If you have an Android device or iPhone / iPad, there are several ways to bring the game Civ with you. In this article, **TipsMake.com** looks at 5 ways you can play games from the Sid Meier Civilization series on a smartphone or tablet.

1. Play Civilization VI on iPhone and iPad
2. Play Civilization Revolution 2 on Android and iOS
3. Play FreeCiv on Android
4. Play World of Empires on Android and iOS
5. Use DosBox and the emulator

1. Play Civilization VI on iPhone and iPad



Civilization VI was originally launched for desktop computers in 2016. Some time later, in December 2017, the same game was released on iOS.

Compatible with iOS 11 running on iPhone 7 or 7 Plus, iPhone 8 or 8 Plus, iPhone X, iPad Air 2, iPad 2017 or any iPad Pro, Civilization VI is no different from the desktop version.

With a choice of 20 leaders in dynamic history and diplomacy, this game version even includes a local multiplayer mode. To attract more players, Civilization VI for iPhone and iPad is free to install. It comes with a 60-time trial, more than enough to help you decide whether this game is worth paying through in-app purchases.

You can only appreciate the convenience of having Civil with you, once you experience it for yourself. This game definitely makes waiting for the bus much more interesting.

Download Civilization VI for iOS (Free or \$ 19.99 - 460,000 VND in-app purchase to unlock the full game).

2. Play Civilization Revolution 2 on Android and iOS



Sadly, while Civilization VI is available on iOS, this game is not an Android option. This may not surprise you. After all, there was a time, before 2014, that there was no Sid Meier game for Android.

However, there is an official Civilization option available for Android users: Civilization Revolution 2.

As exciting as playing the original for the desktop, Civilization Revolution 2 has all the elements that Civil fans love. Cities are easy to manage via mobile screens.

If you're familiar with the Civilization versions on the desktop, you probably already know that maps can be random or generated. The game also provides context and all these features are included in Civilization Revolution 2. It even includes a context generator.

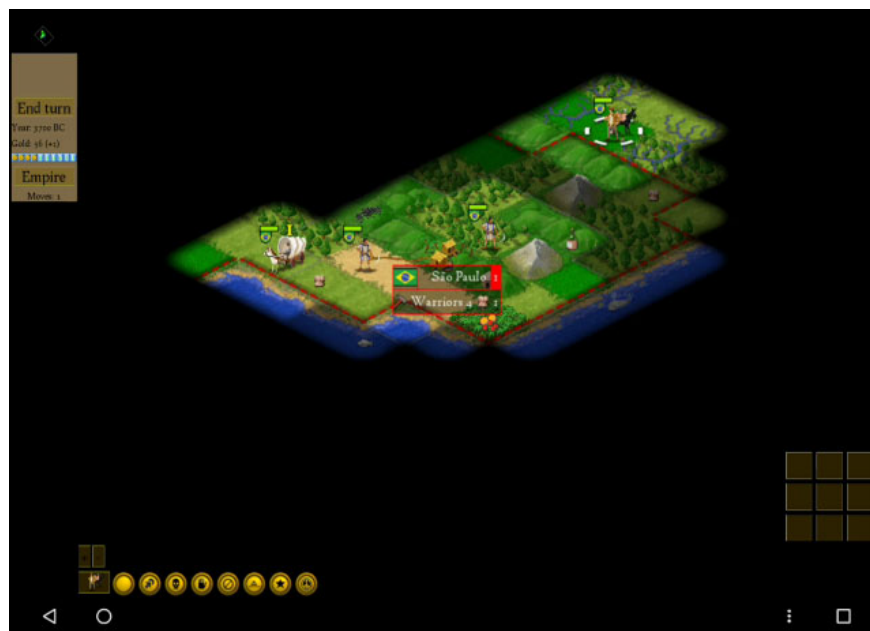
So you can start from 4,000 BC with your own civilization or play games set in an endless war. You can establish colonies in a new world, or in a world ravaged by barbarians. With so many options for a unique game available, you can play Civilization Revolution 2 on your phone for a long time to come.

Although there is no way to convert the current Civilization Revolution 2 game to the desktop version, this is still an engaging gaming experience.

While exciting, it seems to make those who seek a more authentic mobile experience less than satisfied. In short, Civilization Revolution 2 follows the animation of the previous version. So what else can you do if you are looking for a more traditional Civilization experience on your smartphone or tablet?

3. Play FreeCiv on Android



Perhaps the most accessible Civilization option for Android users is FreeCiv.

Using the isometric view similar to the earlier versions of Civilization, FreeCiv provides almost all the concepts in the game and combines with great graphics.

The game can be played on tablets better than on smartphones, so try playing FreeCiv on both devices to see which one you prefer.

4. Play World of Empires on Android and iOS



Starting as a copy of Civilization called 'MyCiv', World of Empires is a free alternative to Civil. Despite the graphical style of later Civ games (namely Civilization V and VI), World of Empires can be played in a surprising way.

Packed with a map editor, multiplayer mode, chat, 26 distinct civilizations, network saver and pay model for the option you want, World of Empires offers a gaming experience. impressive.

The game feels like Civilization makes you want to play more, while there is still enough difference to make you interested.

Can't you run Civilization VI on your iOS device? Don't you like Civilization Revolution 2 or FreeCiv on Android? World of Empires will be your best option.

5. Use DosBox and the emulator



If FreeCiv's retro fun doesn't satisfy your Civilization crush, you always have the option to emulate.

Android users can install DosBox Turbo and then find the ROM of Civilization or Civilization II. (At the time of this article, DOSBox options for iOS are limited.)

Meanwhile, if you enjoy playing the original Civilization Revolution, try the Nintendo DS emulator (such as the free nds4droid Android option). These tools will allow you to play the Nintendo DS version of Civilization Revolution.

This is a good option and you can also play games like on other mobile platforms. However, as you can see from the screenshot, it lacks the appeal of a standard mobile game.

However, keep in mind that when using the emulator, you cannot use the ROM legally, unless you own the original version on the disk.

Back when Android and iOS didn't have Civilization, options like Civil were the only option. At first, these options were quite modest, but over the years, they have been released more.

There are currently several ways to play Civilization on a smartphone and deciding which option is best depends on each person.
