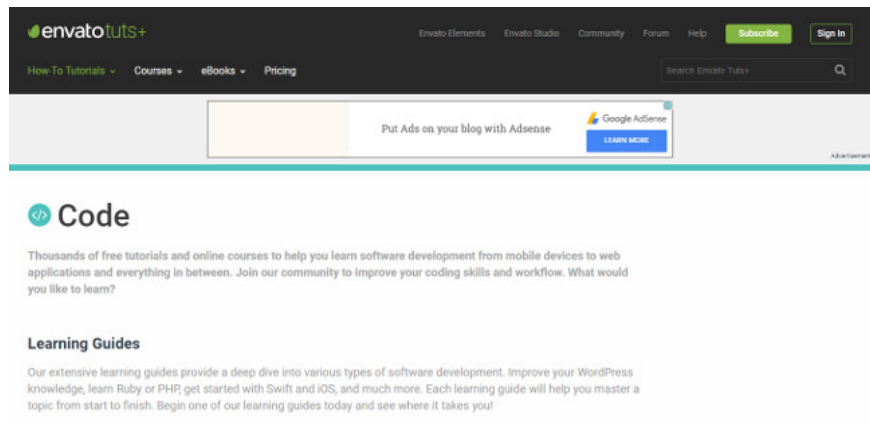

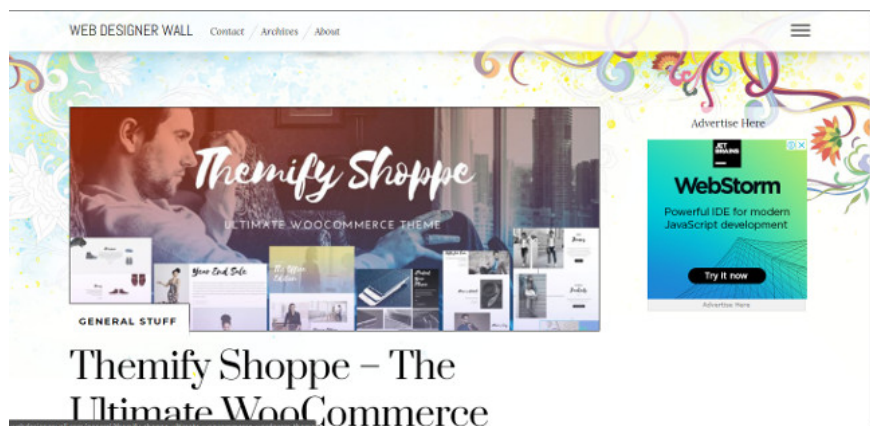
2. Woork (<http://woork.blogspot.com>)

