Changed characters, locations and music, plus a few new mechanics make this game feel more like an expansion than a true sequel. However, if you like Adventure, you will also love Odyssey.

3. Monument Valley

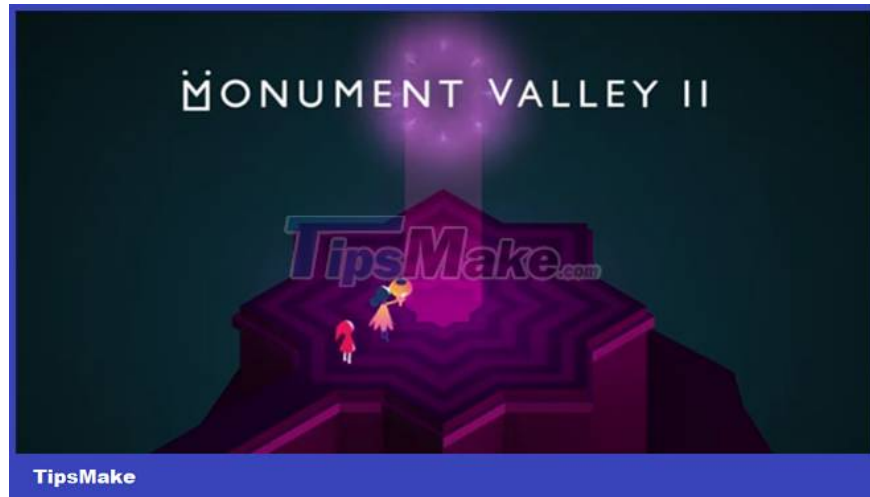


Have you ever seen one of MC Escher's surreal paintings and wanted to explore them? That's what Monument Valley is all about.

You play as Ro, a little girl who wanders through colorful buildings and solves complex puzzles. Your primary tool is the ability to change the perspective of the screen, which opens up new paths.

Beautiful visuals and a mysterious setting make this game one of the most thrilling and engaging experiences you can have on your phone. Even better, you can play the game completely offline, without using the Internet.

4. Monument Valley 2



In this sequel to Monument Valley, you play as Ro's daughter, navigating through everything in an attempt to find her. The concept is essentially the same, but the visuals are much more striking, the puzzle solving much more subtle and nuanced. The beauty of the graphics really shines on a larger screen, making these two games the best offline iPad games.

5. BADLAND



BADLAND is a challenging puzzle game that takes the character through a world full of dangerous traps and hazards.

Use touch controls to keep the ball in the air, while watching out for spinning blades, spikes, and many other dangerous objects that can pop it. Many things can help the ball get bigger, smaller, multiply and more.

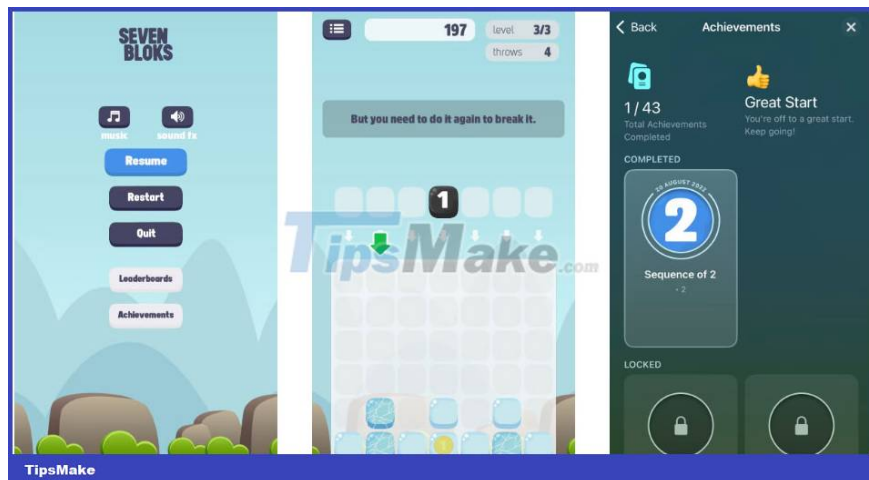

6. BADLAND 2



BADLAND 2 adds some new mechanics, especially for moving the character left and right, which should relieve some of the pressure. However, the essence of the game remains the same. There's an online multiplayer mode, but like its predecessor, this game really shines when played offline, such as on an iPhone, alone with a headset and immersed in the experience.

