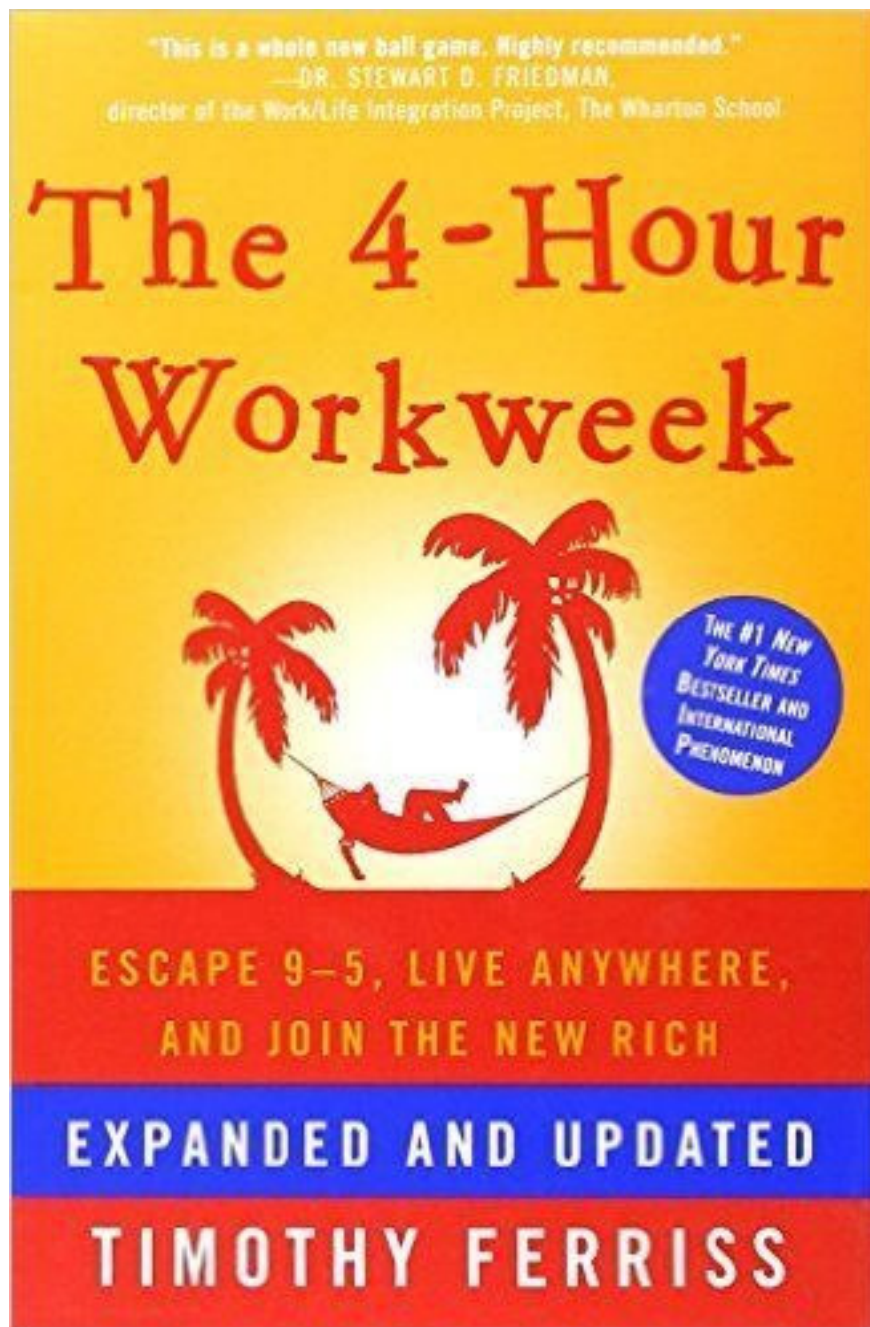


One of the most inspiring books for passionate entrepreneurs, the things I learned from this book show that there is a lot more to do with materials than just commenting.

