

11 amazing Android apps that will change the way you use your phone

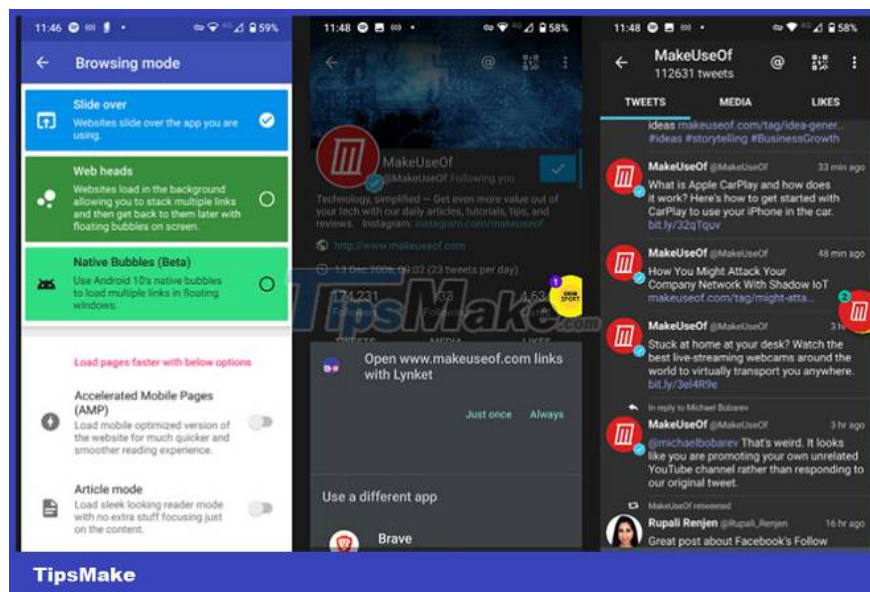
There are apps that will completely change the way you use your Android device. Some improve the user interface, automate common tasks, and some take common features in the operating system and improve them to be better.

1. Lynket Browser



Social media is a great place to find interesting articles on the web, but it's not always convenient to read them right away. Sometimes it's better to save a few articles and come back to them later.

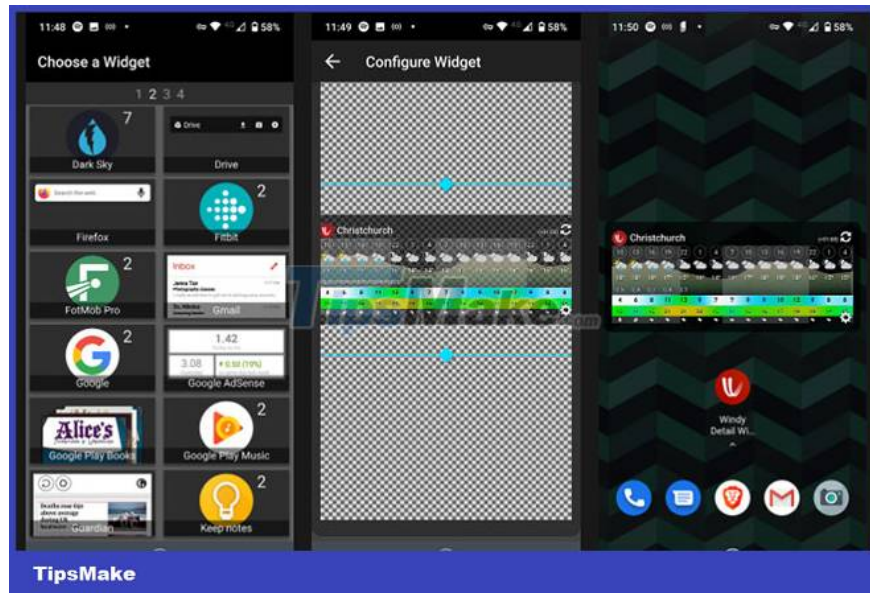
That's what you can do with Lynket Browser. It opens web pages in the background. You can access them whenever you want by touching the floating bubble on the screen. Simple but very useful. The app works with your existing default browser and can also speed up browsing by automatically loading AMP versions of the

links you click.

