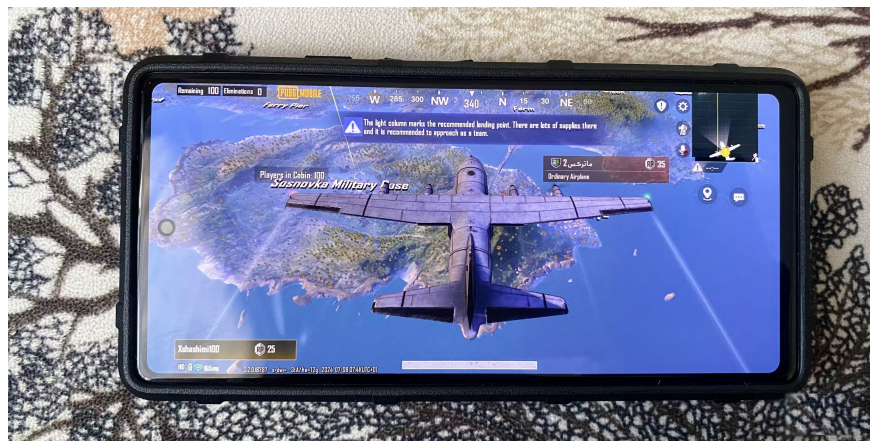
2. Asphalt 9: Legends

4. Call of Duty: Mobile

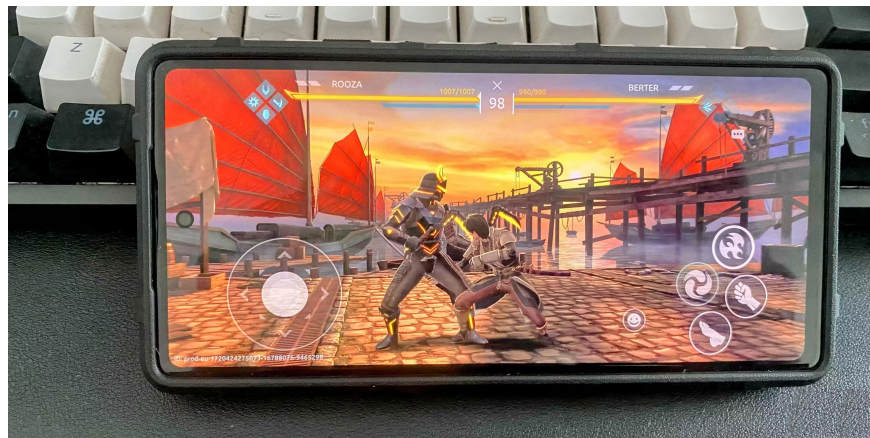
