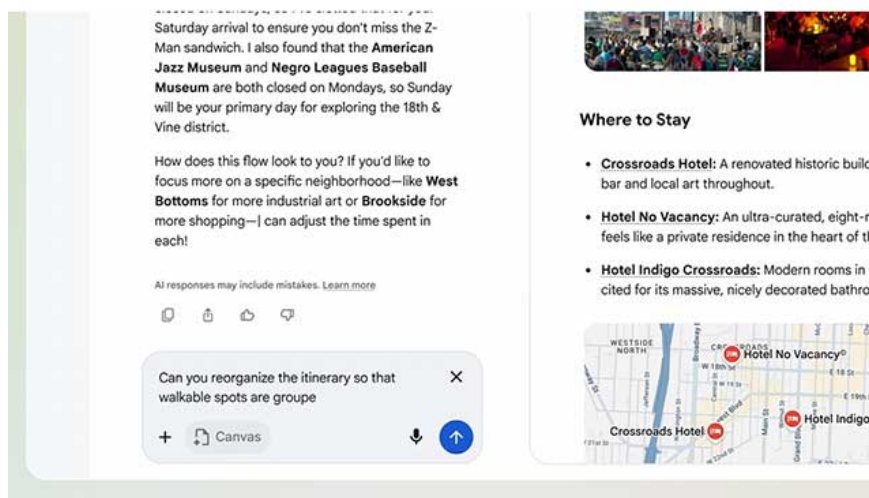

The Ask Maps feature, built on the Gemini platform, allows you to ask experiential questions. For example, if you want to find a campsite with beautiful scenery, sunset photography opportunities, wildlife, and full amenities, you simply describe your needs.

The system analyzes data from Google Maps and the user community to provide a list of suitable locations, along with detailed information such as restrooms, parking, electric vehicle charging stations, and tips from previous travelers. You can also save locations, make reservations, or navigate all within the same interface.

Clearly, Google is gradually transforming AI into a 'comprehensive travel assistant,' not only supporting searches but also participating in every step of the journey.