Another great feature of Lynket Browser is the option to read pages in Article mode, which loads a sleek reading mode without any other unnecessary frills.

Although the application has not been updated for a short time, it still does what it promises.

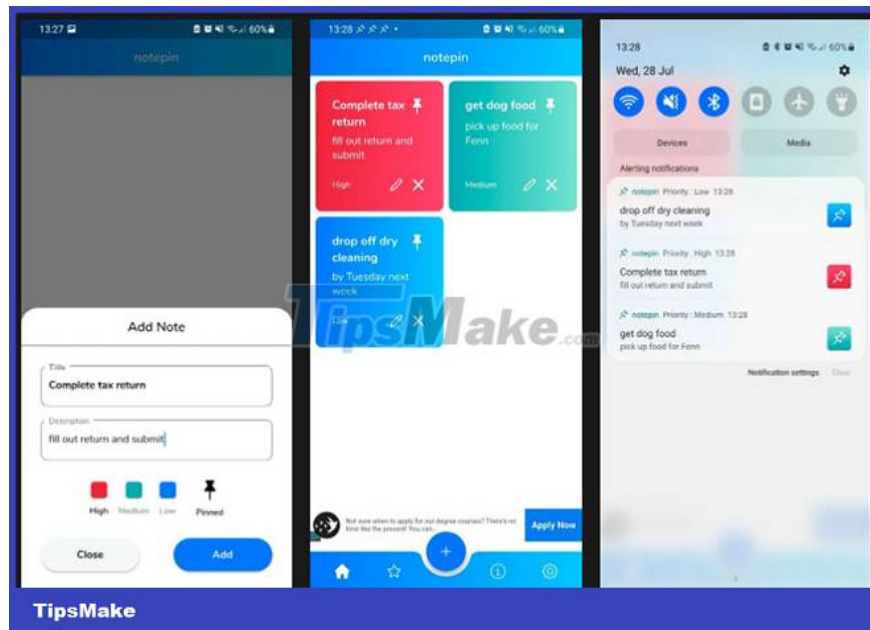
2. Popup Widget 3



The best Android widgets are really useful, but if you use them too much, they quickly clutter up your home screen and slow down your phone.

Popup Widget 3 revisits how these widgets work. It turns all your selected widgets into 1x1 icons on the home screen. When you touch an icon, widgets appear. The app gives you convenience - you don't have to launch the full app just to see your latest tweets or check the weather - and without compromising on performance.

3. Notepin

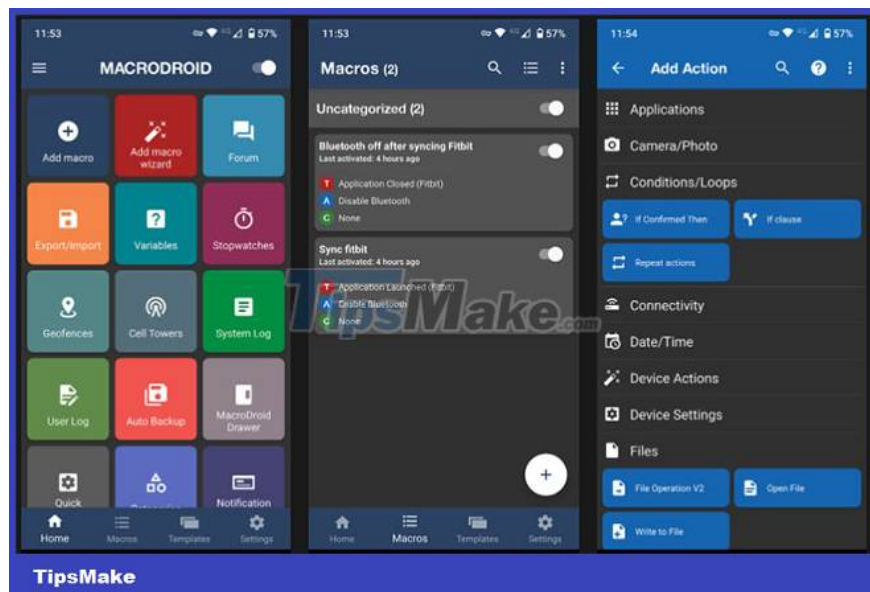


Notepin makes everything so clear that you'll wonder why it's not part of Android. Simply put, Notepin allows you to create notes and then pin them to the bulletin board as reminders.

