

3 ways to change the default browser in Windows 10

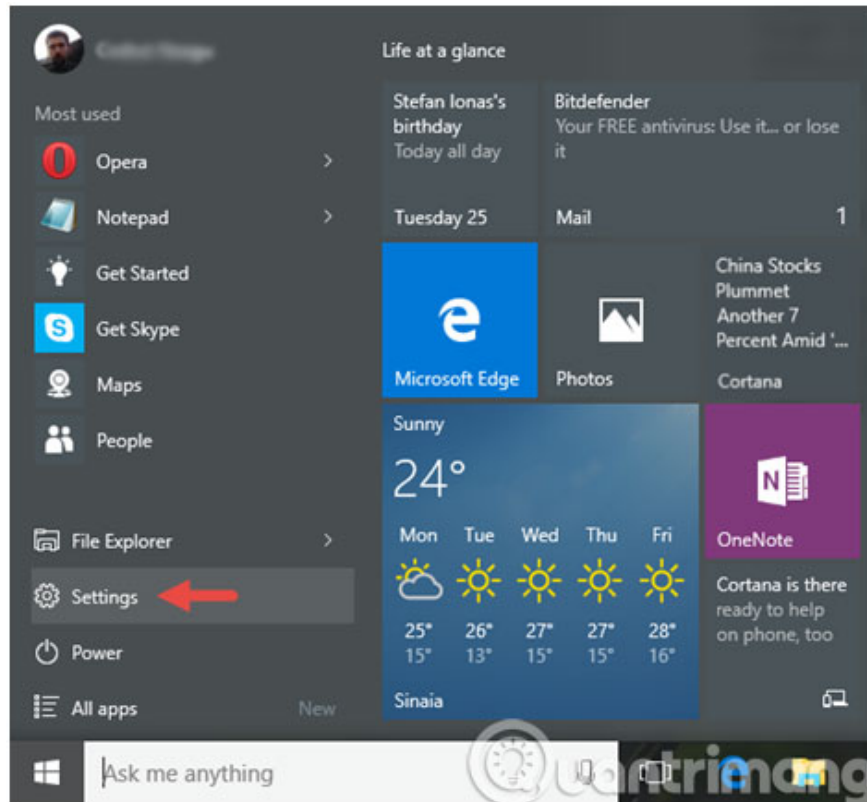

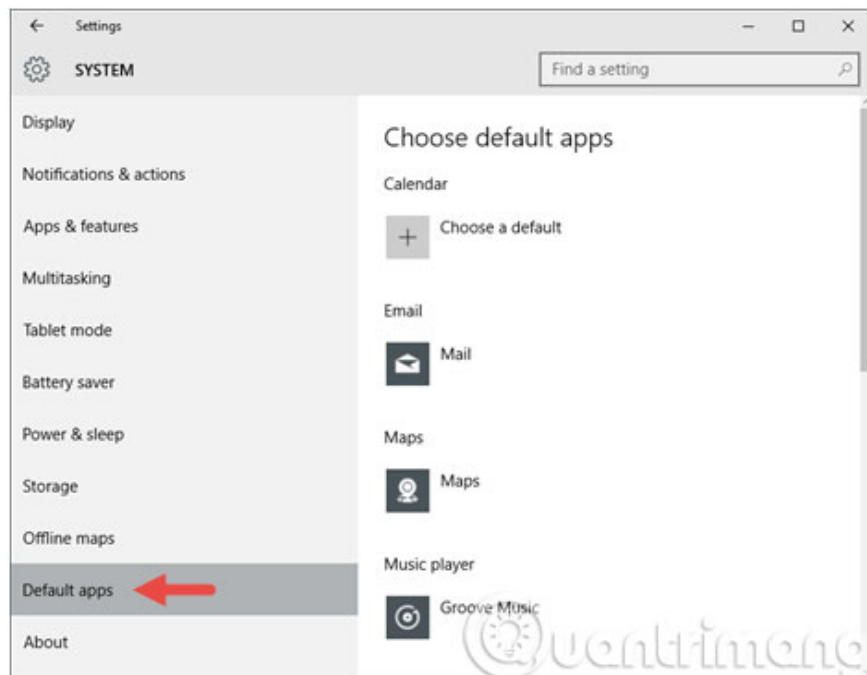

1. Change from Settings app

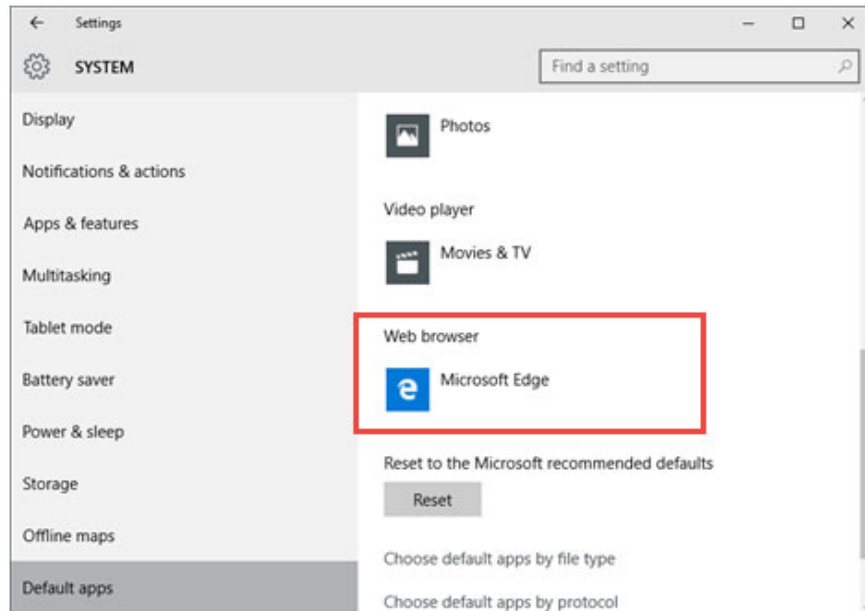
To set the default browser in Windows 10, first go to the **Start** menu, then click **Settings** .



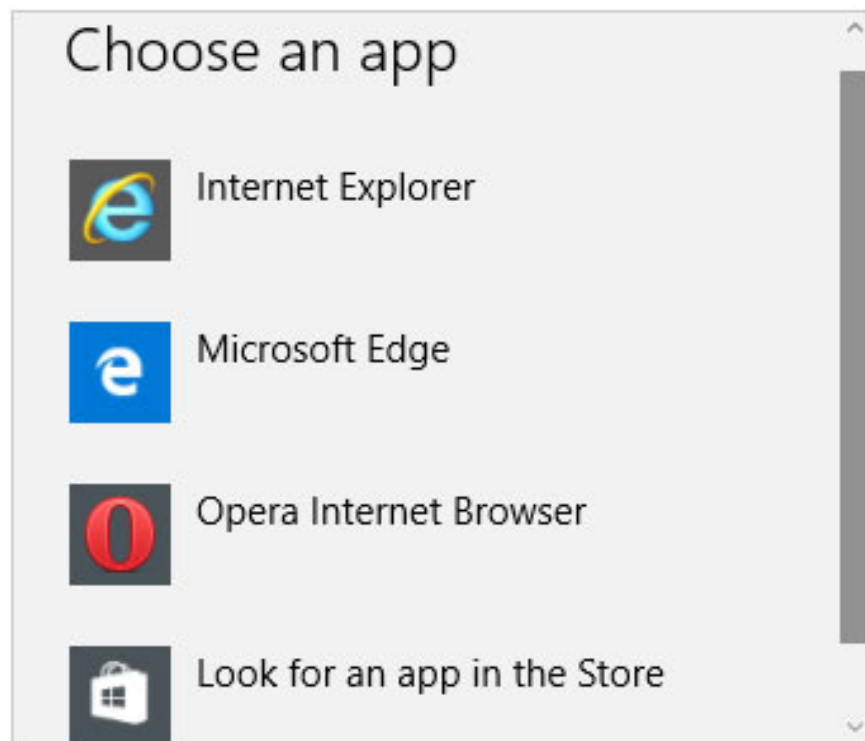
In the **Settings** window, click the **System** item, then click the **Default apps** item in the left menu.



Next in the right pane, scroll down to the **Web browser section** . In this section you will see the web browser display currently set by default on the computer. If you want to use another web browser installed on your computer, simply click on the name of the currently used web browser under the Web browser section (*as shown in this picture is Microsoft Edge*).

