#### **4. Eclectus Parrot**



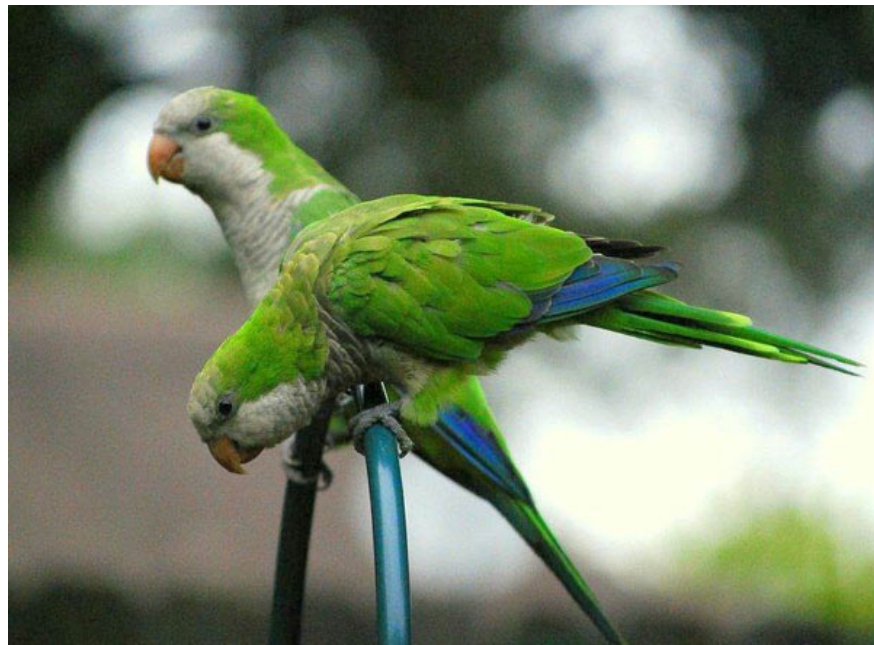

## 7. Hill Myna - Hill Myna



The Young bird impresses with its surprisingly accurate pronunciation. This bird stands out with its blue-black feathers, red-yellow beak, and yellow-striped head.

## 8. Cockatoo - Cockatoo



With the ability to hear and imitate familiar sounds, cockatoos have the ability to speak human language very well. The number of words and their ability to speak depends on the trainer.

## 9. Yellow-crowned Amazon
