Among the long list of WhatsApp capabilities, including group text messaging, push notifications, end-to-end encryption (with supported versions), and compatibility with most smartphone models. intelligent.

But WhatsApp can even do better. That's why there are apps and extensions you can add to your WhatsApp app to do more than just send messages.

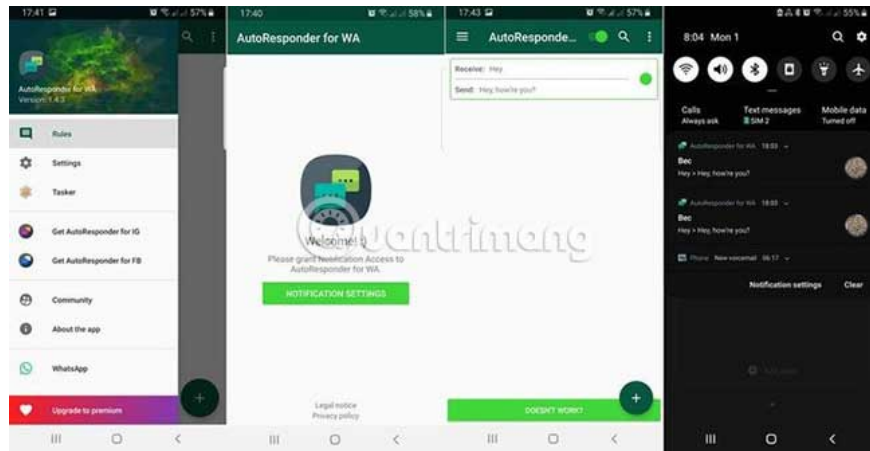
Here are 5 of the best apps or extensions you can use with WhatsApp for a richer experience.

1. AutoResponder for WhatsApp

AutoResponder is another great app you can use to create a better experience for your contacts. You can automatically reply to custom received messages on WhatsApp or WA Business using the chat bot and customize each automatic response to your liking.



The app is free to download and has lots of automation tools, allowing you to respond to messages when you're busy, send answers to specific messages, create welcome messages for new conversations and more. So again. If you want to schedule a reply, you can use an automated scheduler and even add a delay based on when you want to send the message.

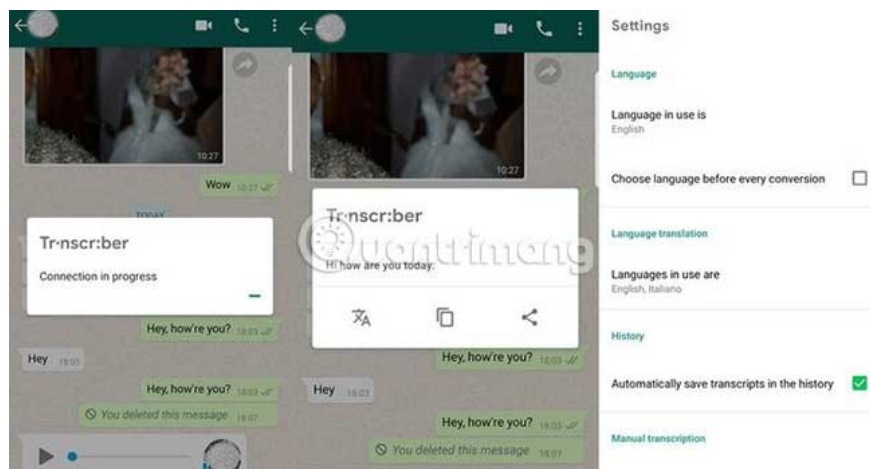
This app works not only with your contacts but also with unknown groups and contacts. You can ignore and specify contacts and groups.

The downside is that you can't send pictures, stickers, videos or other media files. AutoResponder for WhatsApp also does not work with WhatsApp Web apps and tablets. However, the application is still in beta, with promises of new features coming soon, such as font format, driving mode and a widget.

Note : If AutoResponder doesn't work for you, please update WhatsApp Messenger to the latest version.

2. Transcriber for WhatsApp

Transcriber for WhatsApp is a free, handy application that converts WhatsApp voice notes into text. If you continue to receive voice messages and cannot open them, because the situation at that time does not allow, the application will convert the voice into a text message so you can read them later.



To use it, simply install the app and then select a voice message, tap the share icon in WhatsApp, then select **Transcriber**. The transcription will be displayed in the same WhatsApp screen. The app will transcribe only the parts with voice in it, and in seconds you'll have a message in your hand to read.