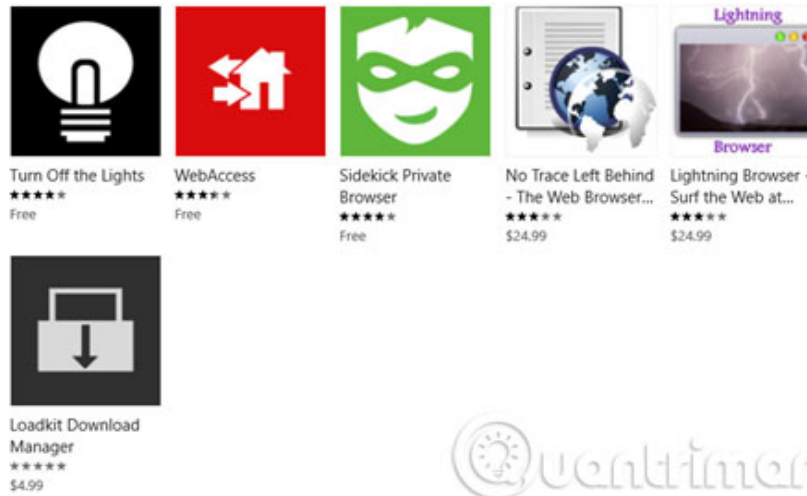


Immediately Windows 10 will display a list of browsers installed on your computer. Now you just need to click on the correct browser that you want to use as the default when browsing the web in this list.



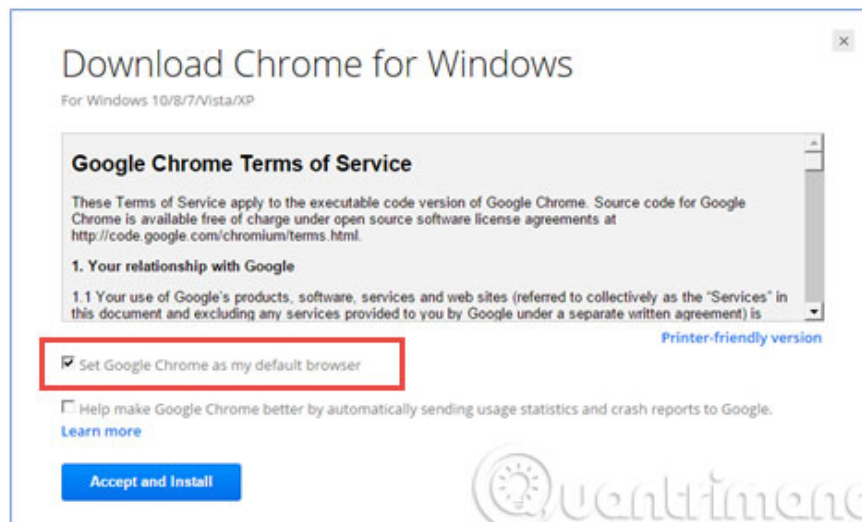
Also at the bottom of this list you will see the **Look for an app in the Store** option, which will activate the Store app so you can download and install another browser if you want.

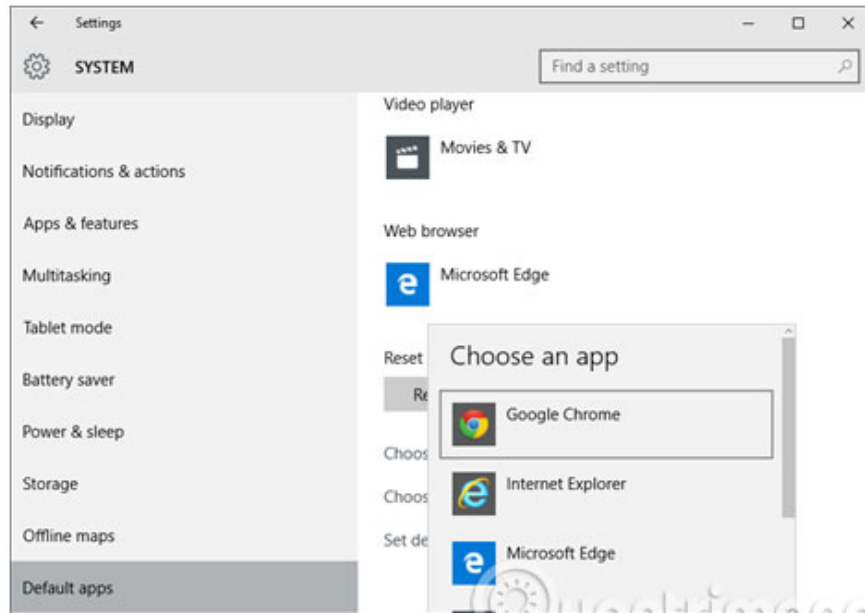


2. Change the default browser when installing a new browser

If you have not installed your favorite web browser on Windows 10, the first thing you should do is download and install it. During the installation process or soon after, most browsers will ask if you want to install as the default browser. For example, **Google Chrome** will ask you about this before being installed on your computer.

