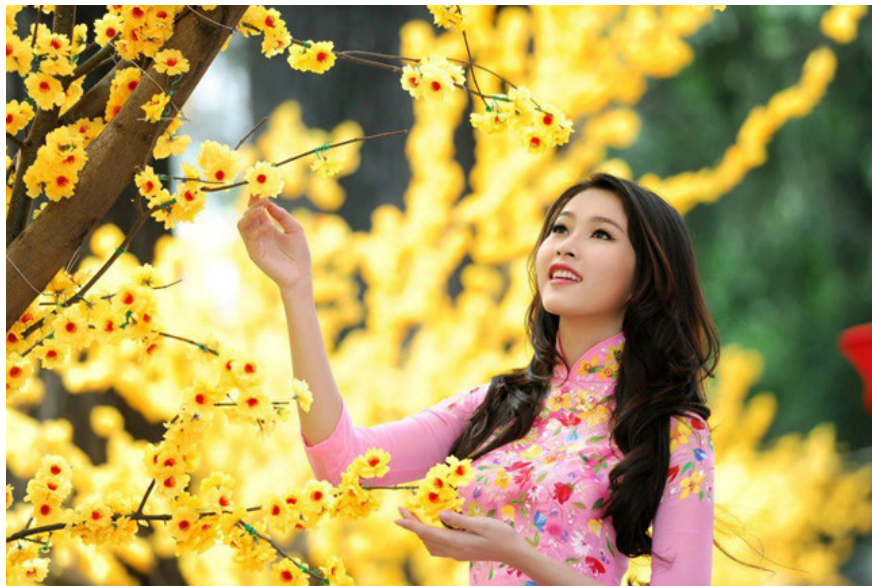
1. Worship of the Year-end Ceremony on the 30th New Year

New Year's Eve offering ceremony is done outside.

9. Screaming



Bai Loc early spring is the traditional beauty of the Vietnamese New Year. Scallop is often done on New Year's Eve or early morning on the first day of the Lunar New Year to pray for good luck, and take the procession into

the house.

10. Landslides

After the eve of the new year, entering the new year, who is the first person to enter the house with the new year greetings, it is the person who broke ground.

According to the concept of the Vietnamese people, the people who rushed the land in the beginning of the year are very important so families often choose people who are old, gentle, happy families, prosperous business, happy personality to storm their land. .

Vietnamese people have the custom of going to wish Tet and relatives on Tet holidays. Usually in the morning of a New Year, the children and grandchildren will come to bless them and celebrate their grandparents and parents. After that, the children and grandchildren were happy with their grandparents, parents and grandchildren in the new coins in the red envelopes to get lucky along with the wishes of their children and grandchildren, good education and happiness Happy in the new year.
