

3 simple ways to clean your washing machine effectively

Regular cleaning of the washing machine not only enhances the life of the machine, but also ensures that the amount of clothes is always washed, avoiding unpleasant odors on the clothes.

Regular cleaning of household devices is essential, especially devices such as washing machines. This not only helps the washing machine to be durable, it can be used longer but especially does not leave unpleasant odors inside the machine, or cling to clothes when we use it.

However, cleaning the washing machine also depends on the type of front-loading washing machine, or the back door that your family is using. If you apply the correct cleaning method to each type of washing machine, you will avoid the failure that occurs. In this article, we will give you some tips on cleaning up your household washing machine.

1. Clean the front door washer:

Most new front-loading washing machines today have a self-cleaning washing machine program. However, if your device does not have it, choose a laundry program that heats the water to clean the washing machine. Next, add a small amount of bleach to remove stains faster and remember not to put clothes in until the washing machine has completed the washing process.



You should note using a sponge or paper towel to clean underneath and around the rubber padded edges on the washer door lid because this area is a place to easily produce mold due to dampness.

Don't forget to clean both the tray containing detergent and the liquid with a sponge that contains detergent or vinegar. Make sure they are free from dirt or hair.



2. Cleaning the upper washing machine:

First, turn on the washing machine's hot cycle and disconnect it after the water is filled. If your washing machine doesn't have water, boil water outside and pour it directly into the machine. You only need a kettle of 3 to 5 liters.

Add a little chlorine bleach and turn on the washing cycle so that bleach is mixed into the water. Then turn off the machine and leave the mixture inside the machine for several hours to remove dirt, mold and other harmful substances inside the washing machine. If you don't want to use chlorine bleach, you can replace them with vinegar.



After the waiting period, let the machine complete its washing cycle. If the machine smells of bleach after completing the washing cycle, pour it into a vinegar water heater, leave it for an hour and run the washing cycle

again, the washing machine will no longer smell the bleach.

Next clean the washing water tray, fabric softener. You should use vinegar to clean this area. Make sure the tray contains no dirt, hair or other harmful substances. This process is an important part of keeping the washing machine inside clean.



3. Notes when cleaning the washing machine:

Closing the washing machine door immediately after washing is complete creates a perfect moist environment, which qualifies for mold growth. Therefore, you should leave the washing machine door open after the washing cycle is complete so that the remaining water can evaporate.

Make sure the trays contain washing water and the rinse water is dry. You should bring them to dry or dry after washing before reinstalling them in the machine.



Regular maintenance and cleaning of the machine once a month based on the above methods will keep your washing machine clean and free of odors. At the same time it will help your washing machine continue to function well for years to come.

Do not leave wet clothes in the machine even for a few hours as this will lead to the formation of mold, affect the washing machine and cause bad smell for your clothes. You should use clothes to dry immediately or use the

drying function after the washing cycle is complete.

The above are the necessary precautions when we clean the upper-door washing machine and the front-loading washing machine. In the process of use, you should also redistribute clothes, do not wash too little or too much compared to the maximum weight recorded on the machine to avoid operating the machine over capacity.
