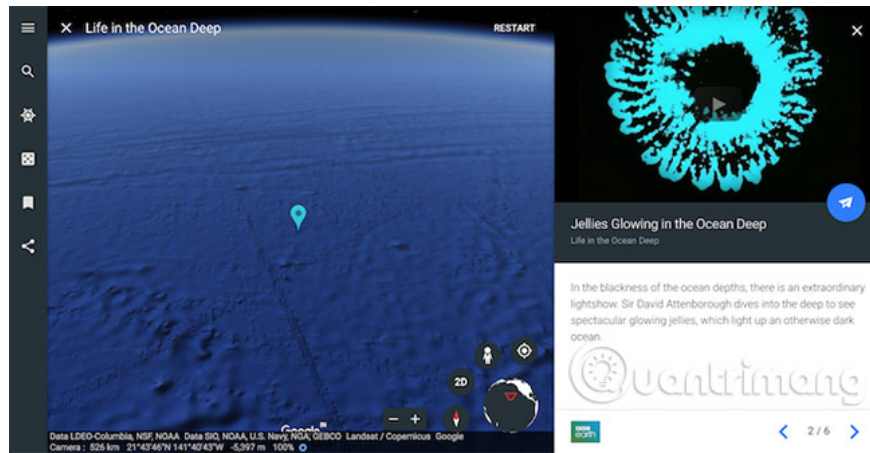

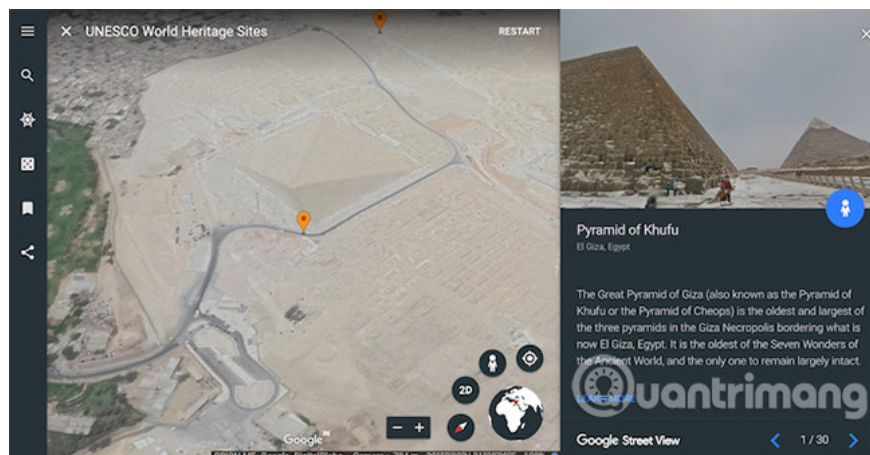

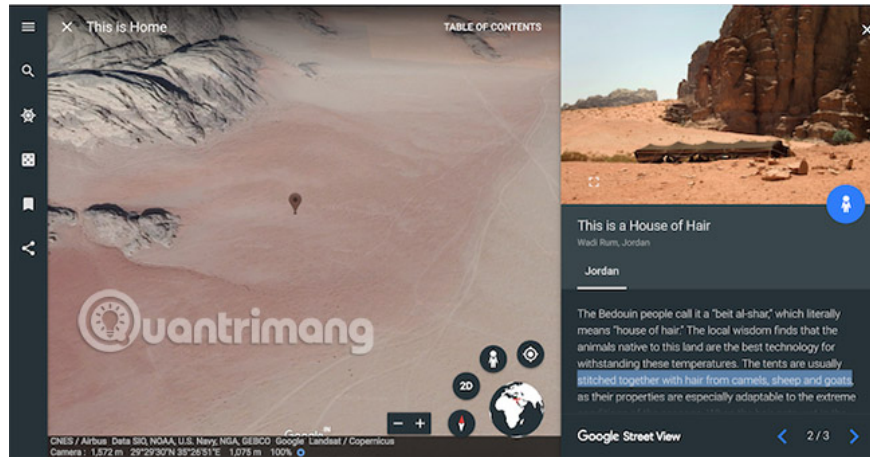
## 2. UNESCO World Heritage Sites (UNESCO World Heritage Sites)