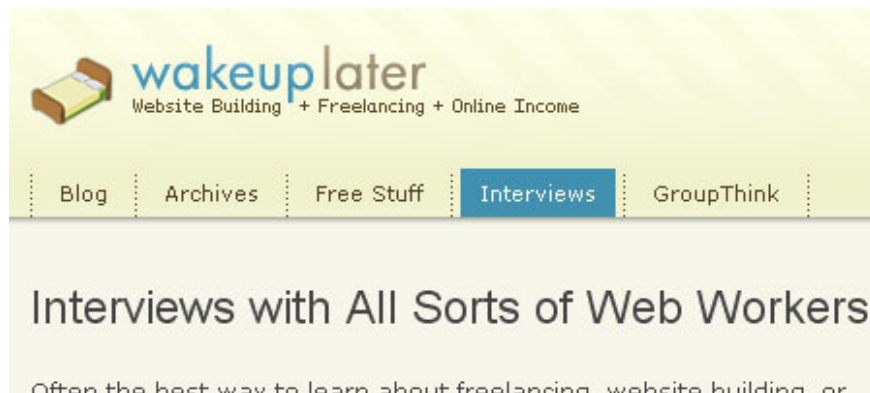
5. Vitamins

7. Snook.ca (<https://snook.ca>)

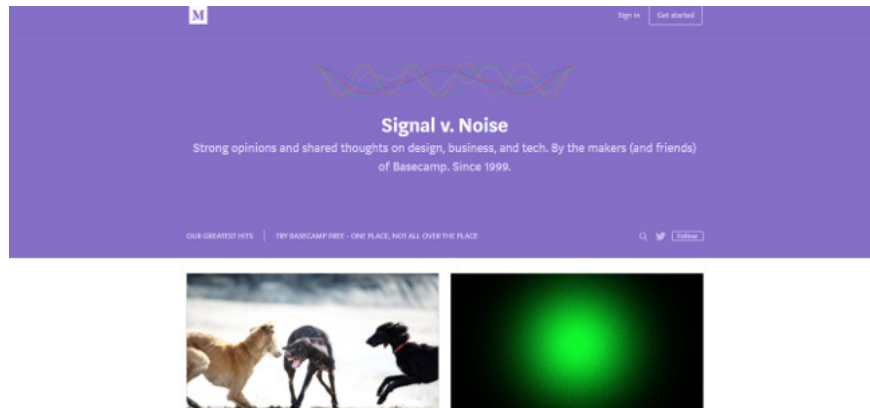

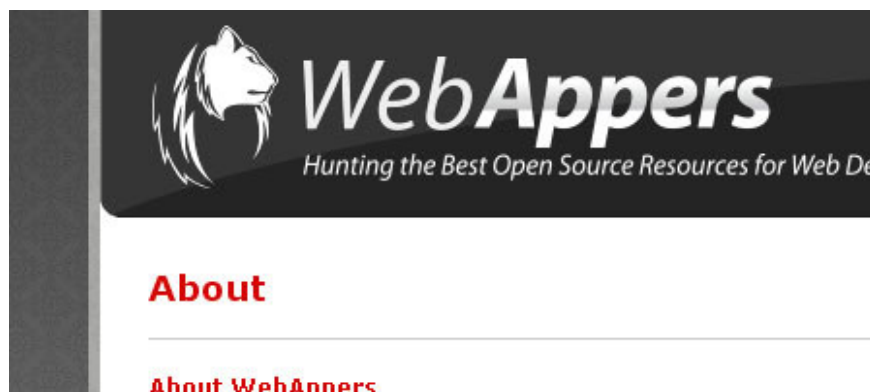
8. Signal vs. Noise (<https://m.signalvnoise.com>)

