1. Are the dimensions accurate?



It's rare to find a phone case that's the wrong size these days, but if you're buying from a third-party retailer rather than the official manufacturer, do a quick check to be absolutely sure — especially when buying in-store.

Make sure the buttons are positioned correctly, the speaker holes are unobstructed, the camera module is protected, and the case has raised edges.

If your case has a built-in dust plug for the charging port, that's even better. If your case doesn't, you may want to check out these cleaning tips to keep your device clean.

2. What material is the phone case made of?



The material greatly affects the durability, grip, and overall feel of the case. Silicone and rubber cases offer great grip, and their soft texture makes them comfortable to hold. However, they are often thicker, which can make them bulky and heavy to carry in your pocket.

Hard plastics like polycarbonate offer a smooth, glossy finish but can be slippery. Leather cases strike a balance between premium texture and comfort, though they tend to be less grippy and more expensive. TPU (thermoplastic polyurethane) is another popular choice because of its lightweight, shock-absorbing properties, balancing flexibility and durability.

Sometimes manufacturers use a combination of materials. For example, a phone case made of TPU with a matte finish and small rubber ridges around the back. This gives it good grip, feels great in your hand, and isn't too bulky. Sometimes one phone case isn't enough and you might want to consider using multiple alternative phone cases.

3. Does the case have any additional functions?



While not essential, you should also check to see if the case you buy has any additional features that can enhance the usability of your phone.

Cases may include a built-in kickstand for hands-free viewing, card slots for convenience, or wireless charging compatibility. These added features make the case more practical and eliminate the need for additional accessories.

Buying a new case is a great way to make your phone look like new without spending a fortune on a device upgrade, although the number of options can vary depending on the brand and model of phone you have.
