2. Brushes on the escalator



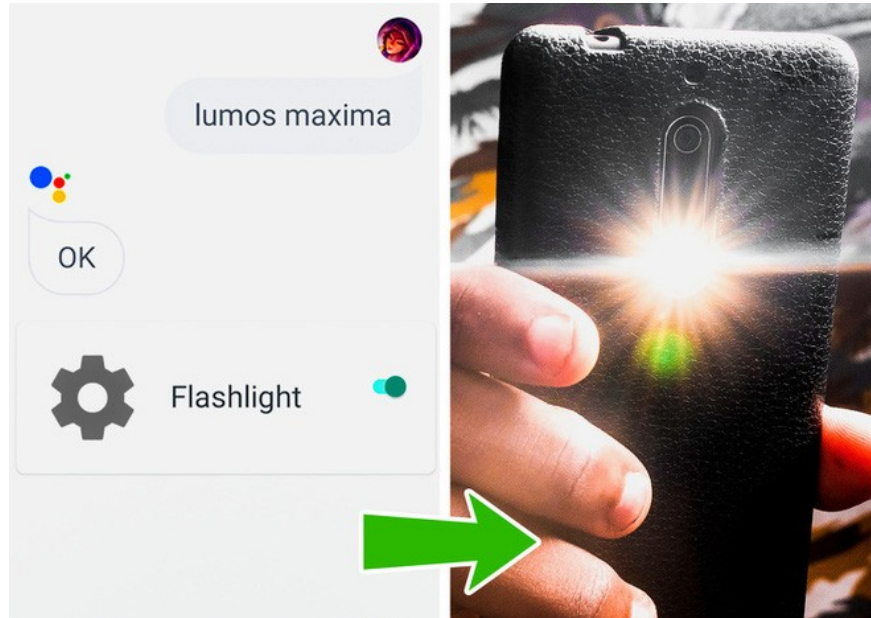

5. Dents on golf balls



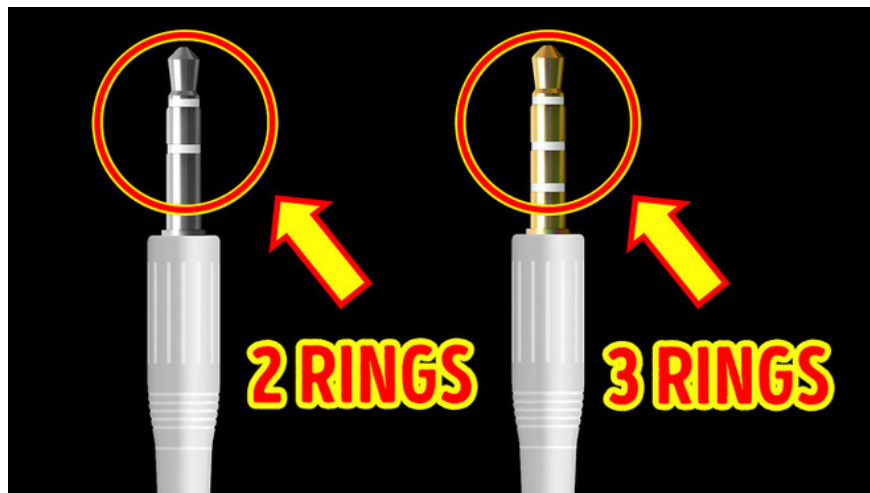

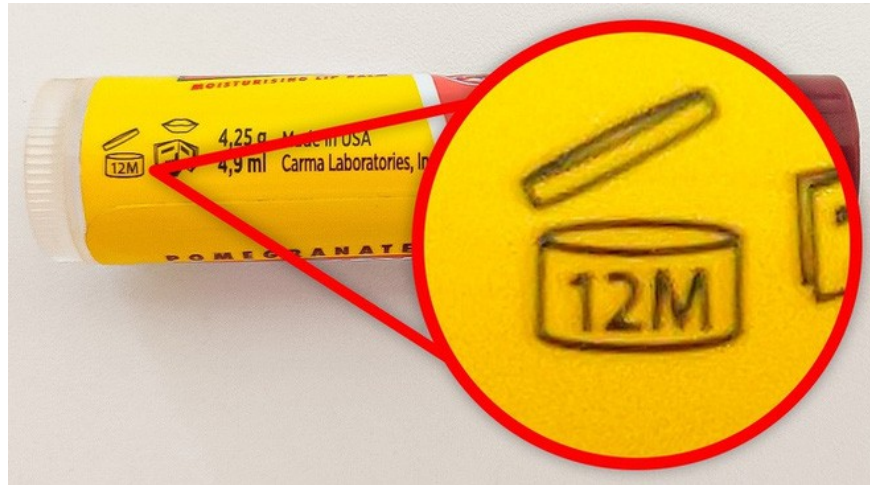
7. Circle on the 3.5mm jack

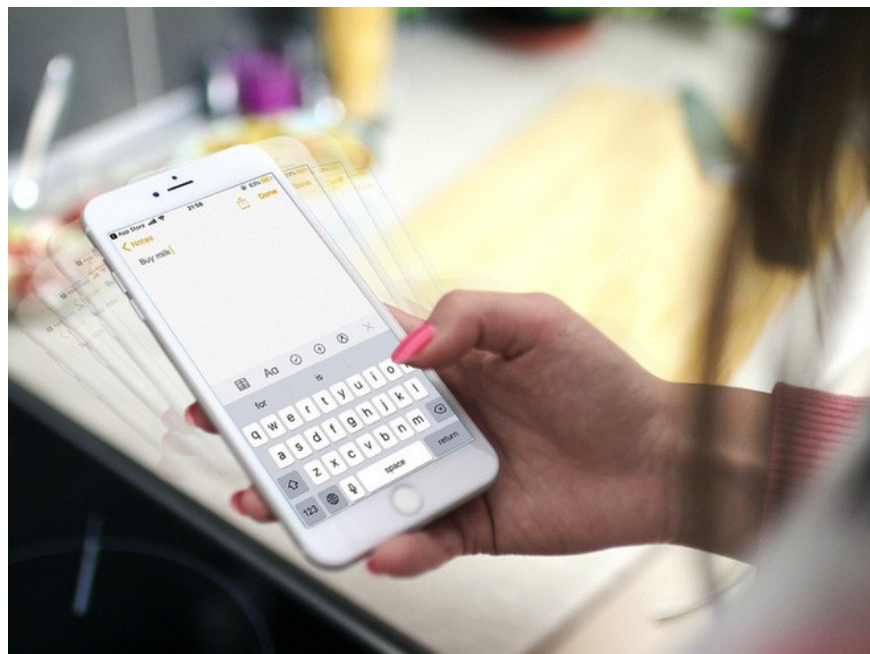
left and right headphones sound a bit different. Three stripes are commonly found in devices that support microphones.

9. Shake to undo the action on iPhone
