A brilliant Resplendent Quetzal bird is carrying food for his two children in the Costa Rican cloud forest. For the birds to feed their children without being startled, the photographer Tyohar Kastiel wears the same shirt every day, waiting for the same place in the forest before dawn.



The Laura Albiac Vilas family was lucky enough to capture the Iberian wildcat right near the path in the Sierra de Andújar nature park. This is an endangered breed, only two small populations exist in Southern Spain.



The mating moment of a pair of sea snails (also known as the "sea angel") under the sea of Okhotsk in the Russian Far East was recorded by photographer Andrey Narchuk.



The sunrise scene was taken from inside a giant saguaro cactus that could have been 200 years old by photographer Jack Dykinga in the Sonoran Desert National Reserve.



Photographer Justin Hofman captures an image of a seahorse riding on a plastic swab in the reef area near Sumbawa Island, Indonesia. Sea water here is in serious pollution. When the tide rises, the garbage floats to cover the water surface.



Photographer Erlend Haarberg recorded scenes of mountain rabbits fighting each other during mating in the maple forest in Valdalen, Norway. In order to keep track of these wars, he had to stay in the forest for many freezing nights.



During the drought in Kruger National Park, South Africa, Impala monkeys came near the lake to drink water and were attacked by a Nile crocodile. Photographer John Mullineux has captured the moment of alligator attack and the spectacular jump of the antelope.



The fierce gaze of a 6-month-old tiger is disabled and must live in a zoo. The tiger was discovered in tropical rainforest in the province of Aceh on Sumatra island, Indonesia, in a state where its hind legs were trapped and must be removed.