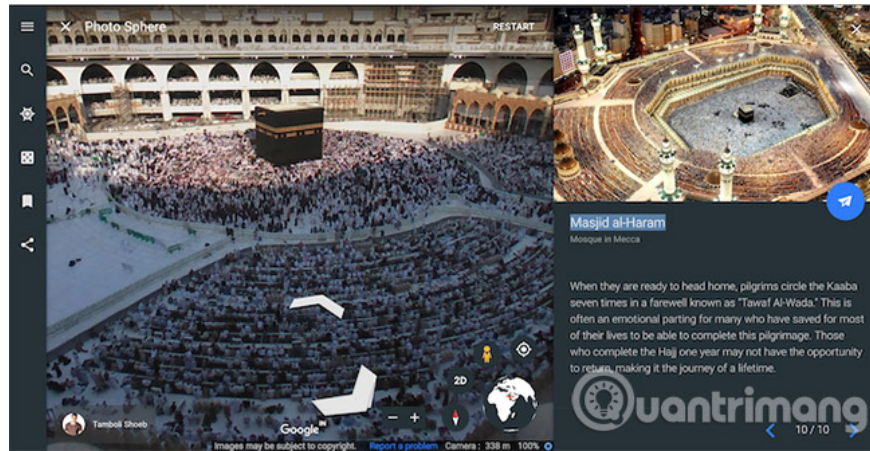
For example, Jordan's House of Hair is a chain of tents located in the middle of the desert, made from camel's hair, sheep and goats.

