# Jon Krakauer

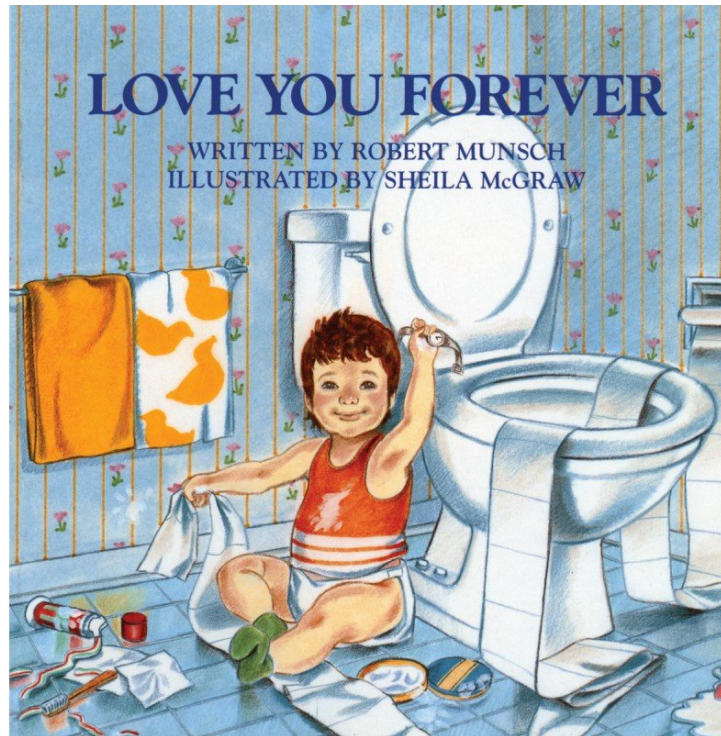

Writing "Into Thin Air", Krakauer wants to be able to relieve the guilt and let the questions around the event sleep. Providing a complete picture of the person and event he witnessed as well as thanks to (due credit) the dedicated Sherpas who help tirelessly made him very painful. He also avoided mentioning people like Sandy Pittman - a wealthy man who brought a coffee maker on an expedition. Krakauer's personal queries about this disaster provide very deep analysis of what happened. But Krakauer alone, further interviews and investigations only made him decide that his own misjudgment was directly responsible for the deaths of his climbers.

Obviously, Krakauer is still obsessed with disaster and although there are many instances where he has acted for others, even heroically, he still seems unable to consider these cases. objective way. After all, despite the broad and objective reviews of the actions of others, he still gave me criticism.
