

10 Samsung Galaxy Features All Android Phones Should Learn

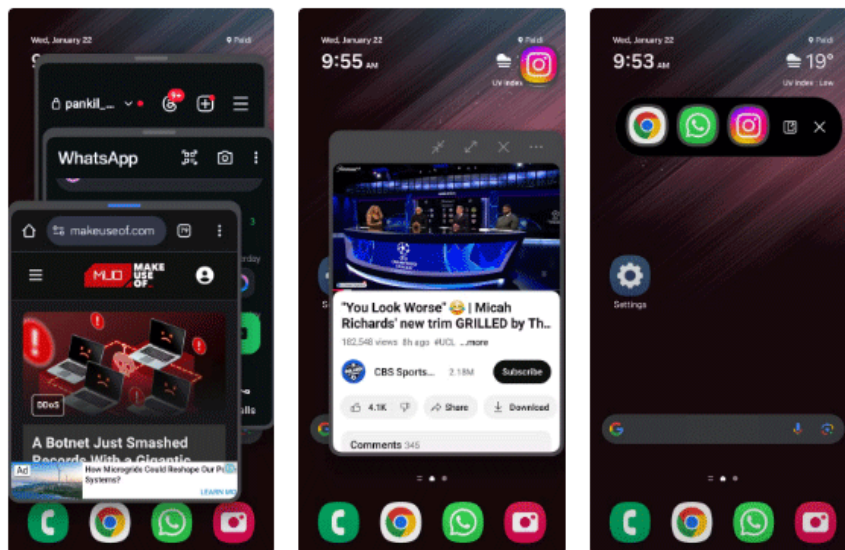
If you've been using a Samsung phone for a few years now, you'll find the great features the Galaxy line offers hard to beat.

