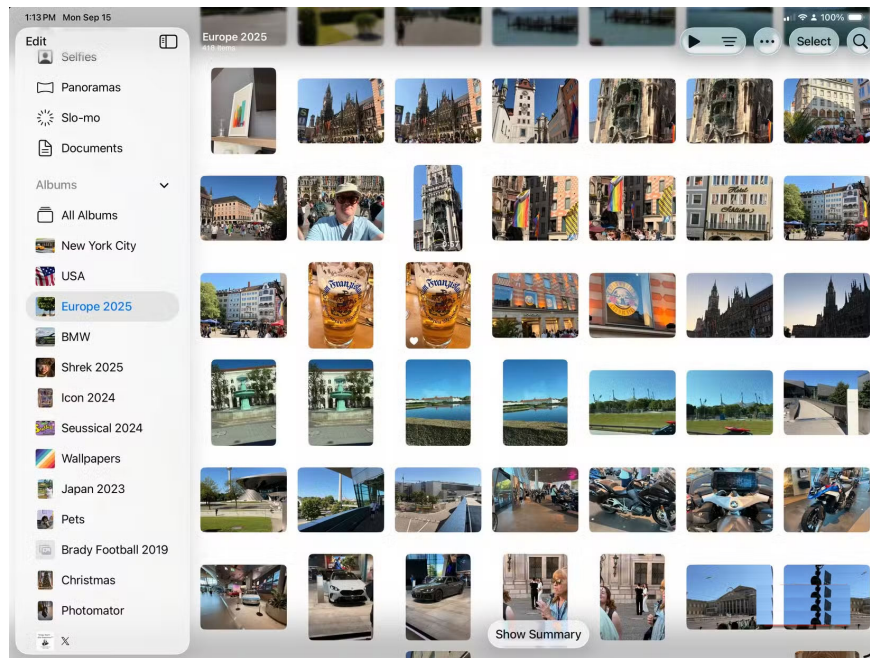
If you've just bought a new iPad, you might be wondering what to do with your old, rusty one.