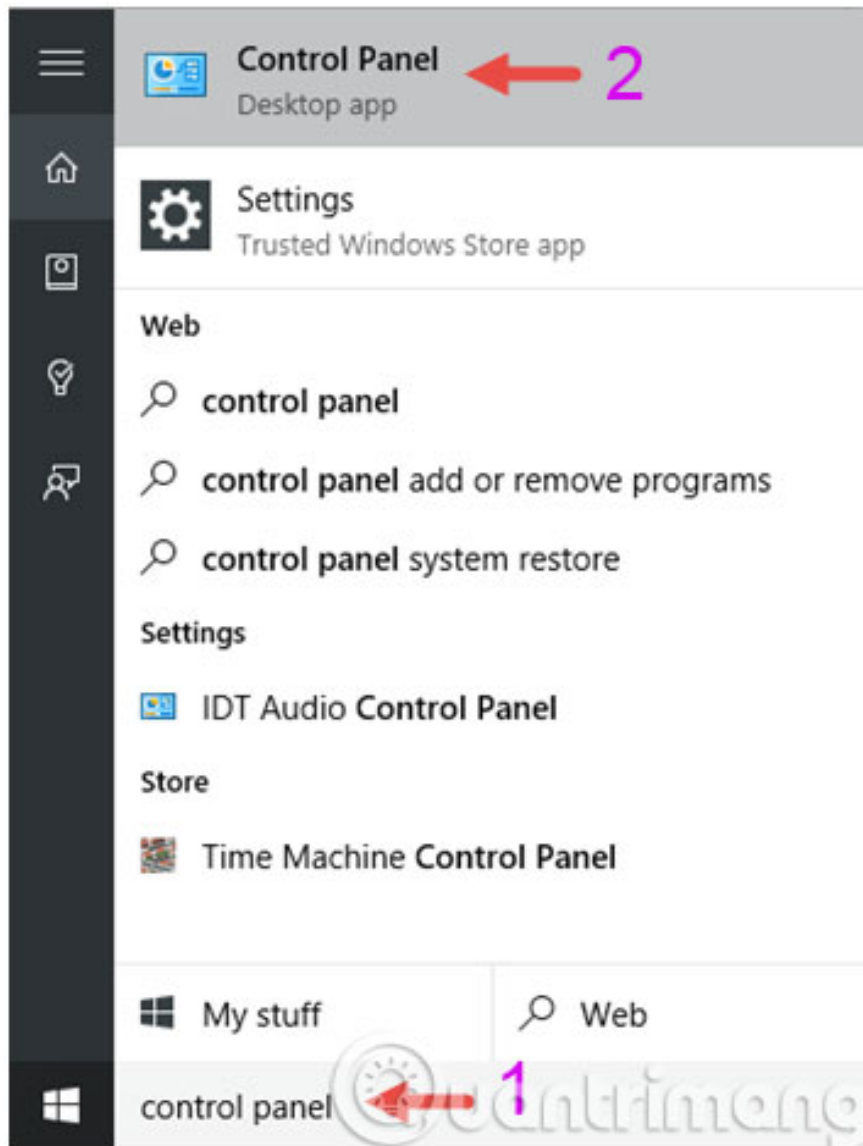


But Windows 10 does not support this function, so after installing your favorite browser Windows will ask if you want to set it as the default? If you agree, Windows 10 will start the **Settings** application to make you change the same way

