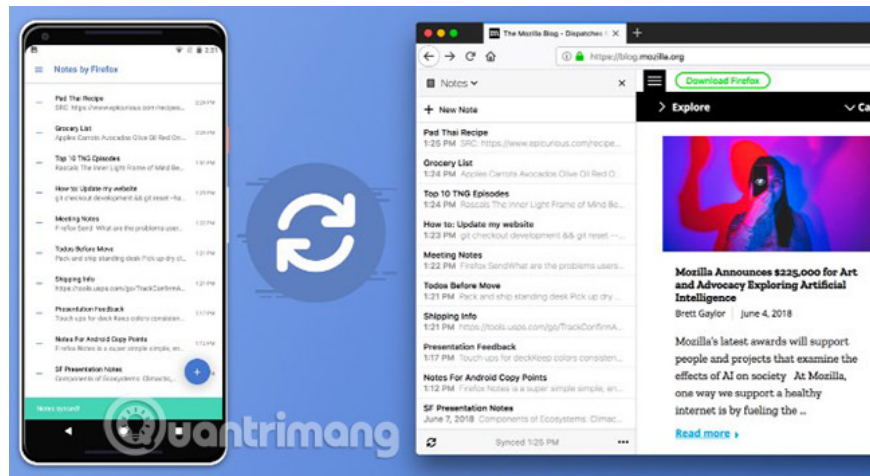

Notes by Firefox (Android, Desktop): Notes synced between mobile device and desktop



Mozilla's latest test is an application for Android devices called Notes. This is a mobile version of the Notes app, first released as part of Mozilla's test program.

Download the app on your Android and sign in with your Firefox account. It will quickly synchronize notes between the browser on the desktop and the application. Now you have a secure encrypted notepad to record everything you want.

Notes by Firefox is actually quite similar to the popular note-taking application, Simplenote. You can start unlimited notes, edit them in basic format and read pure text notes offline.

Firefox Lockbox (iOS): Password manager for iPhone

Firefox has a convenient password manager built into the browser. Using Firefox Sync, you can access all those passwords on your desktop and Firefox version of iOS. But apps like LastPass and 1Password need you to provide those passwords outside of the browser, in other applications. The new lockbox will help fix that.

Now you can continue to use the Firefox password manager built into your desktop and mobile device, while still being able to log in to other applications. Just enable Lockbox and click on an account. Now you can copy and paste the password into the relevant application or sometimes, Lockbox will automatically open the application and log in to help you.

It is like some of the best password managers for iOS, including features like 256-bit encryption as well as fingerprint and Face ID support. And it's free.

Internet Health Report (Web, Ebook): Mozilla's Internet status



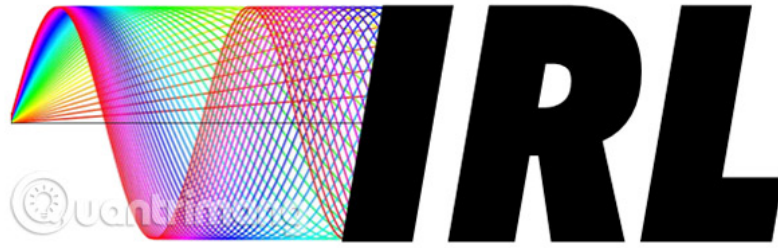
In April 2018, Mozilla released the first full version of Internet Health Report, and from now on it will be an annual tradition. The full report is free to read online or download as an eBook.

In the report, Mozilla addresses questions in the minds of anyone using the Internet, including topics such as privacy, security, open source, digital-related issues, and articles. write on the web and decentralization. Each section tells you why you should learn about it, what people around the world are doing to solve the problem and how it affects the Internet today.

The basic idea of ??the report is to put a human perspective on the state of the Internet because people are the most relevant people. Anyone can download a shortened version in PDF format or explore the full version online. You can also download it as an ePub.

IRL (Podcast): Mozilla's podcast for online life



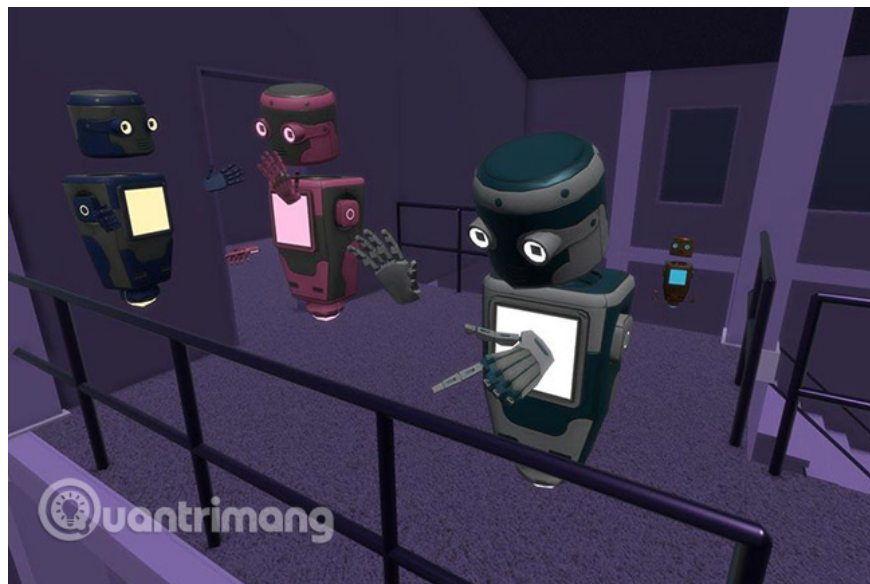

Hub by Mozilla (Web, VR): Virtual chat room does not need to register for anyone



Mozilla focuses on bringing a better experience for the world to quickly access virtual reality technology, via the Firefox Reality browser. But more than that, Mozilla wants to eliminate barriers between closed platforms.

Hubs is a new initiative where people can create virtual chat rooms and invite others to join by sharing a simple link. You will need to select an avatar and then use the microphone to talk to anyone in the chat room. Only audio, no text.

You do not need a Firefox account. You don't even need Firefox and can actually use it on Google Chrome. Anyone can create, share or join a virtual chat room, from any device. Of course, the best experience will be with virtual reality headsets.
