During the preservation of a kiln in Newport Memorial Hall, archaeologists unearthed a second furnace and pots and thousands of other related artifacts including pots and pots .

Some people have found finger prints of an ancient potter who worked at the site more than 500 years ago.



Archaeologist Nick Taverner said he has restored excavations at the site for more than 10 days, one of the quickest and most valuable discoveries and excavations of over 40 years of his excavation.

The team called on volunteers to help wash, mark and arrange pottery by hand to display at the hall.



Not only that, archaeologists are also waiting to unearth another block of objects suspected to be Middle Ages, the object recorded by historian Sir Mortimer Wheeler in 1921.
