1. Giant statue dating back 3,000 years in Egypt



German and Egyptian archaeologists have discovered different parts of a statue up to 9m tall, believed to be the king of Ramses the Great, the ruling pharaoh 3,000 years ago. This is the largest statue of the last time ever found in Egypt.

2. Decode the submarine mystery of Hunley



During the American Civil War, the Southern Union's Hunley submarine was deployed in February 1864. This was Hunley's last maritime voyage and it became the first sea submarine to sink.

5. New discoveries at the Antikythera wreck



Antikythera is a Roman shipwreck discovered near Antikythera island of Greece. In 1900, the ship was discovered and conducted many excavations. In the 2017 archaeological excavation, the researchers made unexpected findings, many interesting artifacts were discovered. The most special is the bronze arm, which is a brownish green, from a few to the fingertips of a large statue, still able to see some carvings.

6. Found an ancient settlement of 3 times the Egyptian pyramid in Canada



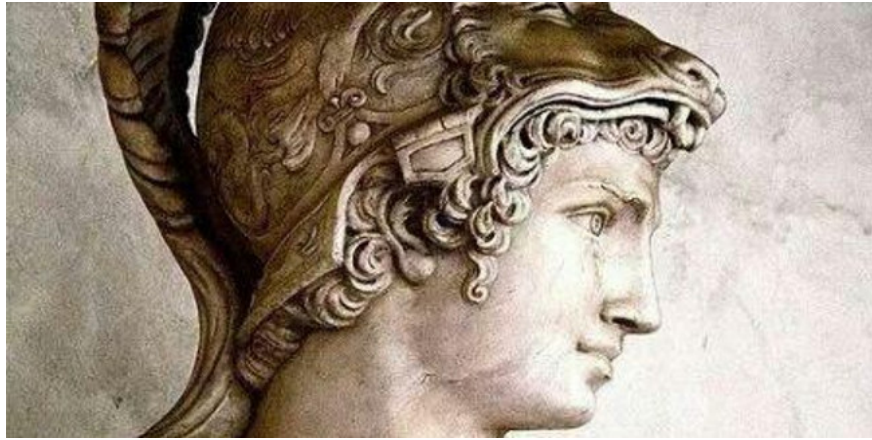