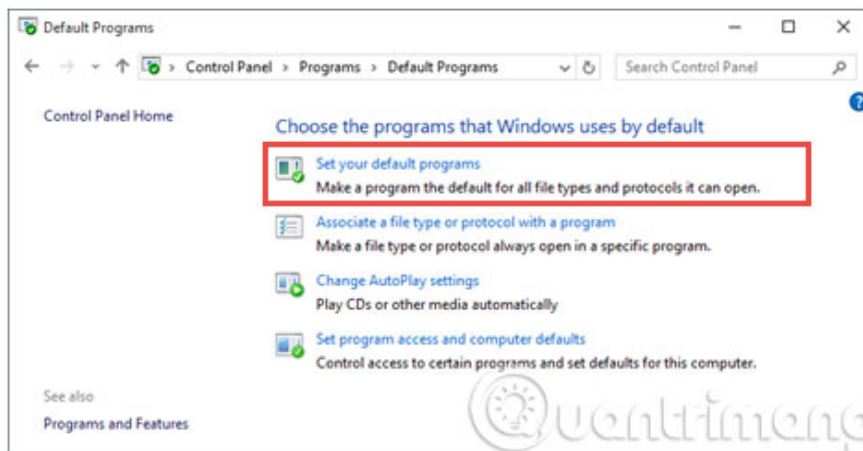


3. Change from Control Panel

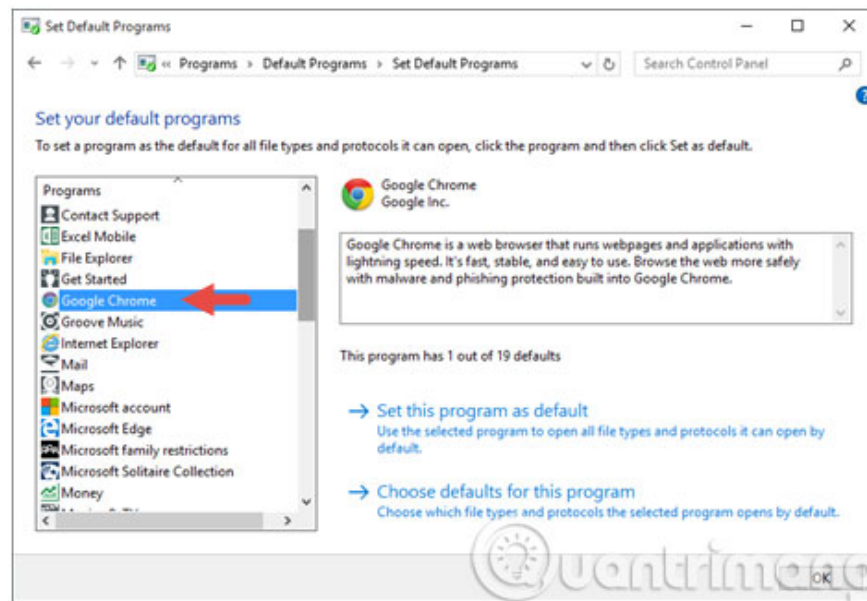
First, enter the **Control Panel** keyword in the search pane **Cortana** and then select the appropriate result from the list.



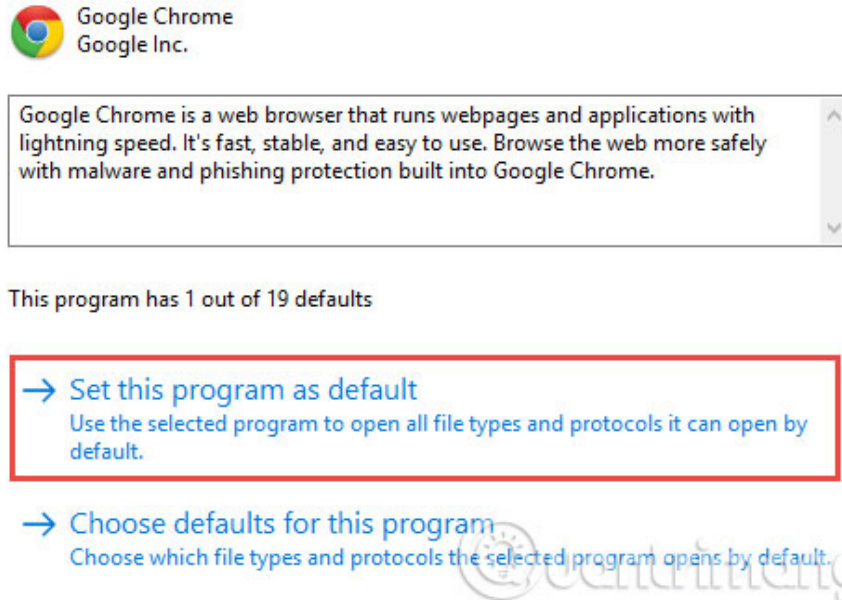
In the **Control Panel** window , access the **Programs** > section **Default Programs** and then click the **Set your default programs** link .



Then, on the left menu from the **Set default programs** window, click on your favorite browser to use as the default in the left column.



On the right side of the window, you can see a brief description of the browser you selected with two options: **Set this program as default** and **Choose defaults for this program**. In this case, click on **Set this program as default** and then click the **OK** button to apply.



Above, we have introduced you to 3 ways to change the default browser in Windows 10. From now on, you can freely choose according to your interests and work requirements already.
