Noise-canceling headphones

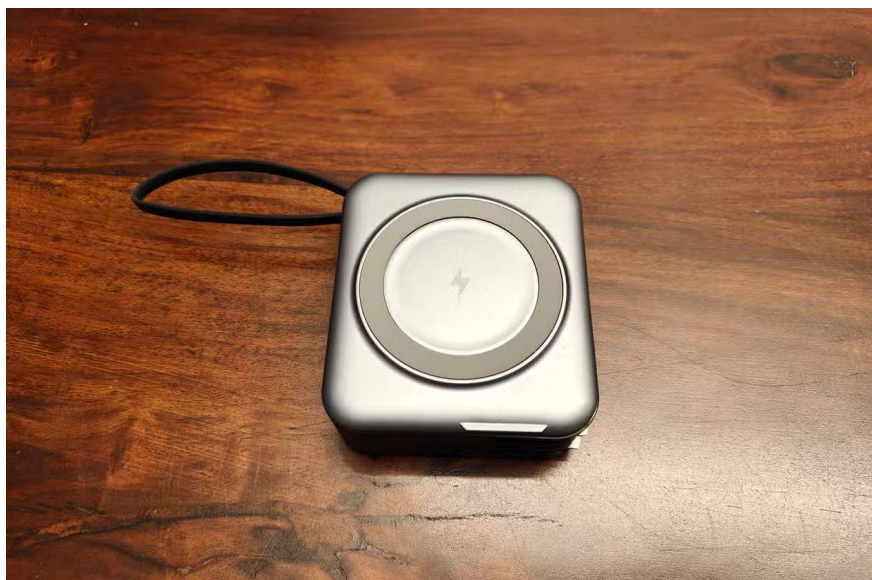
They make a huge difference.



The best noise-canceling headphones are essential for air travel, but you might also find them useful on trains or cars, though only if you're in the back seat. Make sure your noise-canceling headphones are fully charged and ready to use before each flight. You can wear them throughout the journey to listen to music, podcasts, or audio while watching movies or TV shows. But you can also wear them even when not actively listening to anything, just to enjoy the noise-canceling benefits. A good pair of headphones like the Bose QuietComfort Ultra 2 helps reduce the loud noise of the aircraft engines and other ambient sounds. This is especially helpful on long-haul flights when you want to get some sleep.

Portable power bank

Charge your phone quickly when needed.



People always carry a power bank when they know they'll be away from home for extended periods and won't always be near a power outlet. There are a few essential features they look for in a power bank. It needs to have a battery capacity of at least 10,000mAh to fully charge a phone at least once. Built-in Qi wireless charging is useful when needed, ideally faster than 15W Qi2 (Qi 25W is the latest standard, although currently only a few phones support it). Don't buy a power bank without a built-in cable, so you don't have to carry a separate one. Finally, if it has a built-in AC plug, that's a plus. Many people often plug their power bank into a power outlet on a train, for example, to charge it while traveling into the city.

Multi-port socket adapter

Make the most of a single electrical outlet.

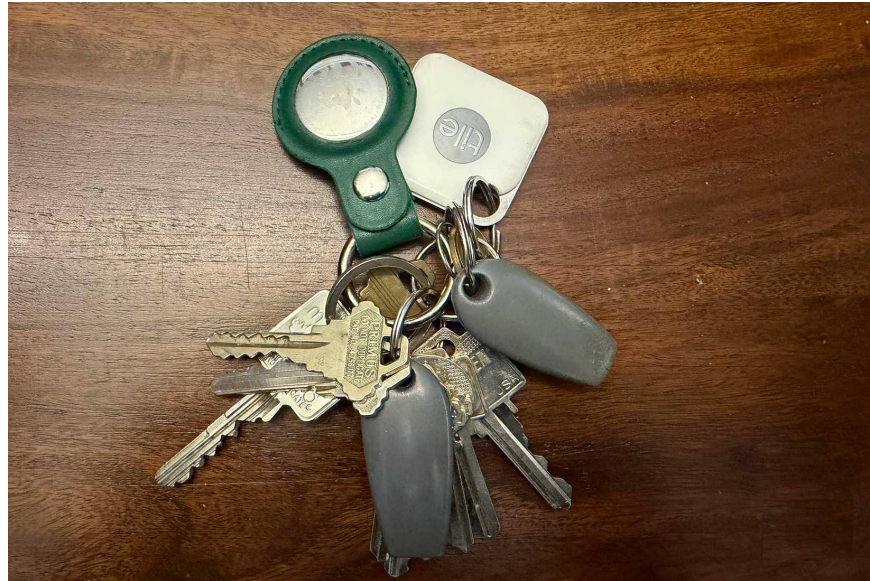


Hotel rooms often have multiple power outlets, but have you ever found them in inconvenient locations, such as under the floor near the foot of the bed? With a multi-port power adapter, you can plug everything into one conveniently located outlet. Many people prefer one with both USB-A and USB-C ports because these two cable types are quite common.

Choose one with at least four outlets to charge two phones, headphones, and a smartwatch, for example. Look for one with high capacity and fast charging so you can use your devices again right after showering, getting dressed, and ready to start your day. Foldable AC plugs are ideal for travel, as they won't stick out in your backpack and can also easily fit into a fanny pack or purse.

Mobile tracking device

Track your valuables.



Whether you use Apple AirTag , Tile, or any other device, there are many clever uses for these tracking devices. But the most obvious is for tracking valuables. You can use them on keys, but they can also be useful for your wallet, purse, or even your luggage. With items like keys, wallets, and purses, you can get notifications if they go out of range, preventing you from leaving them behind in a cafe abroad, for example, or deterring thieves from stealing them. With luggage, you can track the location of your suitcase, especially useful if the airport reports it lost.

Wired headphones as a backup.



Along with their main noise-canceling headphones, many people always carry a spare pair of wired headphones. These are very useful if you forget to charge your noise-canceling headphones, the headphones don't come with a charger, or you forget to bring a cable and want to plug them into the in-flight entertainment system. Or perhaps the headphones only come with a USB-C to USB-C cable, while the airline's power outlet is a 3.5mm headphone jack.