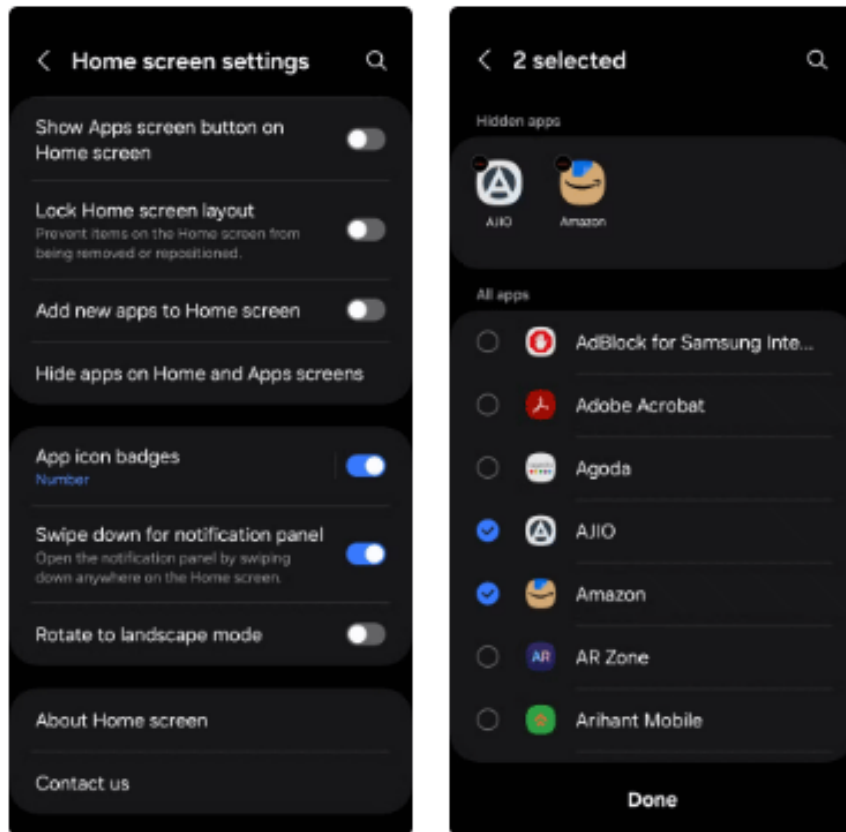

3. Hide app option

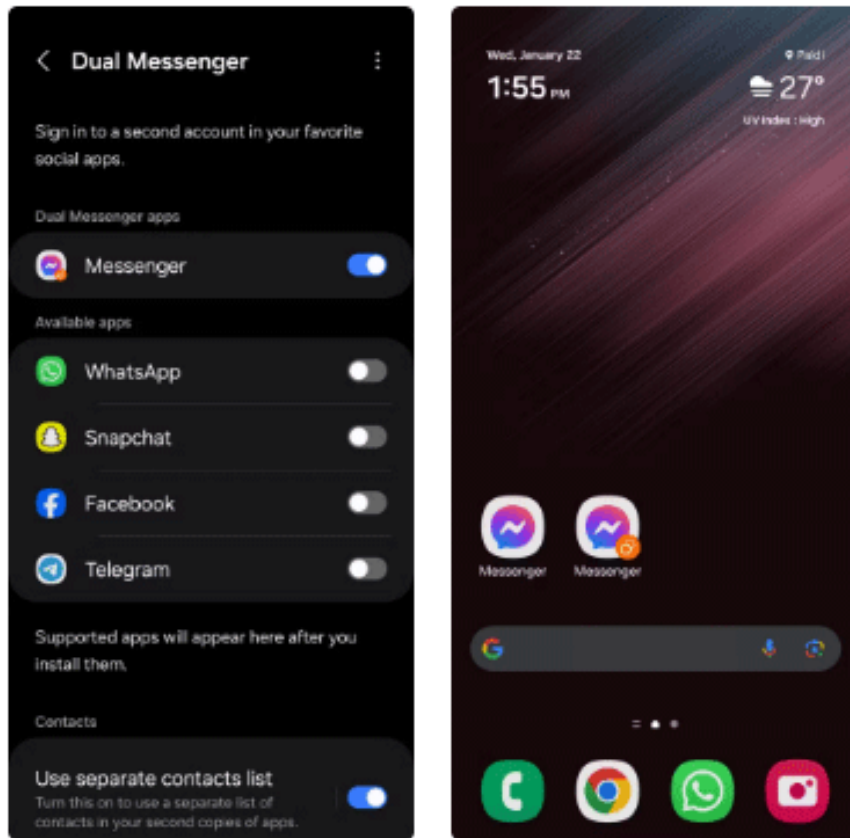

4. Dual Messenger

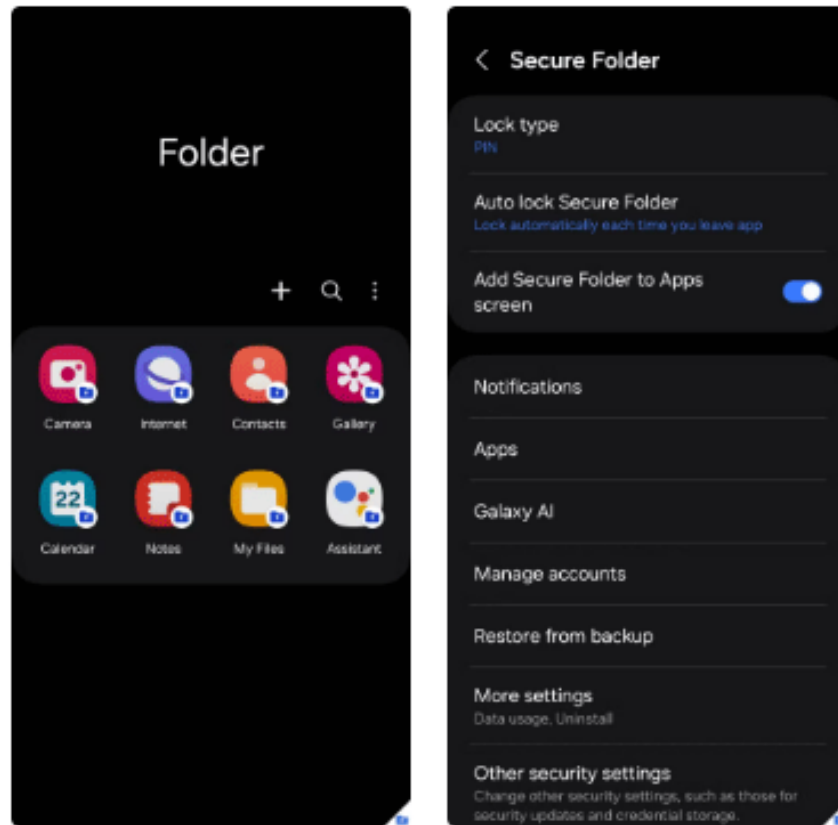

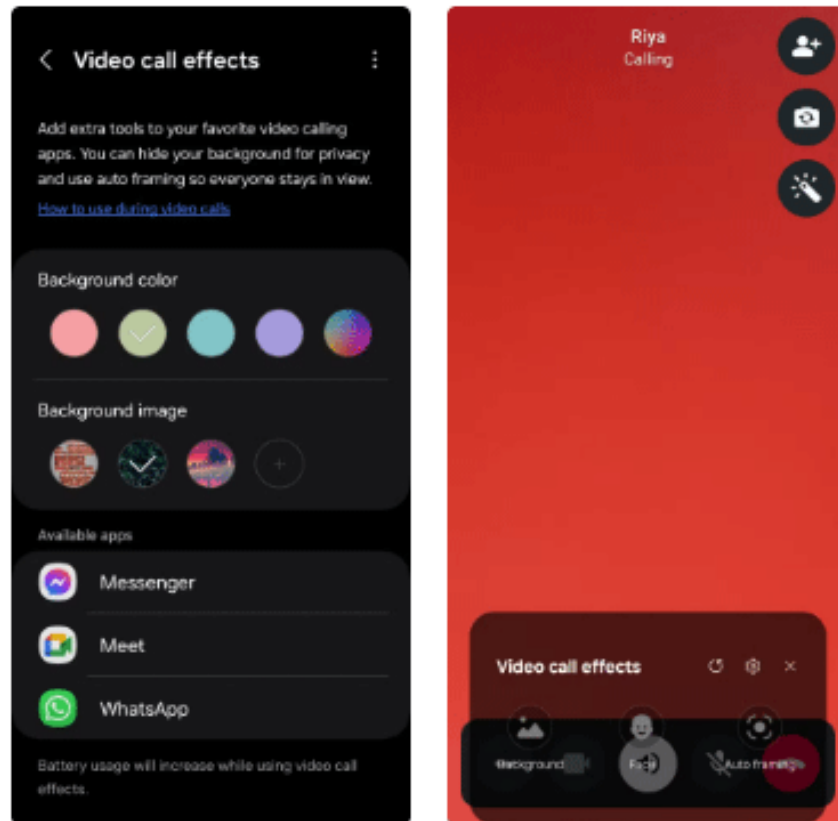
This level of privacy should be standard on all Android devices, as it provides peace of mind for those who want to keep their personal information safe and accessible.



