

10 things you don't put in the clothes dryer if you don't want to ruin it

In humid weather days or for laundries it is difficult to lack a clothes dryer. However, if not used properly, it will be easy to damage the item and damage the dryer. The note cannot be ignored when using a clothes dryer

1. Do not put the carpet into the dryer



Maintain your rubber mats by drying them on a rope. If using a dryer, high temperature from the machine can make the rubber part cracked, broken, making the carpet become ugly, less efficient use. This can also become a cause of fire, small rubber chips will fall into the dryer and cause unpredictable things.

2. Clothes are stained with paint



Even if you have finished painting, you may have some paint on the walls or nail polish. These are chemical stains that should not appear in the dryer. Whether they are detergents or polishes, most of them are flammable chemicals. That means that once they touch the dryer, it will most likely cause a fire. Prevention is better than cure, it's better to hang them up to dry them.

3. Sports wear



Keep your sports suits in the best shape by hanging them up to dry instead of using a dryer. Chip Smith, Sears Home Services' marketing manager, said: "Most sports suits are made of spandex fabric, which is easily damaged and worn when using the dryer. Legging training pants need attention. more mind".

4. Sneaker shoes



Although you can wash shoes by machine, you should let them dry naturally rather than using a dryer. Experts from LG and Johnson also said "High temperatures can cause rubber in shoes and shoe soles to shrink. This affects the cushion, may even make you no longer fit shoes."

5. Drying too many things at once



"As much as possible" probably does not apply to dryers. An overheated dryer due to overload may cause a fire. Reduce the load by breaking down the number of dryers each time, when the machine is working, you can slowly add a few items. This allows hot air to flow properly. If you stuff too much in one drying, maybe what you get will be just a bunch of clothes that are still wet.

6. Too much fabric softener and aromatherapy paper



Have you ever had to remove clothes from the dryer because a wax film was found on them? It may be from an excessively fragrant drying paper. Too many chemical compounds (contained in detergents) remain on the surface, these compounds will cover the drying drum, moisture sensor, filter and ventilation system. Instead of giving too much fabric softener, it is better to use it in sufficient amounts.

7. Sand mixed in clothes



You like beach days . but your dryer doesn't. Make sure you remove the sand from towels, as well as swimsuits before putting them in the dryer. Sand can be trapped between drying drums, causing unpleasant noises and contributing to reducing dryer life.

8. Swimwear



The capital is often made from high temperature drying spandex fabric which will cause them to stretch and appear some thin fabric points to see through. So, for swimsuits, you should swim by hanging neatly on the clothesline. Make sure you wash the swimwear properly to ensure the best possible performance.

9. Natural fabric yarn

Care should be taken to keep clothes made from materials of a unique origin such as: wool, cashmere, silk and leather. These materials can shrink, lose shape, feel like they cover the surface with medicine. Leather or imitation leather products can be cracked, bent, wrinkled due to the heat of the dryer. Carefully read the instructions for using it to learn how to take care of it best.

10. Internal medicine



Ideally, expose your bra to the clothes line, regardless of whether they are lace, spandex, satin, silk or cotton. The drying temperature and the rotation of them in the drying cage can damage the fabric material, causing the lining to be damaged. You can also try washing clothes under a salad dresser to keep them in shape.
