many times I copied the whole text from this e-book and programmed it on my website.

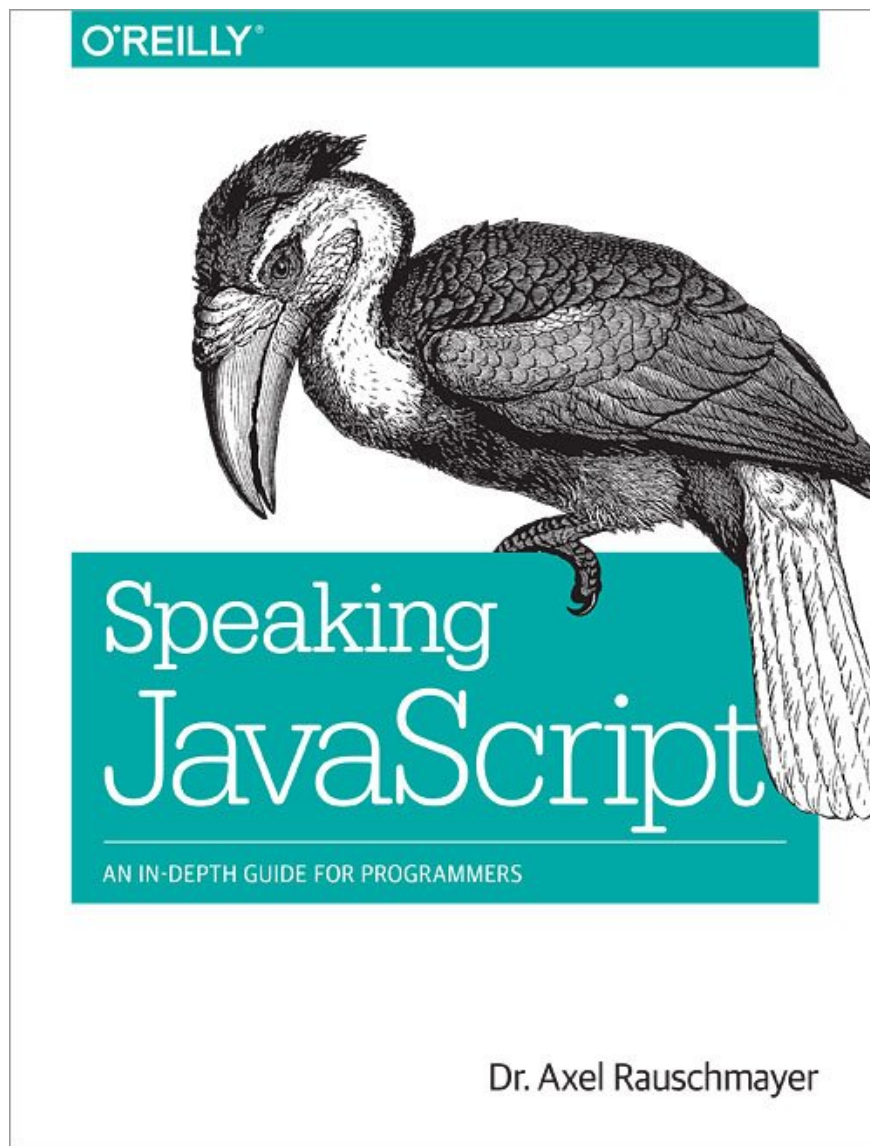
3. The Magic of CSS

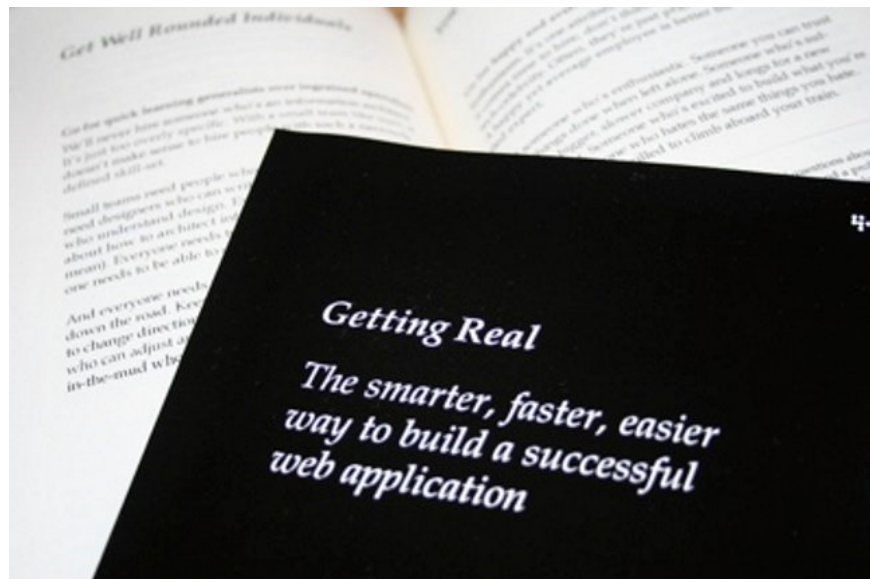

Certainly you will have to work in groups with others *at some time* (*because you don't always design the web yourself*), so this is a very useful guide to help your teamwork get the best results. .