## 5. Pilgrimage to Mecca (Pilgrimage to Mecca)



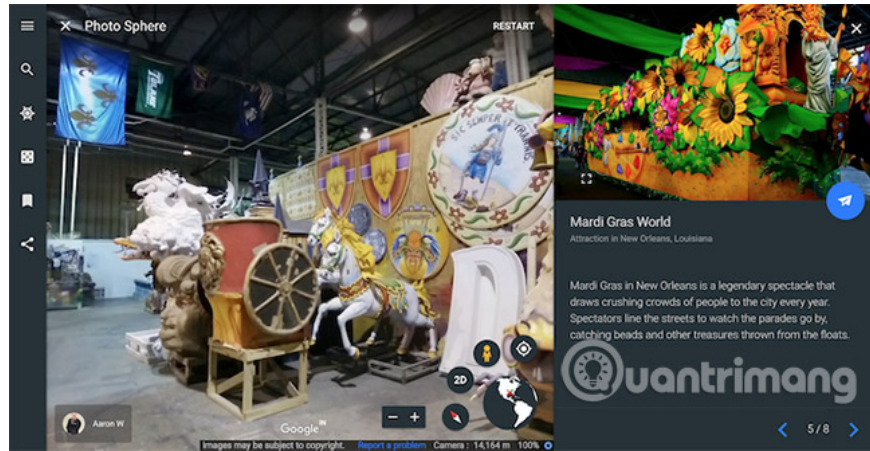

## 6. Global Flea Markets (Visiting flea markets around the world)



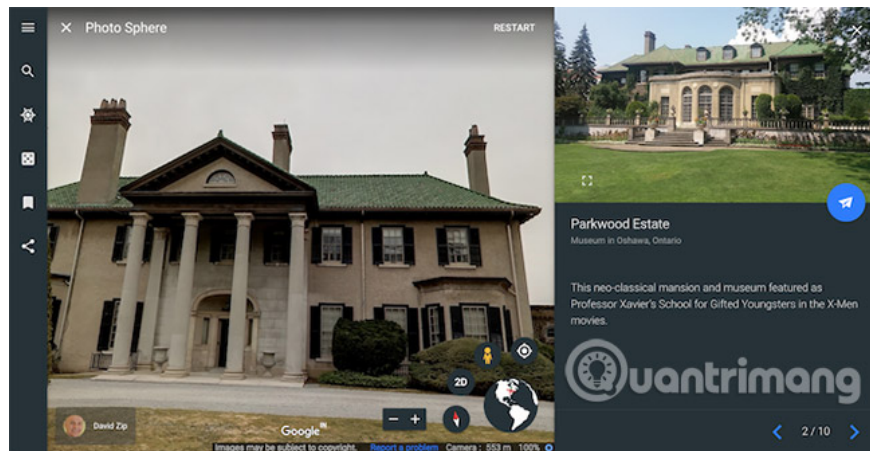

## 7. Colorful Street Fests & Carnivals (Colorful street festivals)



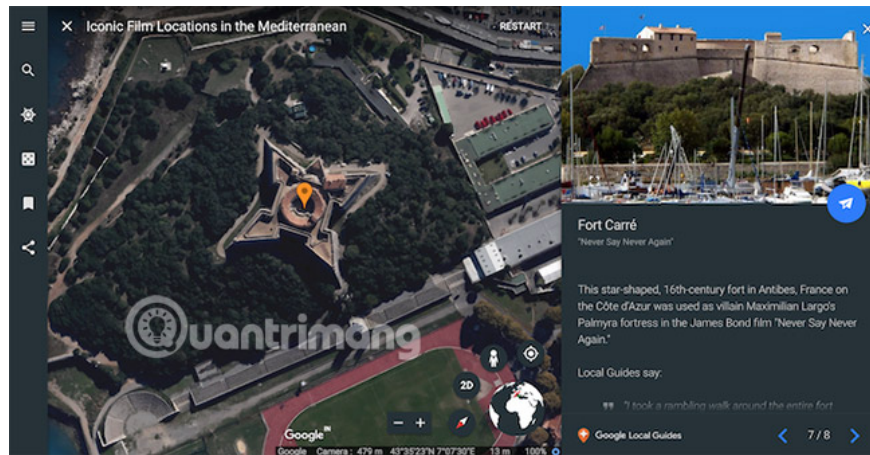

## 8. Comic Geek Destinations (Iconic locations)



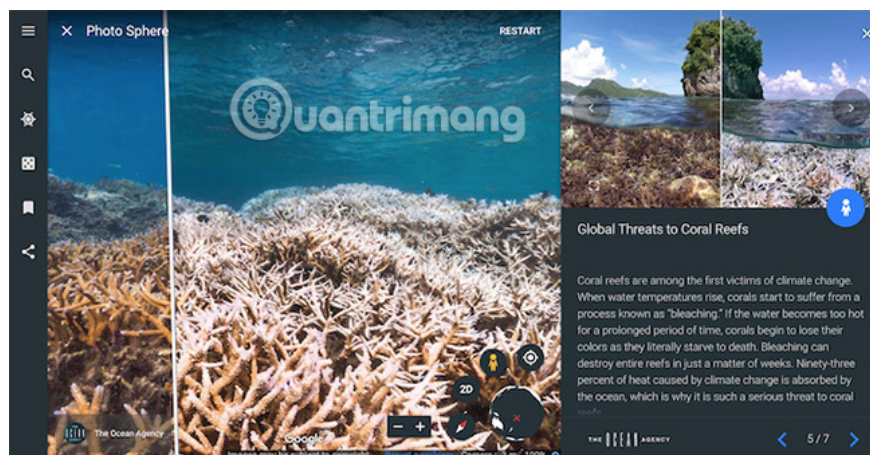