6. Video call effects

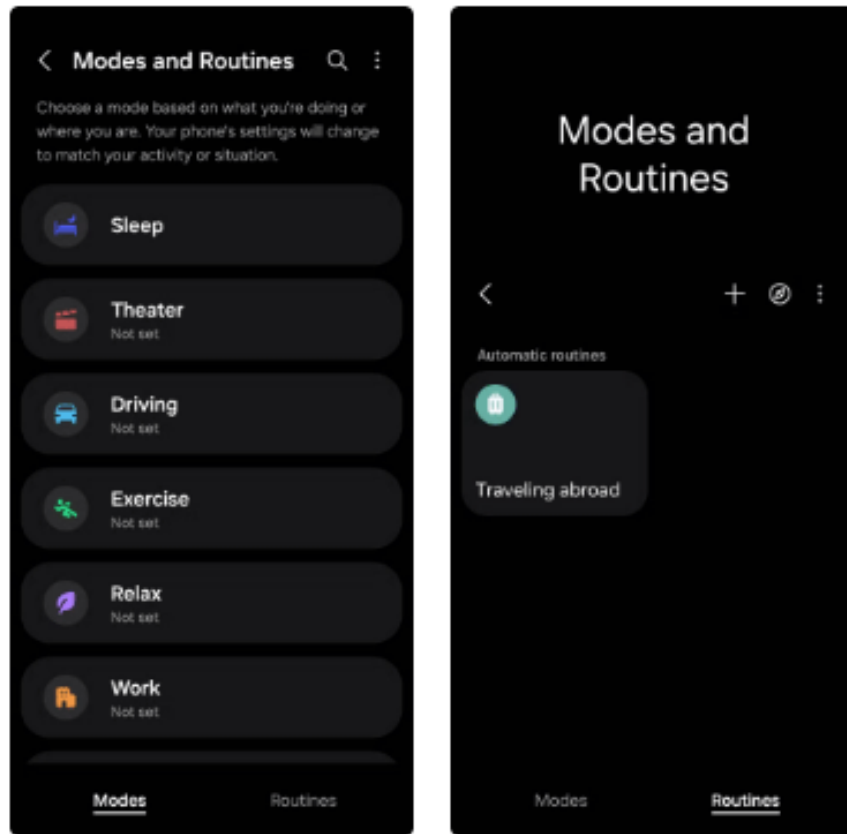

7. Modes and Routines

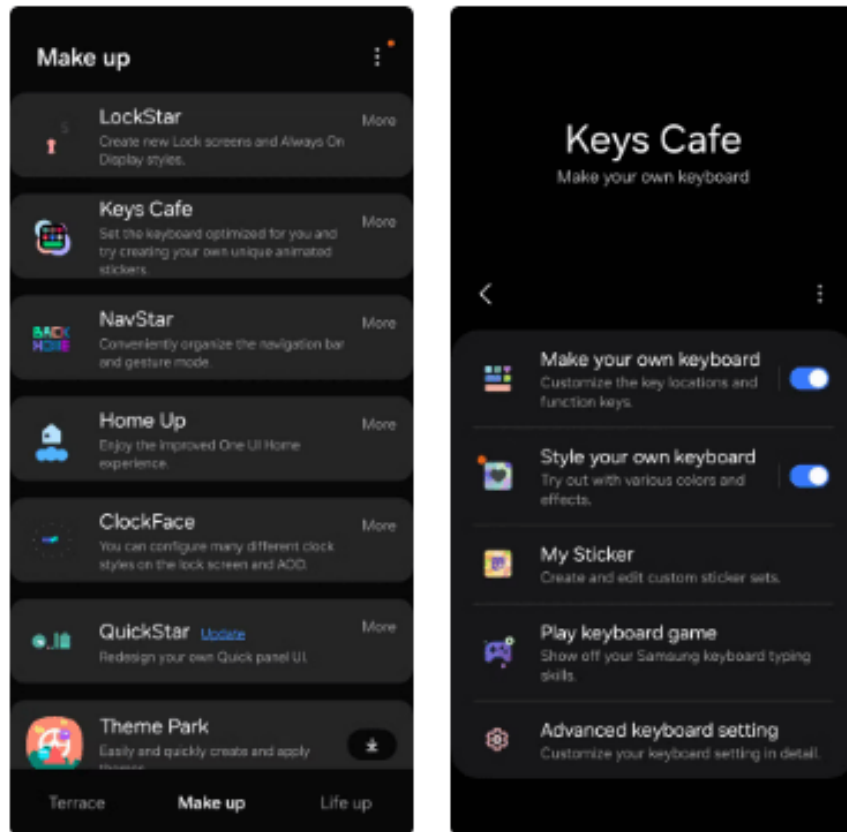
Remember automation apps like IFTTT and Tasker? Now you can use One UI's Modes and Routines feature to bring similar automation capabilities to your Samsung phone.

Customization is one of Android's strongest points, and while most Android phones excel in this regard, none can match the customization capabilities of Samsung's Good Lock module.

