1. End something or come to a conclusion.
2. *The end of the book was a happy one. - This book has a happy ending.*

## **Enough**

1. More than enough; Enough.
2. *Most Americans have enough food to eat, but that's not true in other countries.*

## **Eat**

1. Food consumption; Eating.
2. *The children liked to eat apples and bananas after school.*

## **Friend**

1. The opposite of an enemy. Someone who is on your side and you enjoy spending time with them.
2. *The girl played with her friend in the yard until her mother told her to come inside.*

## **Father**

1. Dad; Dad; Father.
2. *The father picked up his child when he started crying.*

## **Go**

1. Go; Move to or from a location.
2. *We go to school every day.*

## **Good**

1. Behave well or act kindly.
2. *My mother said that if I'm good and don't hit my brother, she will take me to the movies.*

## **Girl**

1. Daughter.
2. *The girl dropped her schoolbooks on the ground.*

## **Food**

1. Food: Food that nourishes humans and animals
2. *Starving people do not have enough food to eat and may die.*

## **Hear**

1. Listen
2. *I could hear my brother and sister arguing from the other room.*

## **House**

1. Home; A place where people, usually a family, live together.
2. *My friend lives in the biggest house on the street.*

## **Inside**

1. The inside of something or located inside something.
2. *The inside of the house was warm and cozy.*

## **Laugh**

1. Smile; Show that you are happy.
2. *The children laughed after the clown made a joke.*

## **Listen**

1. Hear something
2. *We listen to music because we like to dance.*

## **Man**

1. Man.
2. *The man was much taller than his son.*

## **Name**

1. Name of place, book, person
2. *I never liked my name growing up. - When I was growing up, I never liked my name.*

## **Never**

1. Never; Never.
2. *I am never getting back together with my boyfriend.*

## **Next**

1. An event that happens after another event in sequence; placed next to another event; Next
2. *Let's go to the next question.*

## **New**

1. Something that has just been made or has not been used or opened; New
2. *My mother bought me a new doll for Christmas. It was still in the package.*

## **Noise**

1. Loud sound, especially that made by music or a group of people; Noise; din.
2. *There was so much noise at the party, the neighbors called the police.*

## **This is a very important issue.**

1. Happens often; Frequently.
2. *My teacher gets mad because I often forget my homework. - My teacher gets mad because I often forget my homework.*

## **Pair**

1. 2 things or objects that go together.
2. *I like the new pair of shoes my sister bought me for my birthday.*

## **Pick**

1. Select
2. *I chose the cupcake with vanilla frosting.*

## **Play**

1. Have fun with someone or take part in an activity or sport; Play; Play
2. *I like to play football with my brother.*

## **Room**

1. A part of a house, building, office, or other structure; Room: The room.
2. The room at the end of the corridor is the coldest room in the building.

## **See**

1. See; Observe something.
2. I see clouds in the sky, which means it will rain soon.

## **Sell**

1. To offer a service or a good for a price.
2. *I am going to sell my surfboard for \$50 because it's time for a new one.*

## **Sit**

1. Lie down on the floor, chair, or other surface; Sit.
2. The teacher told the children to sit on the carpet.

## **Speak**

1. Chat: Say something.
2. Sometimes I speak too loudly.

## **Smile**

1. Smile; Smiling shows satisfaction.
2. *I smile when my brother tells jokes.*

## **Sister**

1. Older sister
2. *My parents took my sister and me to the circus.*

## **Think**

1. Think; Concentrate on doing something
2. *I think all pets should have a home.*

## **Then**

1. Afterward.
2. *I opened the refrigerator. Then, I ate some food.*

## **Walk**

1. Walk
2. *I walk home from school every day.*

## **Water**

1. Water.
2. *If animals don't have enough water to drink, they will die. - If animals don't have enough water to drink, they will die.*

## **Work**

1. Work.
2. *I work as a teacher because I like children.*

## **Write**

1. Write
2. *I have to write three essays in English class this semester.*

## **Woman**

1. Women.
2. *That woman was our new school principal.*

## **Yes**

1. Confirm or respond to someone's call.
2. *"Yes, I'm here," the student said when the teacher called her name.*