While the app isn't overly complicated, you can sort your notes by priority or recently added, and they're also color-coordinated which looks great. Once pinned, your notes will show up in the notification panel until you unpin them.

While Notepin doesn't do anything groundbreaking, it's certainly one of the best apps for Android users who value productivity and organization.

4. MacroDroid



Many of the coolest Android apps eliminate the tedium of common tasks you perform every day by automatically handling them for you.

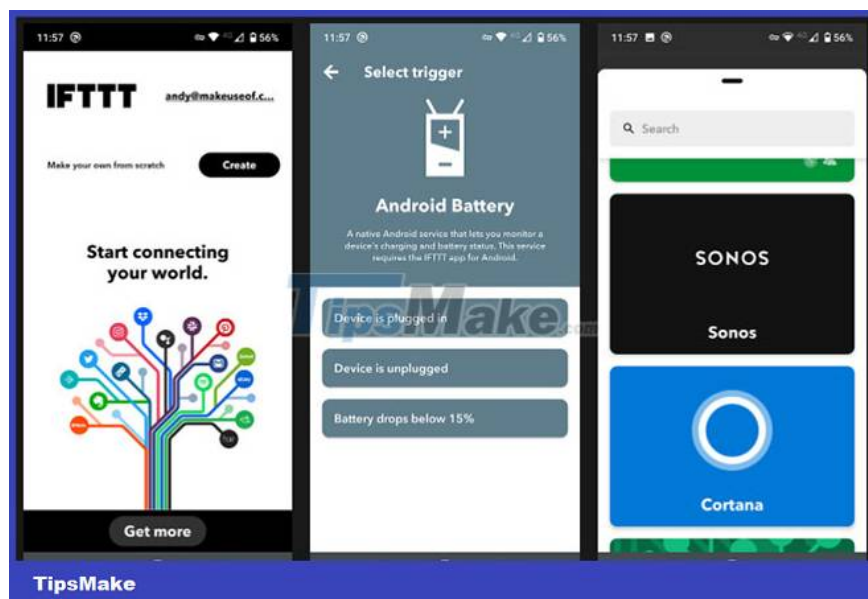
MacroDroid is similar to the popular Android automation app Tasker. But using Tasker effectively for more complex tasks takes time, whereas MacroDroid is an app you can install and start using right away.

The app needs you to configure at least two settings - just one action that will be prompted by the trigger. So, plugging in headphones could be the trigger, and the corresponding actions could be to automatically launch the Spotify app and adjust the volume level.

Or you can let your phone go into airplane mode (action) at night (trigger). You can also ask MacroDroid to read text messages aloud when your phone is docked in your car.

You can add optional constraints to fine-tune the conditions under which the macro can run. This gives the application more power and the macros can be as simple or complex as the user needs.

