

5 interesting features coming to Windows 11

Here are 5 notable changes and improvements that Microsoft has added to the Preview builds, and will soon roll out to Windows users around the world.

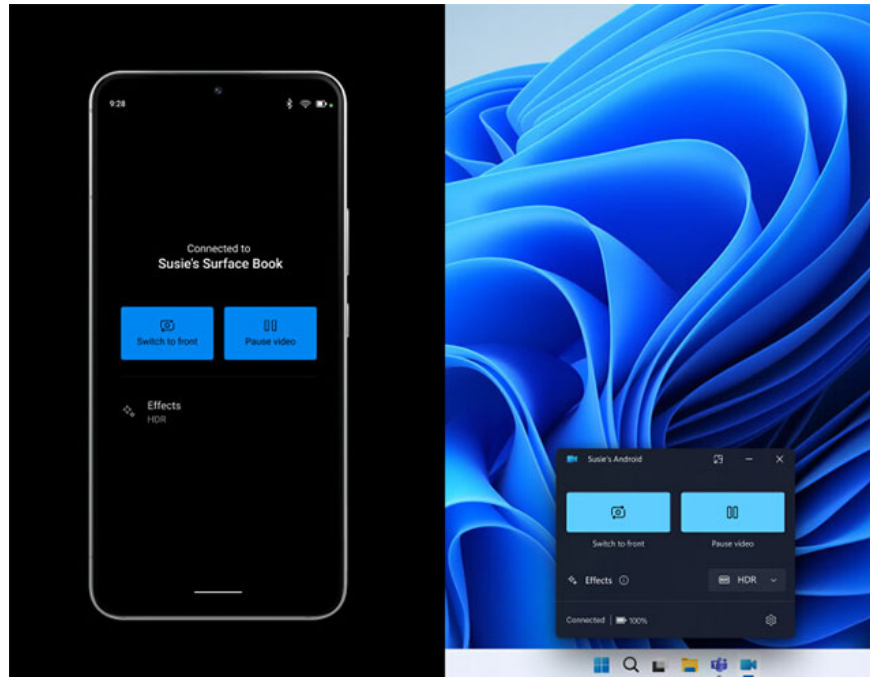
Microsoft plans to release a single major feature update for Windows 11 this year codenamed 24H2. In fact, the recent "Moment 5" update also came with some very notable changes and additions. However, Version 24H2, expected to be released in the second half of 2024, promises to provide users with even more exciting new features.

Although the full list of new features in Windows 11 version 24H2 has not yet been fully announced, up to now, it is certain that quite a few changes will be introduced to the operating system. Below are five interesting features that will soon appear on Windows 11 this year.

1. Use your phone as a webcam

After announcing the Windows 11 Moment 5 update, Microsoft introduced an extremely important and long-awaited new feature: Allowing Windows users to use Android smartphones as high-quality webcams.

Windows 11 will soon let you use your Android smartphone as a wireless webcam. Modern phones have excellent quality cameras that even expensive webcams can hardly compare with. Future Windows updates will give you the flexibility to use each of the different cameras in your smartphone for calling, PC video, applying additional effects (e.g. HDR), and more than that.



Microsoft wants to make this experience as convenient as possible, so Windows 11 will offer a dedicated control panel with all the control options and additional information, such as connection status and battery level. As of now, the ability to use an Android smartphone as a webcam with a Windows 11 PC is available to all Windows Insider testers who have Link to Windows app version 1.24012 or later installed. go up.

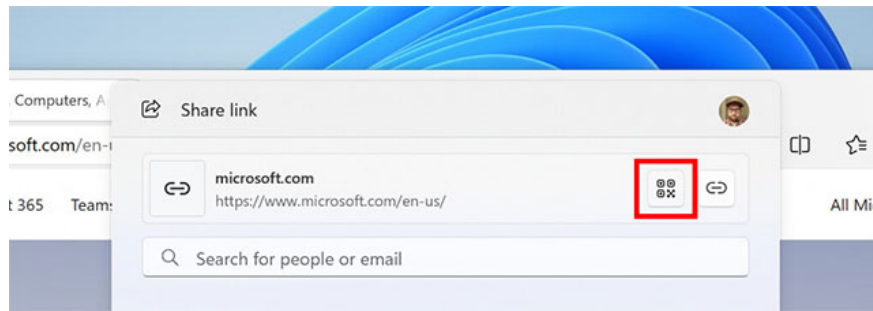
2. Deeper Copilot integration

Copilot's potential is huge, but this virtual assistant service currently lacks a truly useful set of Windows-related features. Microsoft is planning to help its new AI assistant interact better with Windows users. You'll soon be able to ask Copilot to scan Wi-Fi networks, display device information, report battery levels, toggle battery saver, clean up memory, take screenshots, interact with assistant features, and more. ability, etc

The above utilities may not sound too new or impressive, but can actually help significantly simplify the user experience in the Windows environment.

3. Built-in QR code generator

A small but really useful feature. Windows will let you generate QR codes when sharing links, making transferring websites from PC to phone much easier. You won't need to email yourself a link, or wait for Microsoft Edge to synchronize your browsing history.



4. Energy saver

Microsoft is working to expand the existing power saving feature to more devices, specifically desktop computers that don't traditionally use rechargeable batteries. The new power saver trades higher performance for battery life and lets you reduce power consumption when you reach a certain battery life, or even when plugged in.

Turning on the power saver from the Settings app or Quick Settings dialog box displays a leaf icon in the notification area, indicating that the system is operating at a lower performance level to save power.

5. Add widgets on lock screen

The lock screen in Windows 11 will soon display more useful information. The current version only allows you to place a weather widget, but in the future, you will have more information about stocks, traffic, sports, etc. right on the lock screen. Of course, these widgets are optional, so you can still customize the lock screen look to be as informative or minimalist as you want.