4. The 4-Hour Workweek: Escape the 9-5, Live Anywhere, and Join the New Rich - Ferriss, Timothy

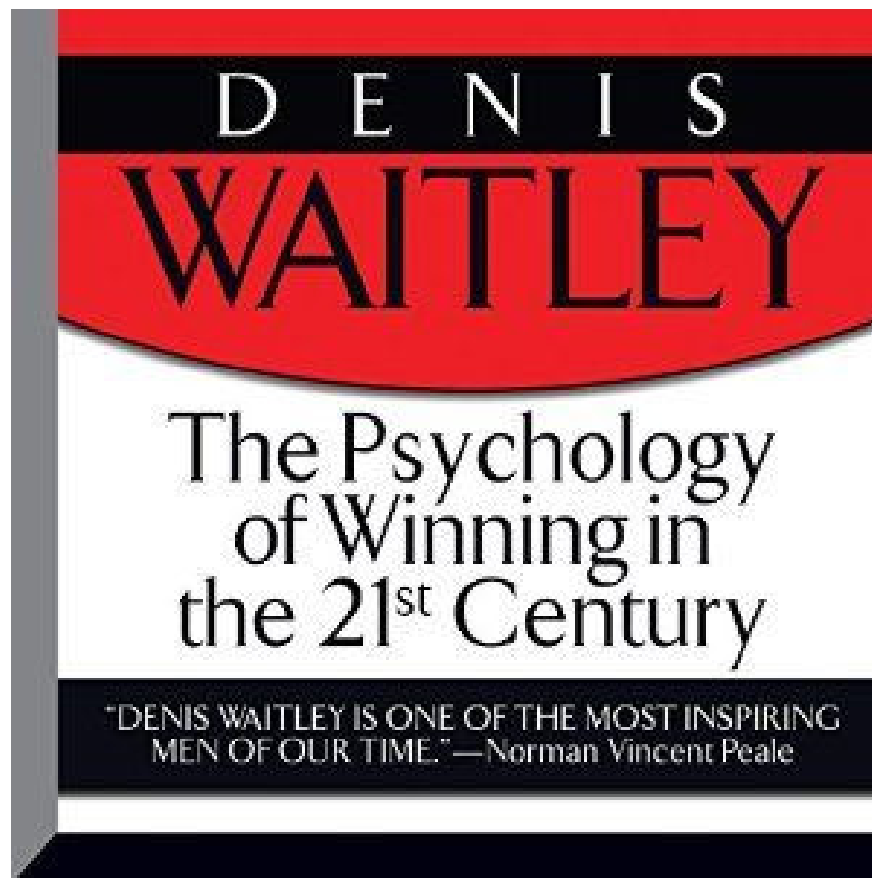

