

# 5 effective file sharing cloud applications

## 1: Dropbox

Dropbox is an old cloud file storage application that supports Windows, Linux, and Mac computers, as well as iPhone and Android mobile models. The idea of creating Dropbox is simple: After you install this application, a folder called Dropbox appears on the desktop and you can drag and drop and organize files in that folder. These files have been stored in the cloud. This means that users can work with folders on multiple computers or on mobile devices and files are synchronized with just one click or touch. Dropbox provides users with 2GB of free storage but you will have to register yourself for an account. If you want to increase the storage capacity to save more files, you can upgrade to a Pro account and get 50 GB of storage for \$ 9.99 a month or get 100 GB for \$ 19.99.



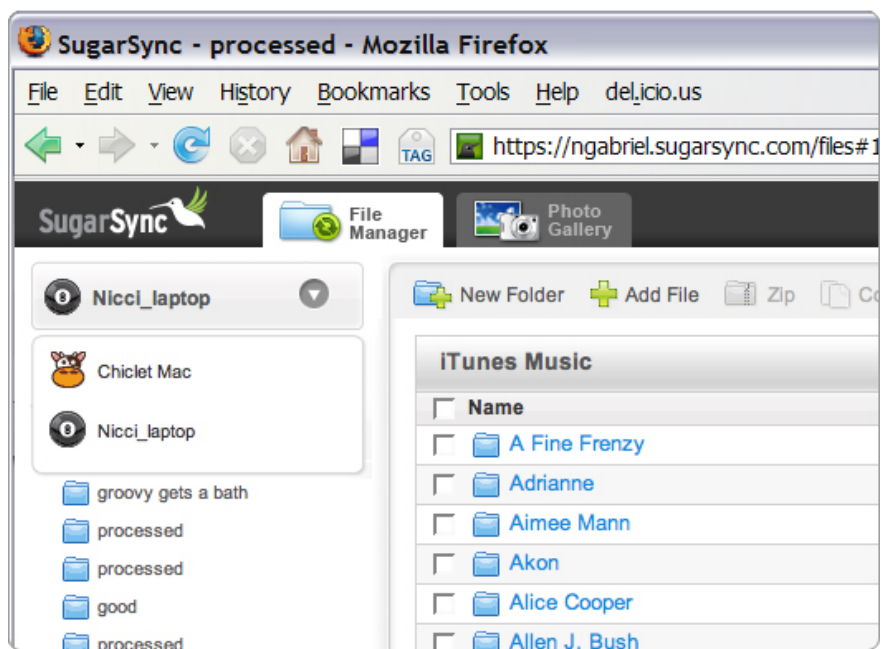
## 2: SoonR

SoonR is another popular cloud application, providing users with tools to share files between different devices and platforms. The biggest difference here is that SoonR's only free thing is the 30-day trial period. Then, Premium version for \$ 9.99 a month allows you to share 25GB of storage for 3 other users. You can also upgrade to a Pro account at a price of \$ 29.99 a month and increase the number of shared users to 5 and storage capacity to 100GB.

SoonR supports both iPhone, Android, and Blackberry, so users can easily share, sync and display files anywhere. SoonR seems to be the perfect solution when it comes to businesses to use. However, if you only share files for yourself, other free apps can also be met.

### 3: SugarSync

SugarSync is a cross-platform cloud application that allows users to back up, sync and share files on Windows and Mac computers and many other devices (iPad, iPhone, BlackBerry, Windows Mobile), Android, and Symbian). SugarSync seems a bit disappointing in the mobile field, it still allows users to upload and sync files via email and sync folders to mobile devices, a great thing if you have to do a lot of work when you go on business. This cloud application provides free accounts with storage capacity up to 5 GB. Users can also choose to upgrade to 30 GB for \$ 4.99 a month for up to 250GB for a fee of \$ 24.99.




### 4: ZumoDrive

ZumoDrive works with Windows, Mac, Linux, iPhone, Android, and Palm Pre operating systems. It seems that this cloud application also makes many people happy. Designed to help people access all kinds of files - music, data, video, photos and many other files - no matter what device you are using, ZumoDrive can still accommodate need. This cloud application provides users with 1GB of free storage. You can also choose a more suitable upgrade plan - from 10 GB for \$ 2.99 a month to 500GB for \$ 79.99 a month.

Now users can easily link folders on computers and devices to ZumoDrive and use the integration of this service with iTunes to organize, sync and organize songs lists without must download the files to the computer. Sharing files with others is also easy: Just enter the email addresses of the people you want to share files with.

## 5: SendSpace

SendSpace is a file sharing tool that has been available since 2005. It includes a desktop tool - for Windows, Mac and Linux operating systems - and a mobile application for iPhone and Android phones. SendSpace is famous for users can share a large number of files with others very safely. The functionality of this cloud application is more like a 'conductor' for files than a cloud storage for information you want to share with others. This capability also supports users to send large files very smoothly. Users can use SendSpace to send a GB book to their colleagues or friends in another country and the service is also easy to use for everyone.