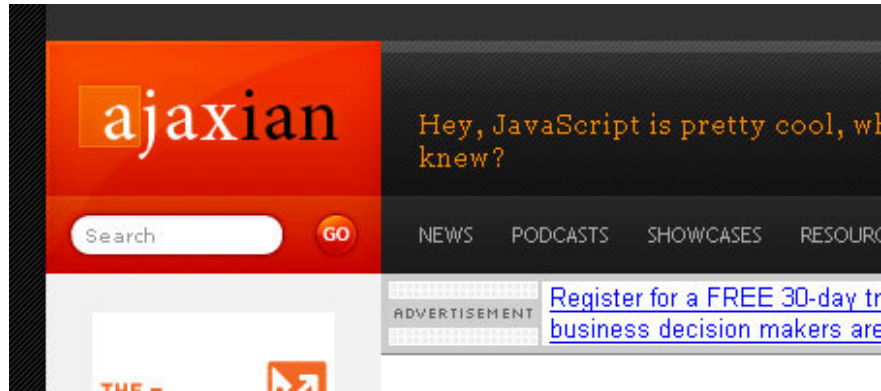

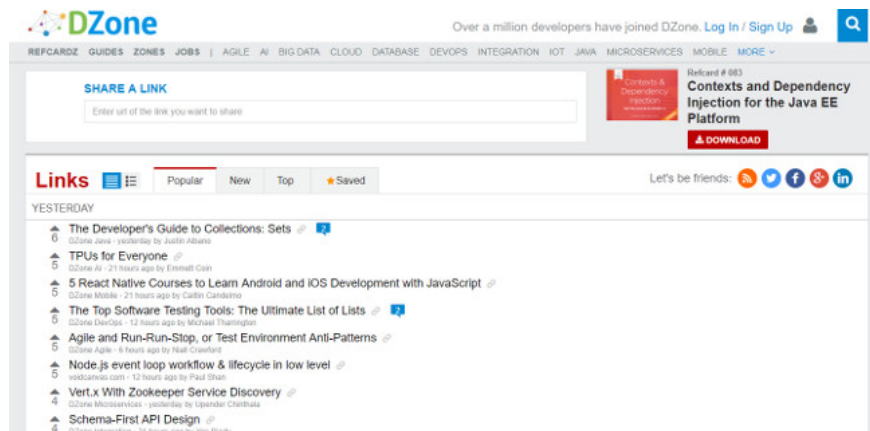
10. Ajaxian (<http://ajaxian.com>)