5. The Psychology of Winning for the 21st Century - Waitley, Dennis

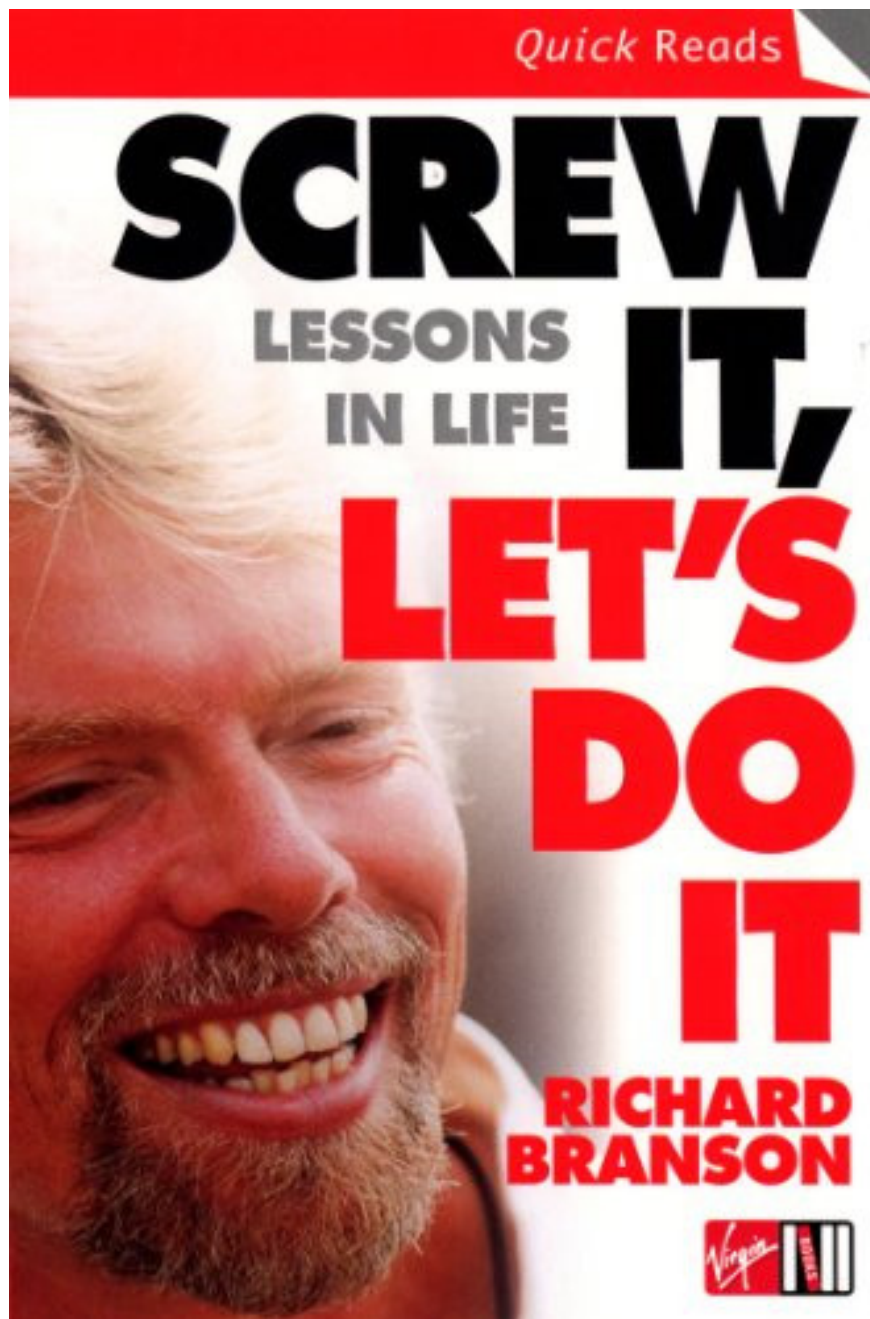

6. Screw It, Let's Do