Desks with shelves underneath may seem convenient, but they restrict leg movement.

Consider desk options with adjustable height, ample surface area, and legroom, which also help create an ergonomic desk setup to avoid straining your body when using your PC.

Next, let's talk about keyboards. Everyone has their own personal preferences, so there's no one-size-fits-all solution when it comes to choosing a mechanical keyboard. But make sure you get wrist support if you buy a mechanical keyboard, as its extra height can often strain your wrists.

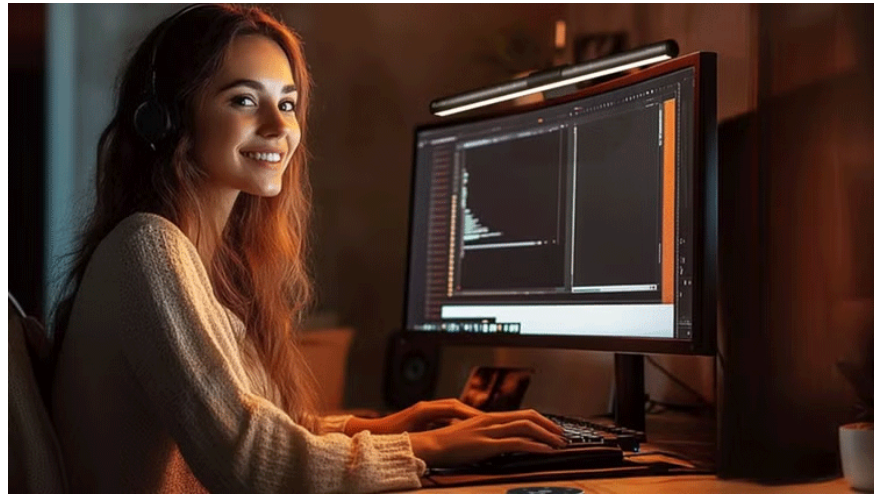
#### **4. Always prioritize comfort**