For people with hearing problems, this app is really helpful. However, the quality of the transcription depends on the speaker, because not all words can be captured. You can also change the language from the application settings if you do not want to use it in English only. But for now, the app only supports English and Italian.

3. WAToolkit

This Chrome extension is a must-have, if you use WhatsApp Web for the Chrome browser on the desktop. You can use it for free and expand the chat bubble to its maximum width so you can optimize and take advantage of your screen range.

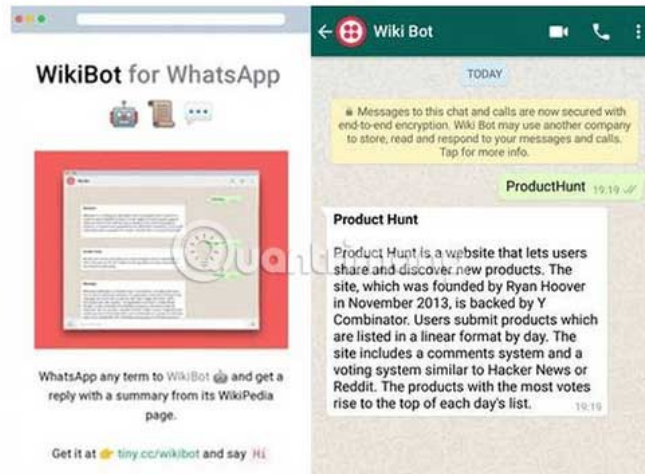


In the Chrome toolbar, you'll find the WAToolkit icon, adding a notification badge to separate read and unread messages. Just hover over it to read all incoming messages without opening the web application. This saves time and you can read the message without making the person notice the green '**Seen**' tick.

This extension also provides connection notifications, making the icon orange in case the phone has connection problems. This is common with the Web version. In addition, desktop support is also available thanks to desktop notifications that are always displayed even when you close Chrome.

4. WikiBot

WikiBot is another extension you can use for WhatsApp, providing quick explanations and meanings for queries directly from Wikipedia. WikiBot is like your own little dictionary in the app and you don't have to install or download anything to use it.

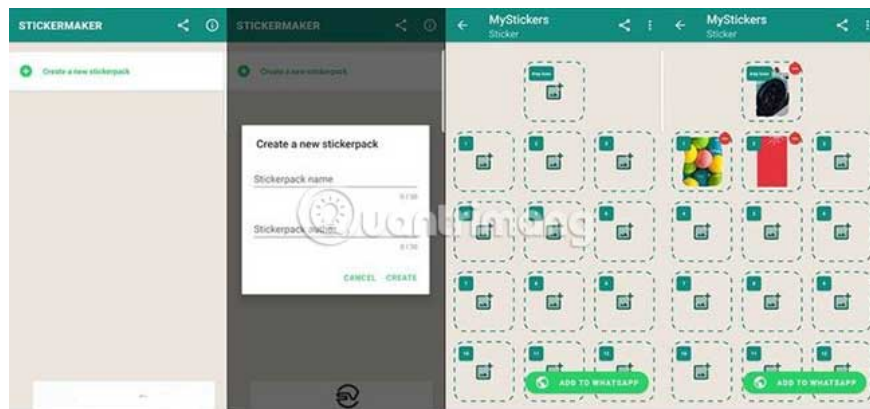


Setting up by adding a WikiBot phone number to the contact list (saved as WikiBot), then entering the command and sending it to the contact number is also very easy. It will respond with a prompt to confirm that you have activated the service, plus how to unsubscribe and notify you that you are ready to enjoy the service.

To get started, you can submit any word or phrase and the appliance will respond with a definition. This way, you can't leave WhatsApp to search for information about a person or a meaning on Google.

5. Sticker Maker

This is a really cool app that you can use to create unique stickers on WhatsApp, instead of using default emojis and emoticons or other downloaded images and stickers.



With Sticker Maker, you can import photos or memes from your own library and create up to 30 stickers for each WhatsApp package, with as many packages as you like.

To get started, download the app and then create your sticker, name the package and add the sticker to it. Next, export the sticker package to WhatsApp and start enjoying your sticker.

While WhatsApp is useful, it doesn't contain all the features you need. With the above extensions (and many others on the Internet), you can install and use many of the features you need to increase productivity.
