Legendary investor, billionaire **Warren Buffett** turned 87 on August 30 last. With a net worth of \$ 77 billion, ' *The Prophet of Omaha* ' is now the 4th richest person in the world - although rich but Warren Buffett is not like a *giant* .

Warren Buffett's humble home in Nebraska costs only 0.001% of his total assets and he never spends more than \$ 3.17 on a daily breakfast at McDonald's.

For those who knew him from the beginning, the success of Warren Buffett was not surprising: **He started picking stocks at age 11 and earned the equivalent of \$ 53,000 today when he was 16 years old** .

Warren Buffett is not only good at making money but he is also a " *give away* " a lot. Warren Buffett is now considered one of the **most charitable philanthropists** in the world, has donated over \$ 27 billion to charity funds over the past 10 years.

While elementary school friends were dreaming about big tournaments and Hollywood, 10-year-old Buffett had lunch with a member of the New York Stock Exchange and set goals for his life.

Warren Buffett's legendary career began at the age of 10 when he and his father went to New York City to have dinner with a member of the New York Stock Exchange - NYSE, the idea of ??a life goal already shown in Buffett's head.

He bought the first stock at 11 years old.

At the age of 11, Warren Buffett knew how to buy money, mostly from a company called **Cities Service Preferred** , for \$ 38 per share.

As a boy, Buffett earned about \$ 175 a month - more than his teacher (*and most mature Americans*) by reporting to the Washington Post.

Warren Buffett has accumulated an equivalent of \$ 53,000 when he was only 16 years old with all sorts of things : selling golf balls, old stamps, polishing cars, trading pinball machines and turning a racetrack into a toll playground.

He was rejected when applying to Harvard University (and eventually chose Columbia University).

Warren Buffett, confidently participated in the admission interview and told a friend of his: " *Join Harvard University with me* ".

" *I look like I'm about 16 years old, but the feeling was only about 9 years old,* " Buffett recalled from the live interview. After being rejected, Warren Buffett was forced to look elsewhere and study at Columbia University, which only required an application and no interviews.

Buffett's idol is the famous investor Benjamin Graham refused to hire him for the first time because he was not a Jew (*but he persisted until Graham agreed to receive it*).

Buffett originally wanted to work with his idol, the author of " *The Intelligent Investor*" , Benjamin Graham, but Graham refused him because he was not a Jew (*Graham wanted to take that position to a Do Thai, because at that time the Jews had difficulty finding jobs at Wall Street*).

However, Buffett is not discouraged. He remained persistent in contact until Graham accepted him.

Buffett used to spend \$ 100 to attend a public speaking course at 21 years old . This course gave him the courage to propose to his wife.

The home of Warren Buffett is a modest 5-bedroom apartment located in Omaha, Nebraska, purchased in 1956 for \$ 31,500.

99% of Buffett's assets are earned after their 50th birthday.

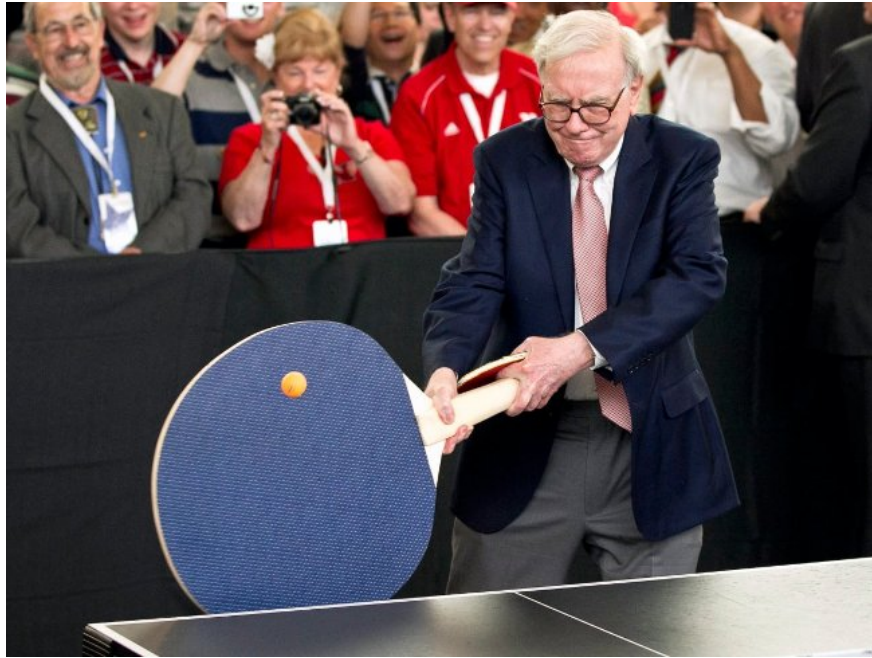

Warren Buffett invested \$ 1,000 in Berkshire Hathaway fund stock in 1964, taking over the company and shares for only \$ 19, worth about \$ 13 million today.

Uruguay's GDP in 2014 was estimated at US \$ 57,471,277,325.

Although living very economically, Warren Buffett often gives away generously. In 2010, he teamed up with Bill and Melinda Gates to form **The Giving Pledge** , an initiative that requires the richest people in the world to spend most of their assets on charity.



As of June 2016, more than 154 wealthy individuals have signed commitments, including Michael Bloomberg, Mark Zuckerberg and Larry Ellison.

The money Warren Buffett gave away during his life was enough to build six Apple Spaceship headquarters (each worth \$ 5 billion).

Apple Campus , one of Steve Jobs' last major projects, is the company's future campus, with curved panel glass, underground parking, private meeting rooms for important speeches and gender. Product introduction, 360

degrees can all see nature.

Buffett has donated nearly \$ 30 billion - the second highest amount (*according to Bill Gates' plan*).

In 2013, Warren Buffett earned an average of \$ 37 million per day - more than what actress Jennifer Lawrence did in a year.

According to Forbes, Jennifer Lawrence is the second highest paid actress in the world in 2013 and is estimated to earn \$ 34 million that year.

However, billionaire Warren Buffett has earned \$ 37 million a day in 2013.

In July 2016, Buffett broke his record by donating \$ 2.9 billion to various charities , including the Bill & Melinda Gates **Foundation** and the Susan Thompson Buffett **Foundation** , named after his late wife. he.

Warren Buffett does not think that money is equivalent to success : " *I measure success by the number of people who love me. And the best way to be loved is to be lovely .*"