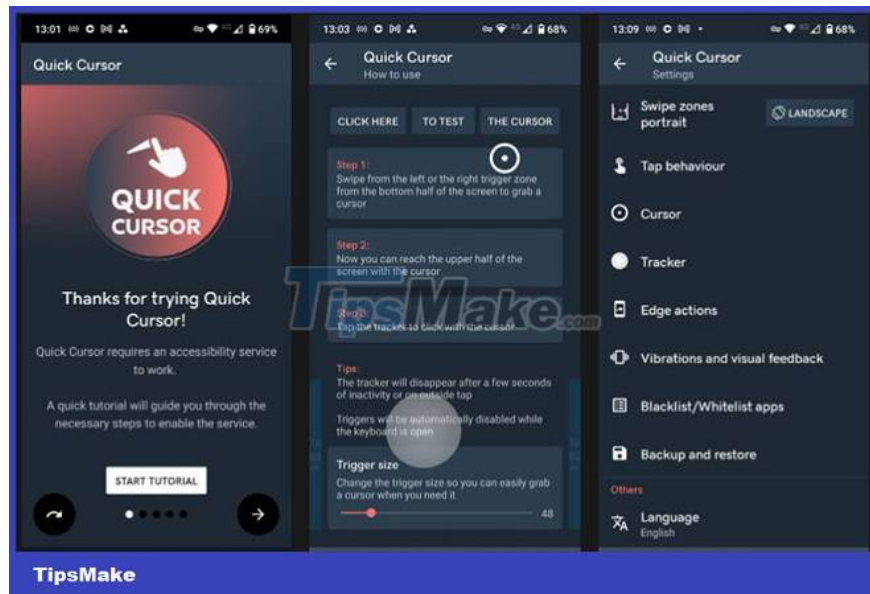
5. IFTTT



While MacroDroid is perfect for on-device automation, IFTTT does the same for web services. The official IFTTT app allows you to create applets that connect two Internet-based services or devices, with your Android phone as the hub.

The possibilities are almost endless. You can use IFTTT to automate your phone in many ways - automatically post tweets, receive SMS notifications for Google Calendar appointments, or receive notifications about discounts on products you want to buy. You can also use it to control your smart devices. IFTTT is definitely one of the coolest apps on the Play Store.

6. Quick Cursor



Having trouble using your phone with one hand? It's no surprise that mobile screens are getting bigger with each new generation of devices. But Quick Cursor is an ingenious solution to this problem.

The application places a pointer on the screen that you control with your thumb and allows you to interact with buttons and other parts of the application user interface. Just swipe your thumb around a third of the screen and the pointer will stretch all the way to the top. Just stack everything with the push of a button, that's it.

Quick Cursor is based on the phone's accessibility features and includes some pretty important permissions, so it may not be suitable for everyone. But it's a really cool app to use with one hand.

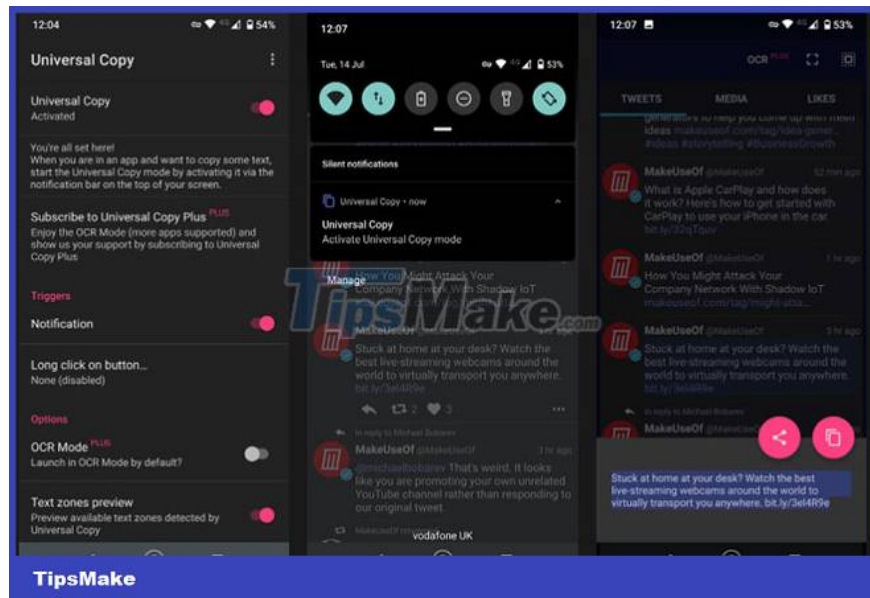
7. MightyText

While WhatsApp Web will let you send WhatsApp messages using your PC, if you like SMS, then SMS Text Messaging from MightyText will become an essential app.