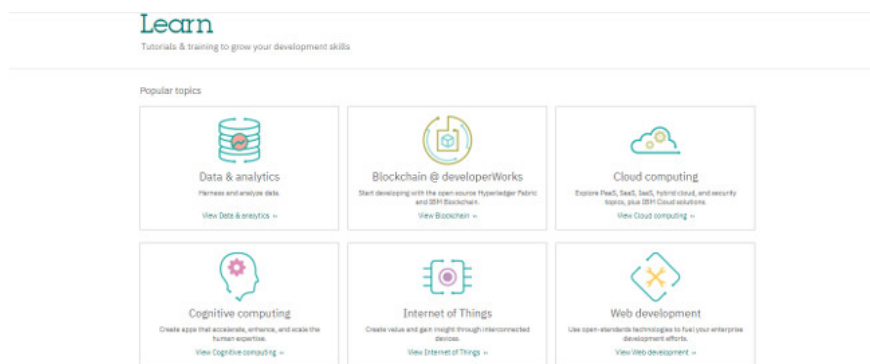

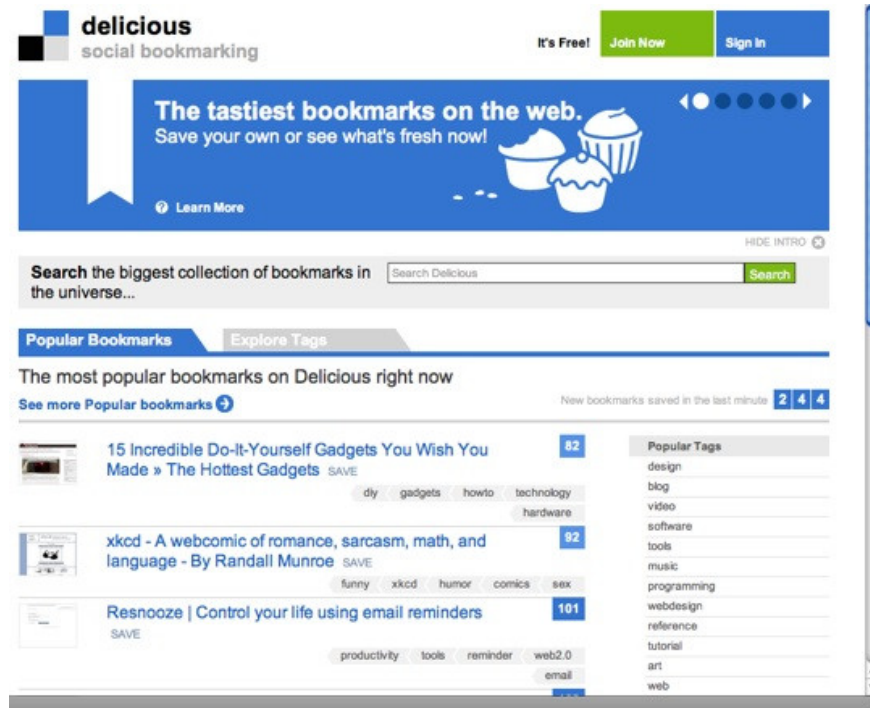

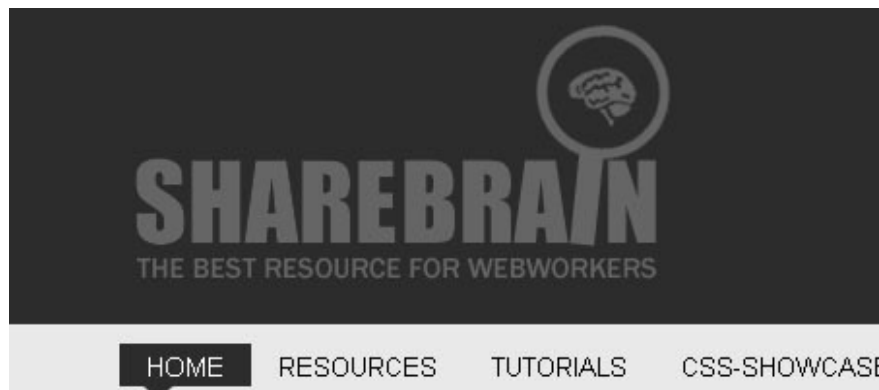

14. Del.icio.us (<https://del.icio.us>)



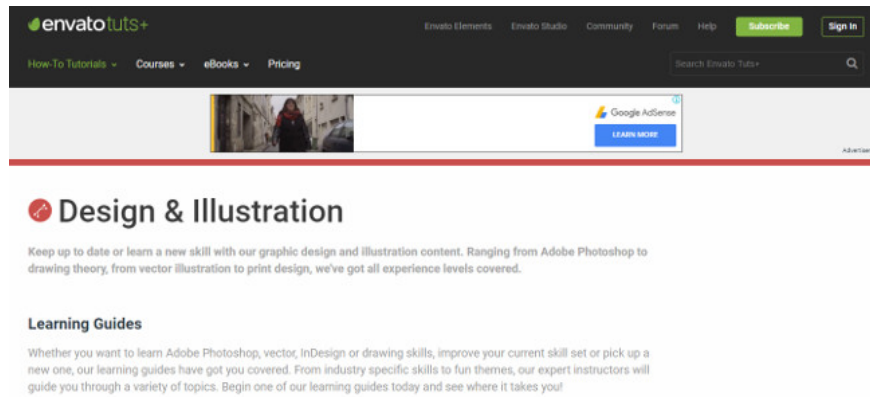
Del.icio.us is a website used to save articles where members can store and share articles that interest them. This website is not just for web developers, you can follow related topics like webdev, development or Javascript.

Donald Trump is basically a comment section running for president

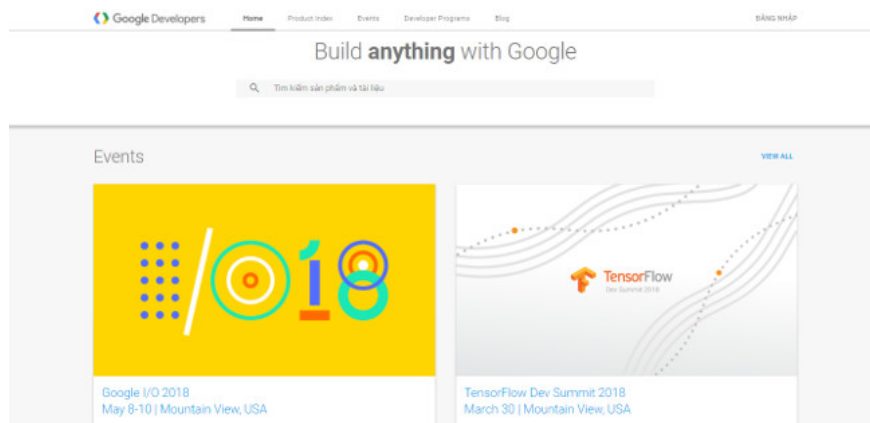