7. SevenBlocs

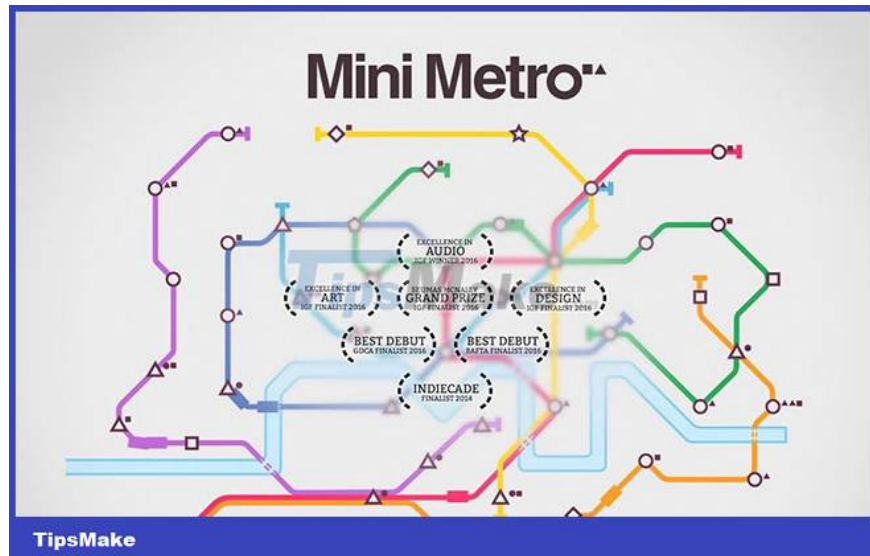


This innovative puzzle game is like a combination of Tetris and Sudoku. The rules are very simple. You have a 7x6 grid, filled with blocks with numbers on them, from 1 to 7. Whenever a numbered block is in a column or a row with the same value, it is removed. If cleared next to a white block, the white block will crack, revealing a numbered block.

The goal, like Tetris, is to keep the blocks from rising upwards and score points while doing so. The game is simple, but very attractive with endless challenges. You can experience everything except the leaderboards offline, making SevenBlocs a great game to play while waiting for an appointment or taking the train through an area without WiFi.

8. Mini Metro

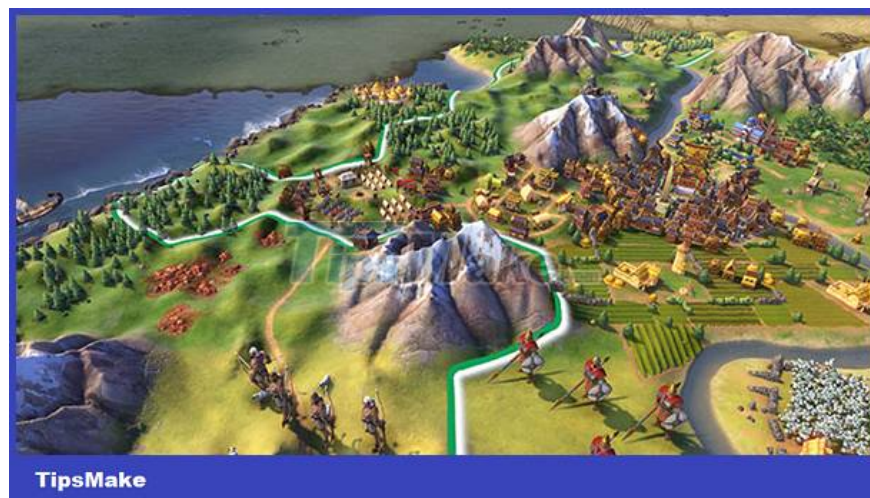


Another puzzle game with a nice interface, Mini Metro, allows you to build your own mass transit system. Using maps of real-world cities, you can draw your own routes to connect different stations.

You have a limited number of lines and trains, as well as an ever-increasing number of stations, so you have to place everything wisely. If people wait too long at any one station, you lose.

The maps, as well as the layout in the game, are simple and beautiful, with an aesthetic similar to the minimalist maps found in many major cities.

9. Civilization VI



Civilization VI, the latest installment of this epic strategy game, is finally available on iOS. In Civilization VI you, as the leader, strive to dominate the world throughout history.

Using real-world leaders, place names, and historical sites, Civil is a turn-based game that's easy to play in no time. This makes it the perfect option for iOS.

While you can engage in online and local multiplayer, an offline AI campaign is an incredibly fun option on a subway ride or long flight.

If Civilization VI doesn't appeal, there are other ways to play Civilization on your phone.

You can sign up for a New York Times Digital Subscription or just subscribe to a crossword puzzle. Without registration you will only have access to the Daily Mini crossword. This may not be a problem, but there's nothing quite like a full puzzle.

Although Internet access is required to download new crosswords, an unlimited number of crosswords can be stored offline for later play.

15. Jetpack Joyride

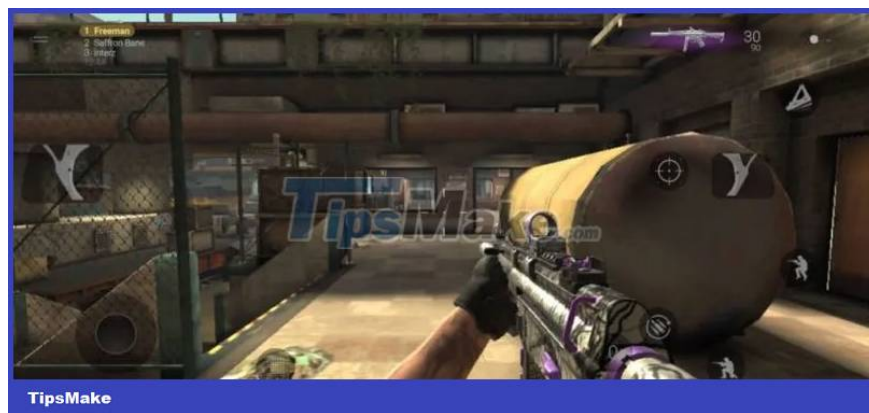
A fast-paced game that you can play anytime, anywhere, Jetpack Joyride has fun mechanics, a cool and engaging art style, perfect for fans of runner games.