Turn your old iPad into a great digital photo frame

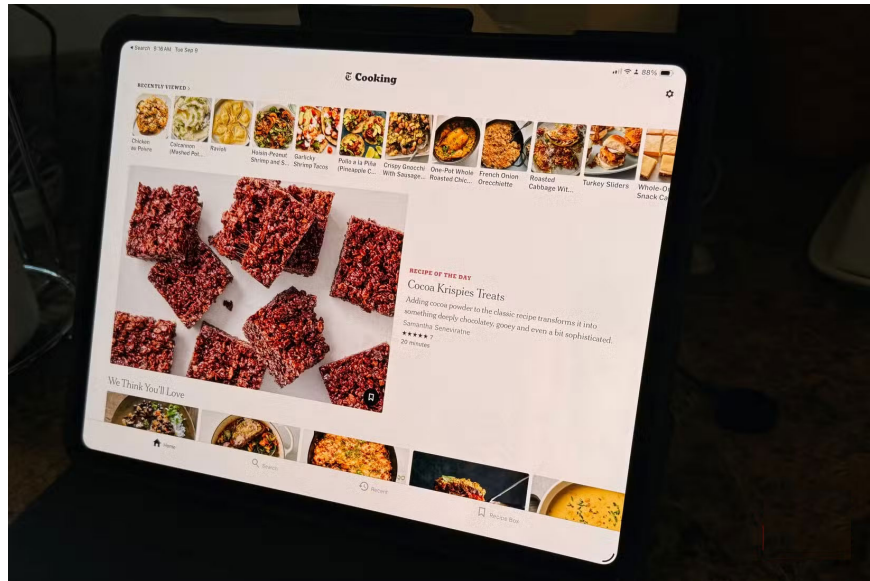
Reflect on your most important memories

Turn your old iPad into a second screen

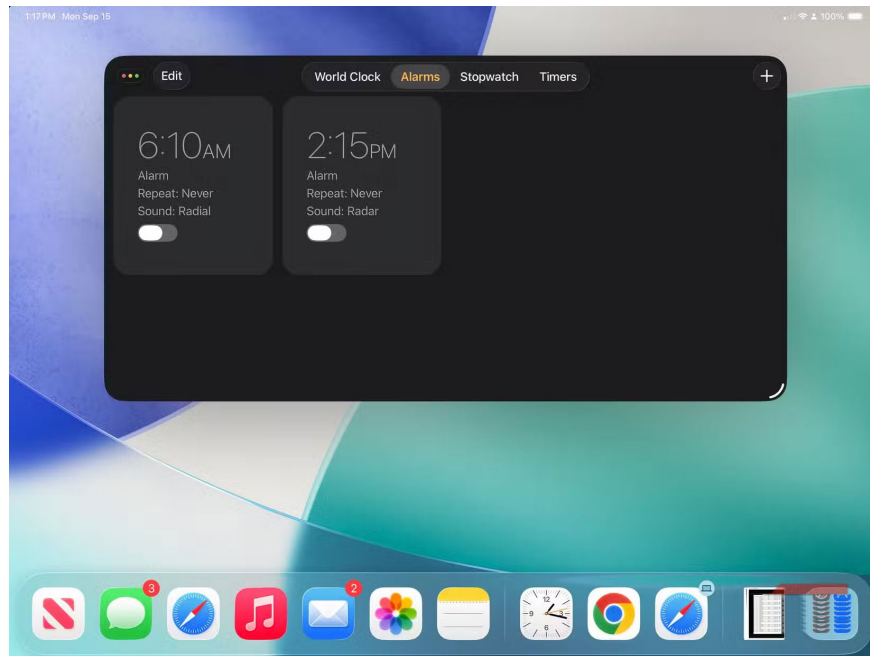
Double the space without extra cost

Use an old iPad as a bedside alarm clock

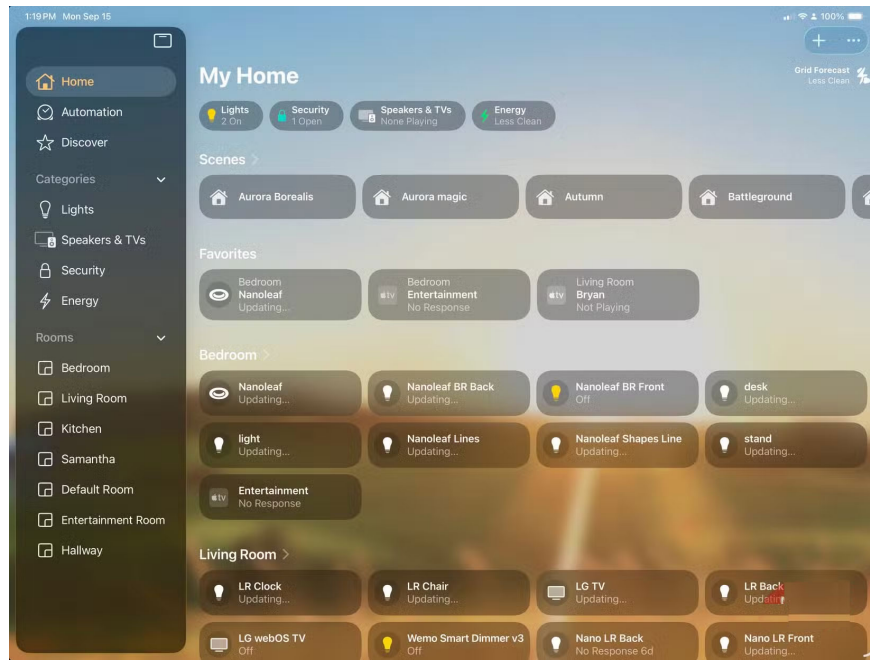
Never miss an alarm again

