

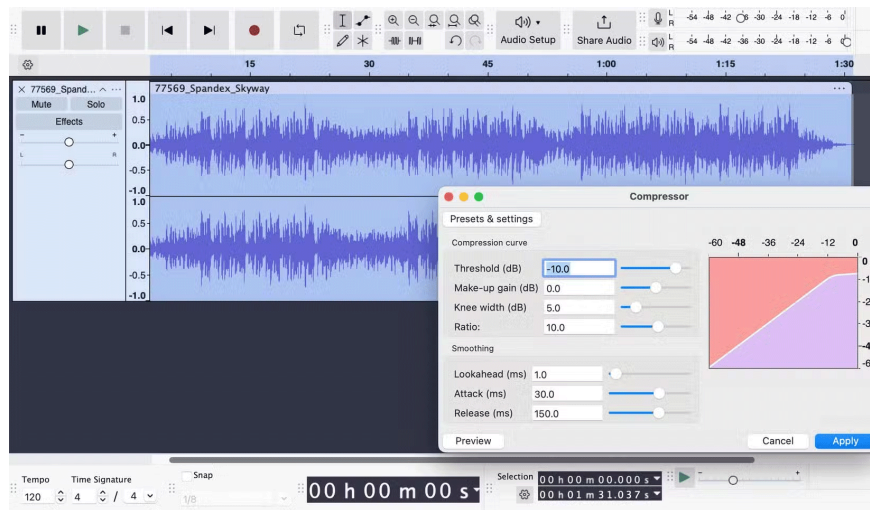

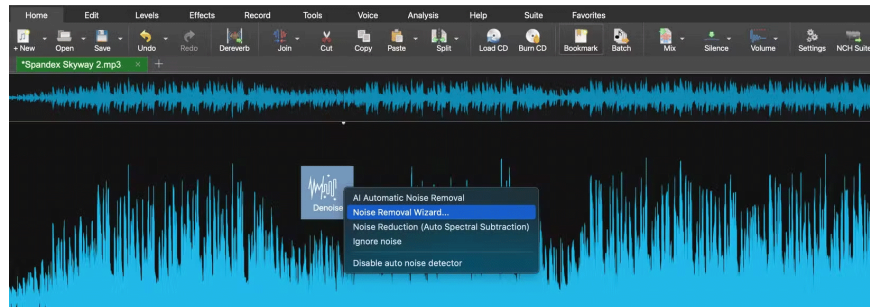

WavePad is another great audio editing software for Windows and macOS that is free for non-commercial use. It is designed for both beginners and professionals, making WavePad a great choice for those

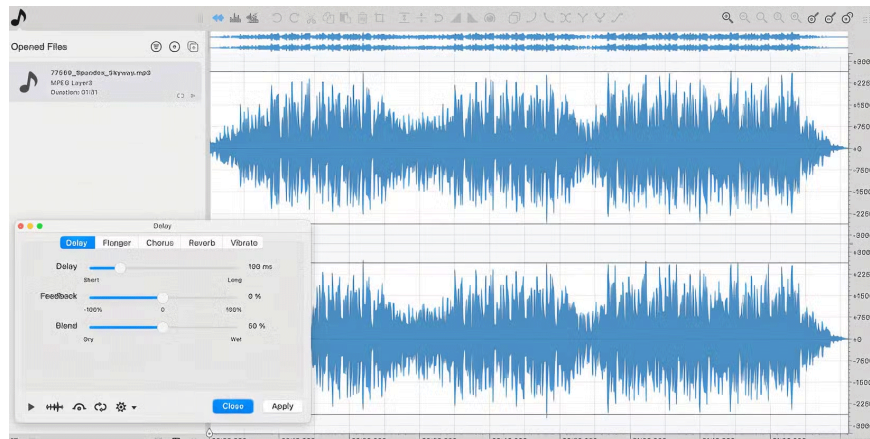
new to working with audio. It offers a user-friendly interface with powerful features, allowing you to edit and master audio files as well as add high-quality effects to a variety of audio formats.

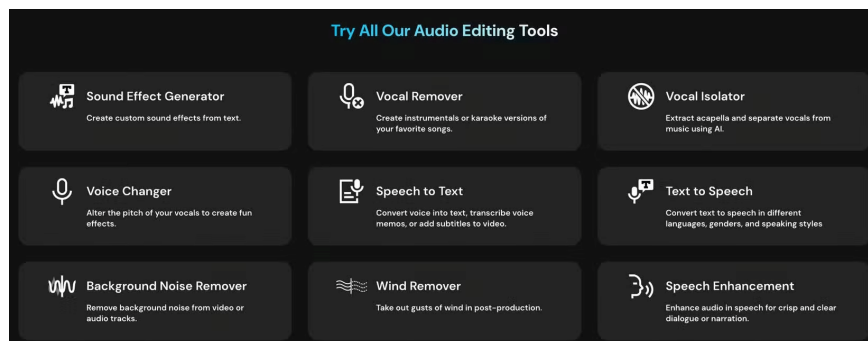