## 9. Iconic Film Locations in the Mediterranean (Famous film studios)



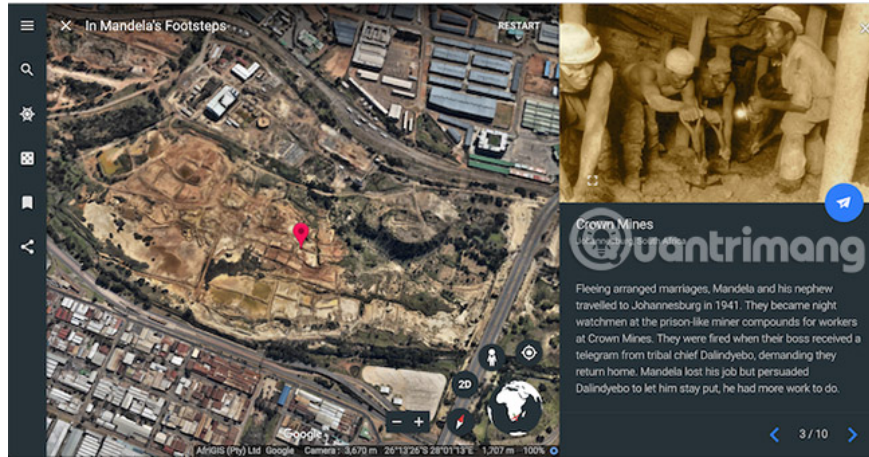

## 10. International Year of the Reef (Visiting coral reefs)



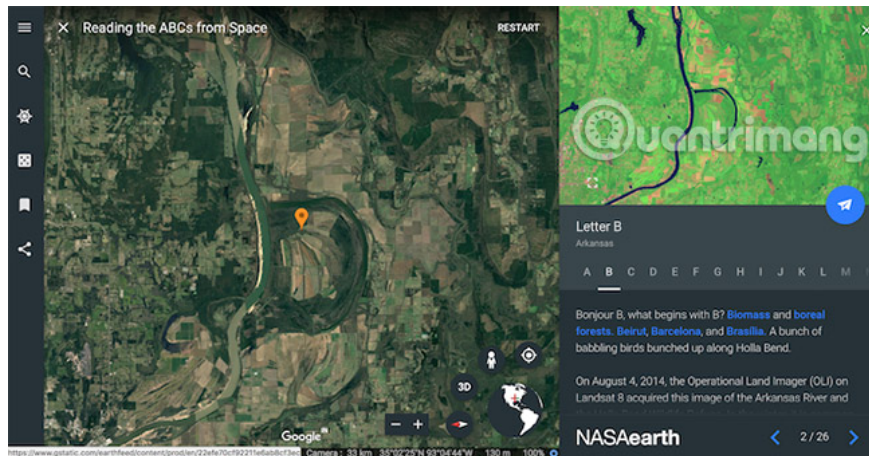

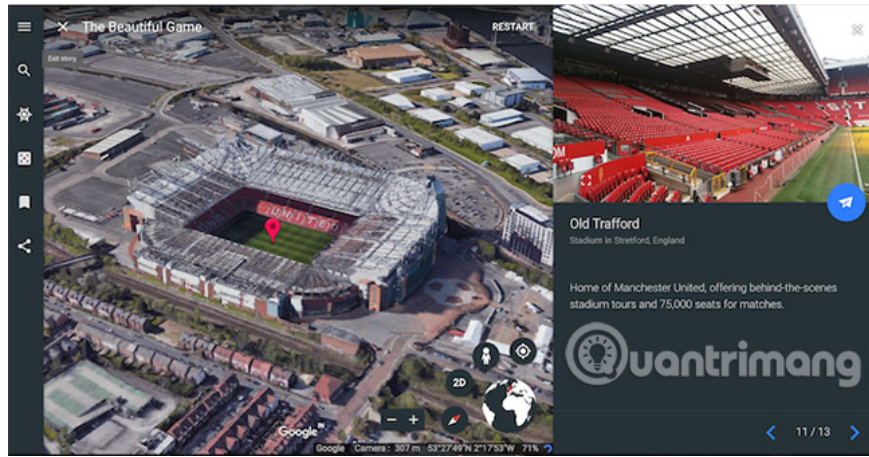
## 12. Reading the ABCs From Space (Places are like letters)