Your old iPad can become a smart home control panel

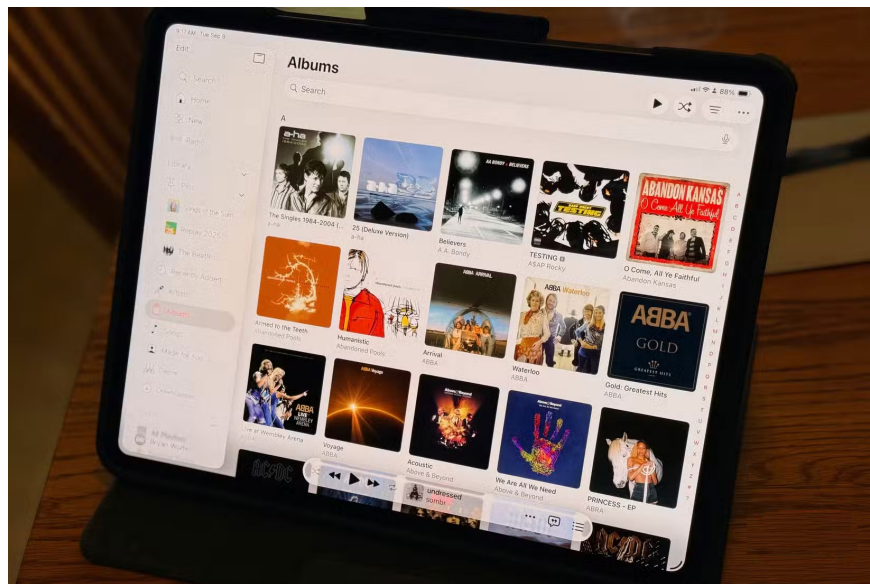
There are a lot of cool things around the house that you can control with your tablet.

This is a cost effective way to add additional control features.

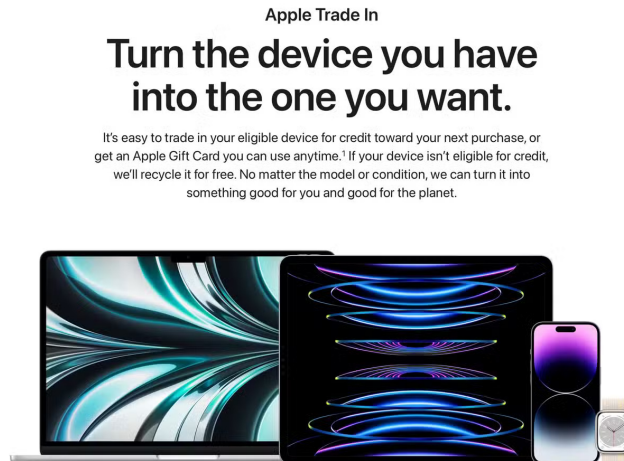

Turn your old iPad into cash

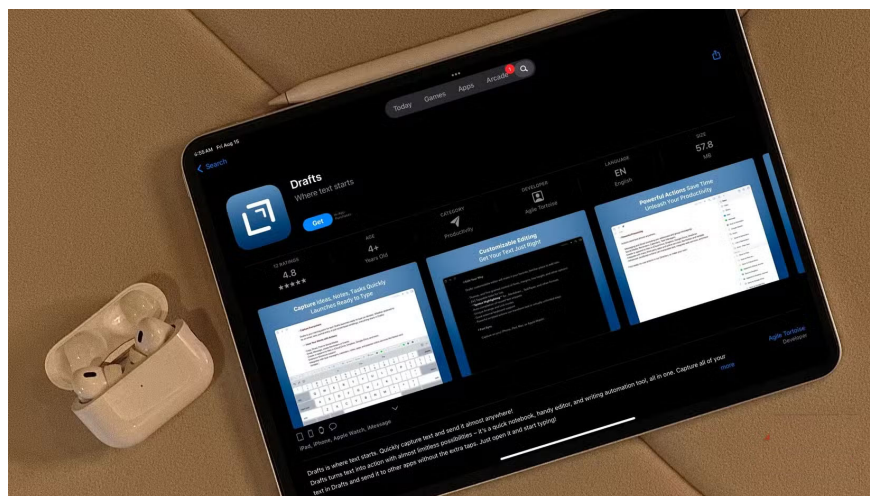
It's always a good time to make extra money.