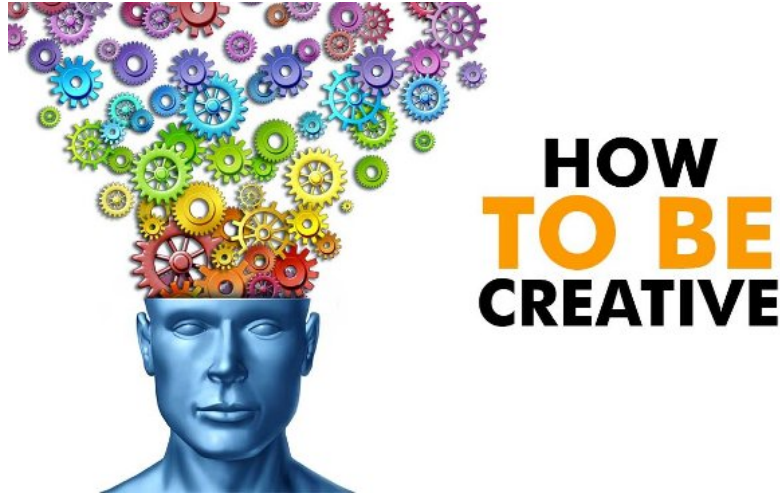
6. Getting Real

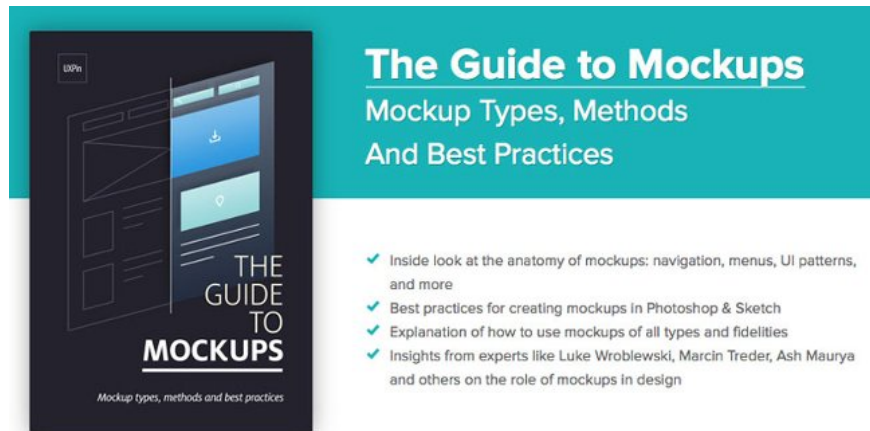
Even if you are trying to make use of your web design skills in a freelancer job, start a project or work with someone, I guarantee you will find a wealth of useful information from the ebook this.

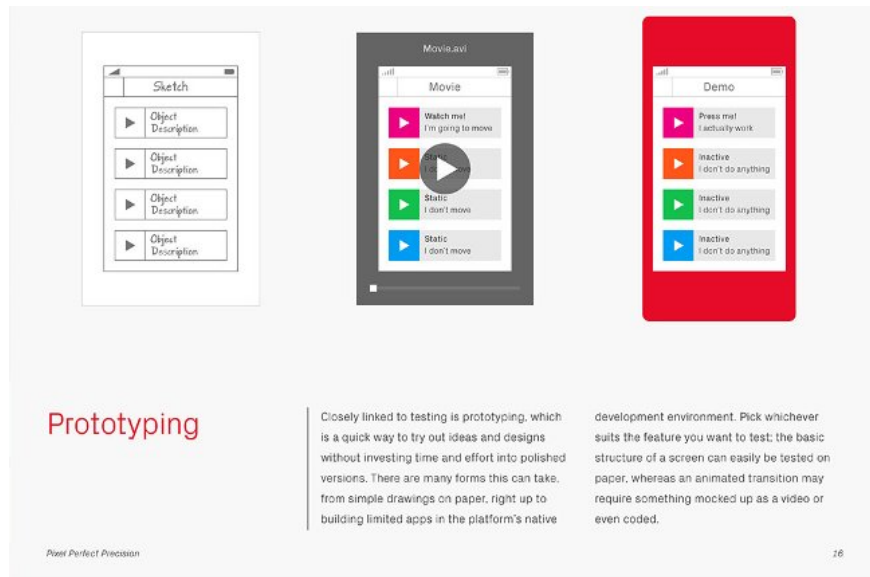
12. 50 Ways to Please Your Customers