It: Lessons in Life and Business - Branson, Richard

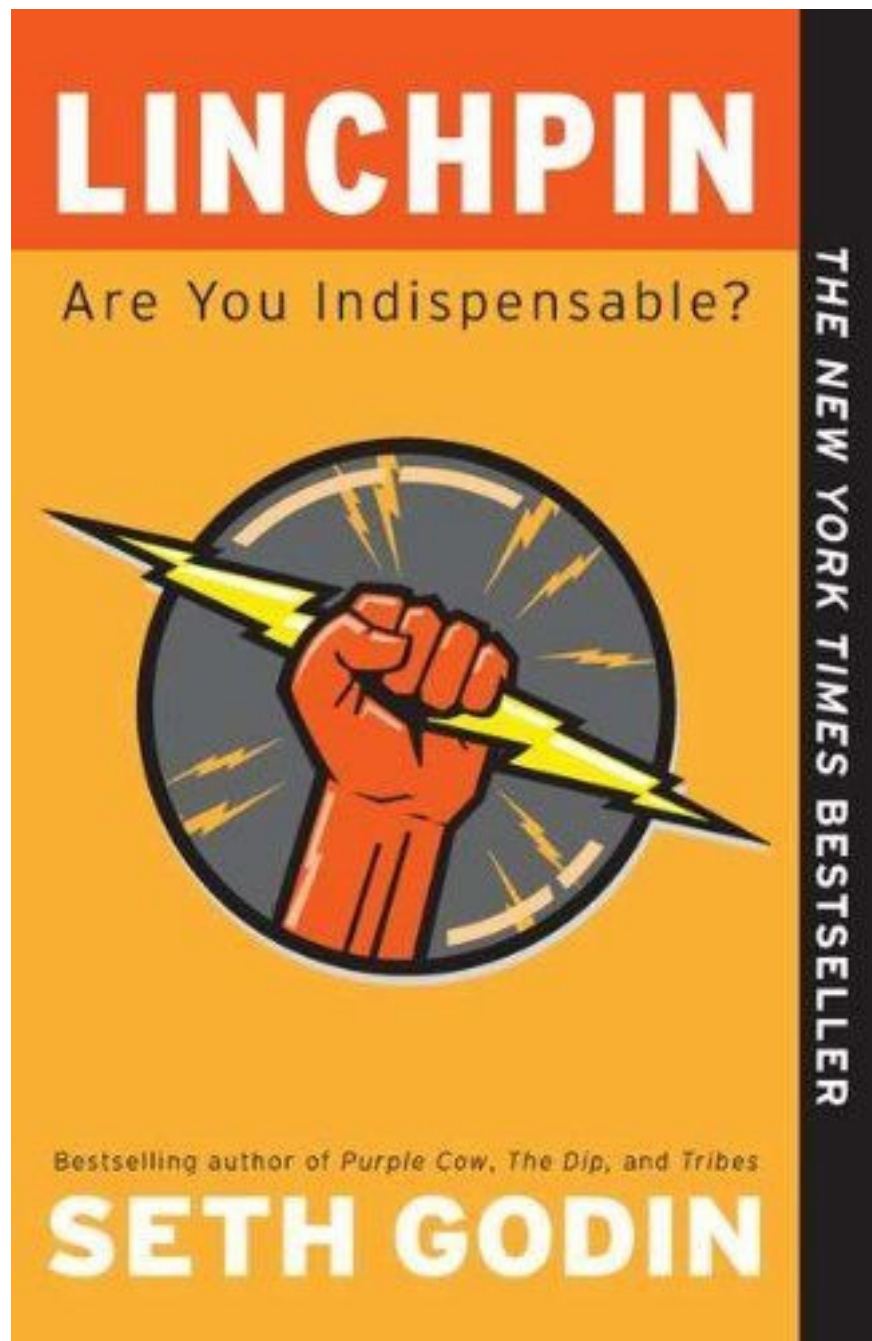

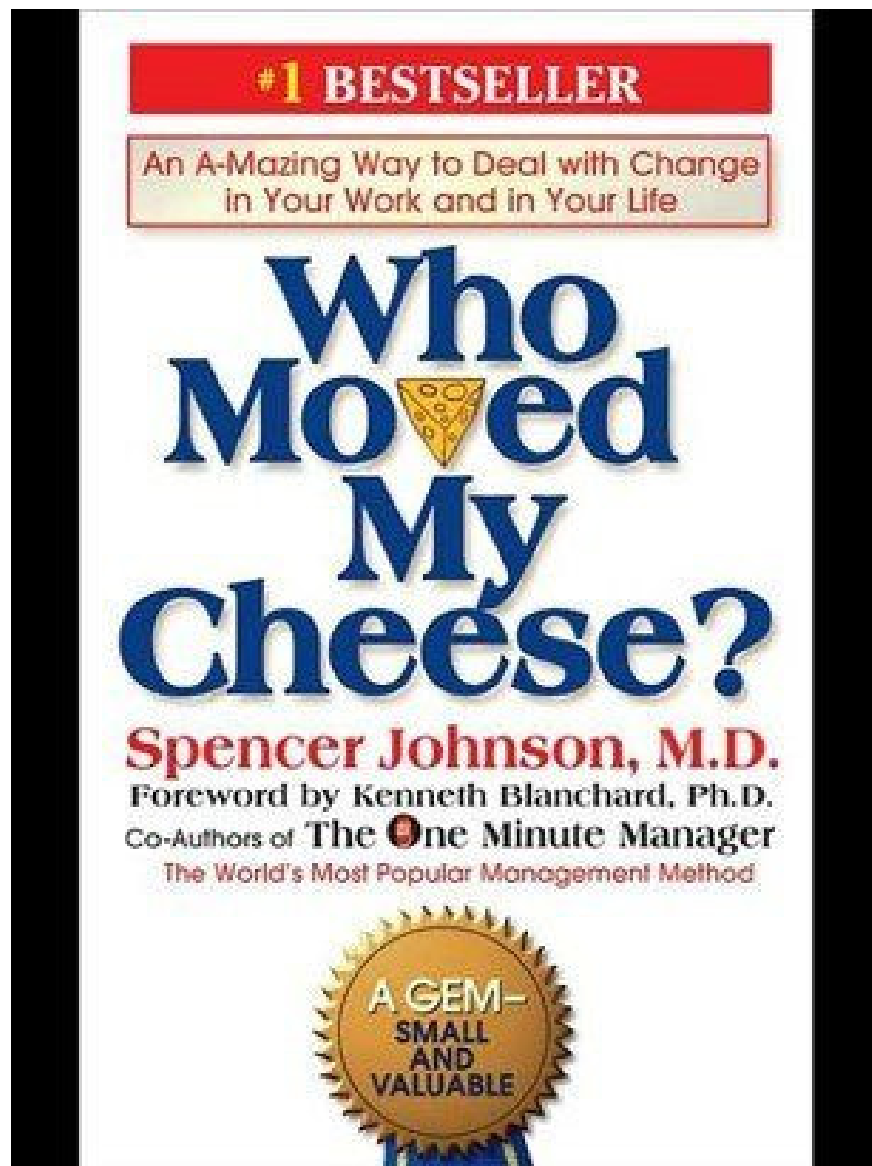