It syncs with your PC, Mac or Linux via a browser extension and gives you full access to your SMS messages on a larger screen. You can read, reply to, or create new messages, and see notifications from all your other apps. You can even make calls, so you won't have to pick up the phone anymore.

There is a monthly sending limit in the free version, so you might want to consider another tool if you're a regular user. For more similar features, check out other apps that let you text from your PC.

8. Universal Copy



Copy and paste on Android is mostly fine until it doesn't. Some apps don't support this and some websites prevent copying, which can be extremely frustrating.

With Universal Copy, you can copy and paste almost anything from any application, and even copy text from images. It integrates completely with the system. All you need to do is give the app the relevant permissions and next time you want to copy the text just launch the app using the link in the notification bar then copy it by tapping and long hold or activate scan mode to find text in an image.

9. Sesame



Sesame is a popular search and shortcut generator. It's so good that it could easily become your most used app.

Sesame is searchable in most other apps, displaying messages from Slack or playlists in Spotify right from your home screen.

It also creates shortcuts for specific features in those programs. Whether you want to load your daily route to work or quickly check live scores in your favorite sports app, you can do it with just one tap.

10. Niagara Launcher

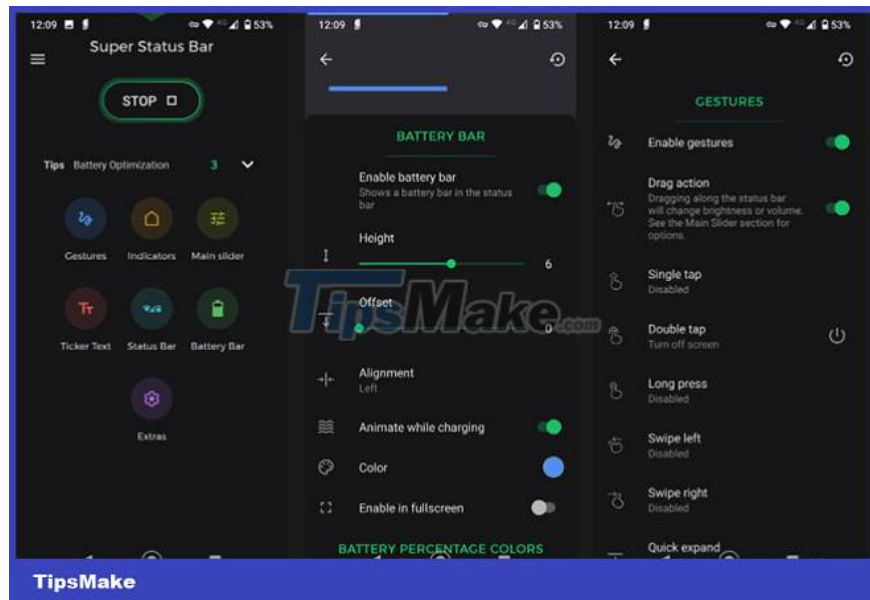


The overall best way to customize an Android phone is to install a new launcher. There are a large number of launchers to choose from, the best of which is Nova Launcher. But Niagara Launcher, which gives your phone a fresh, clean look, is also one of the most unique apps for Android worth considering.

Niagara offers icons, widgets, an app drawer, and all the other stuff that clutters up your phone. In their place, you'll have a few shortcuts to your favorite apps, a vertical app index designed for one-handed use, and several other productive tools. These include the ability to view notifications more easily and hide apps you rarely use.

The app will take some time to get used to, but it's well worth a try.

11. Super Status Bar



Android has always been highly customizable, but one area most people tend to overlook is the status bar. This app has finally changed that.

With the Super Status Bar, you can adjust the screen brightness or volume level by swiping along the top of the screen. You can set up tickers to preview your incoming messages and notifications, configure various other gesture controls, monitor battery life, or change the look of an entire area.

There's a lot going on here and even Super Status Bar includes some more advanced customizations for rooted users that's why Super Status Bar is on the list of great Android apps best.
