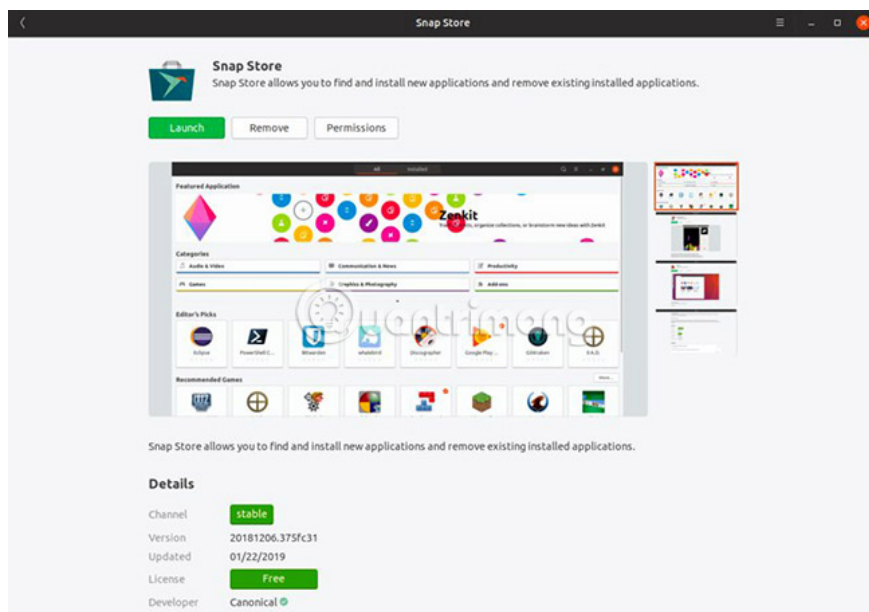


5 best games on Ubuntu Snap Store

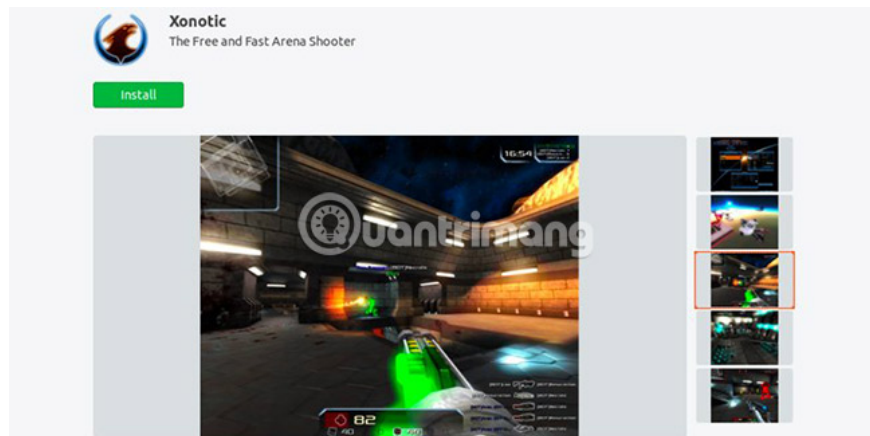
1. TrackMania Nations Forever



Free version of TrackMania's long-term franchise game is far from reality. Instead of simulations, players have the opportunity to admire designs that do not follow conventional gravity rules. However, some features found in the paid version do not appear in this free version.

Most interesting things that come with this game come from online. Here, you will see maps created by players, using hypothetical situations and gaming experience. The feeling of overcoming challenges is amazing.

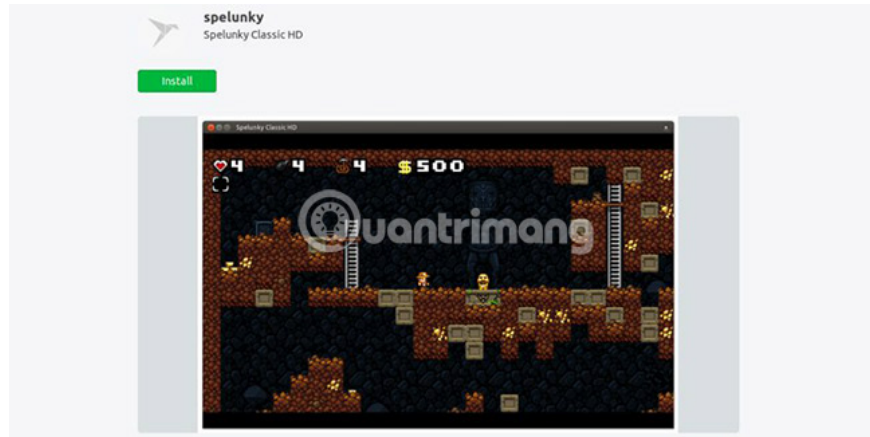
2. Xonotic



If you've ever played games on Linux, you probably already know about Xonotic before, or at least its 'predecessor' - Nexuiz. While Nexuiz has finally moved into the commercial phase, Xonotic is still free and may still be maintained in the future.

This is a classic player game, fast and very similar to games like Quake 3. Game offers 9 core weapons and a variety of game modes, including classic modes like Deathmatch and Capture the Flag, as well as more special modes like Freeze Tag.

3. Spelunky



Unlike the commercial version that was first released in 2012, this is the original free version of Spelunky. Although the free version may not have everything as in the new version, but if you don't pass a certain table, the result is the same.

Spelunky borrowed ideas from role-playing role-playing games like other classic platform games. This means that every time you pass caves, the context will change. The goal is to advance as deep as possible and collect as many treasures as possible along the way. This may not be the best-looking game, but in return it has depth.

4. Eternal Lands



Today, when it comes to MMORPG, World of Warcraft or its extended versions is what people will think of first. Eternal Lands once reverberated once before the franchise. This is also the time when online role-playing games are appearing more and more. If you are looking for an MMORPG, then this might be a great option for you.

This game is basically free, although players can only choose their own characters, including Humans, Elves and Dwarves. Gnomes, Orchans and Draegoni are also available, but only for the paid version. There are two continents to explore and many ways to perfect the character. There aren't any pre-built classes here. Instead,

players level up their characters when they see fit.

5. WolfenDoom: Blade of Agony



The name suggested to the player a bit about what is in this game in different ways. This is really a Doom mod, and goes beyond a basic mod. The 'shocking' title of this game is more or less suggestive of gameplay.

Although a bit retro, but this is not a simple Doom version. This game uses effects that weren't possible in the 90s, so players will need a powerful computer to run this game. It also focuses on evolving more than inspired shooters. If you are looking for a retro style with a more modern style, then this might be the perfect choice for you.