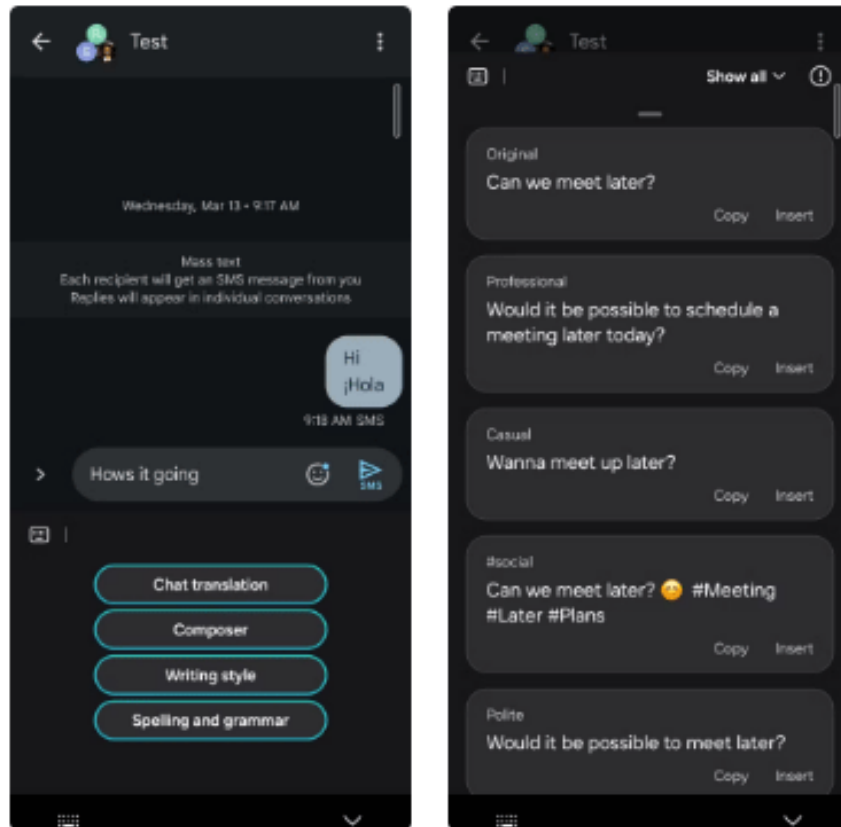
There are a variety of different Good Lock modules available that provide an unparalleled level of control over the look and functionality of your device.

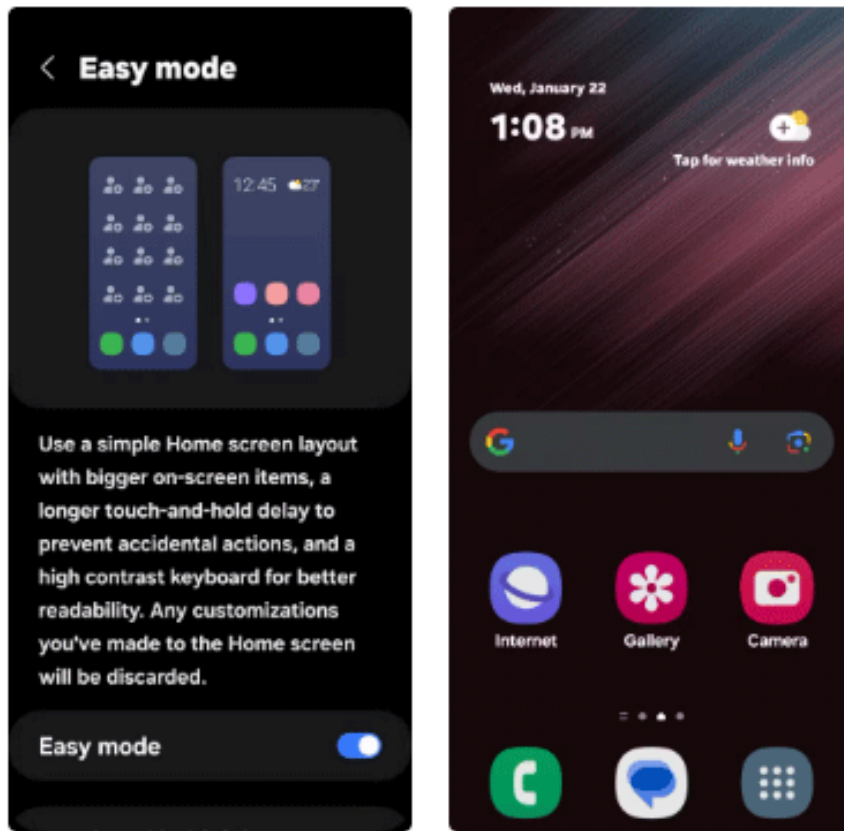
