Later, the company used that information to build the psychological profile of its users and friends and then use that data to influence the results of the referendum in the UK and the election. in the US in 2016.

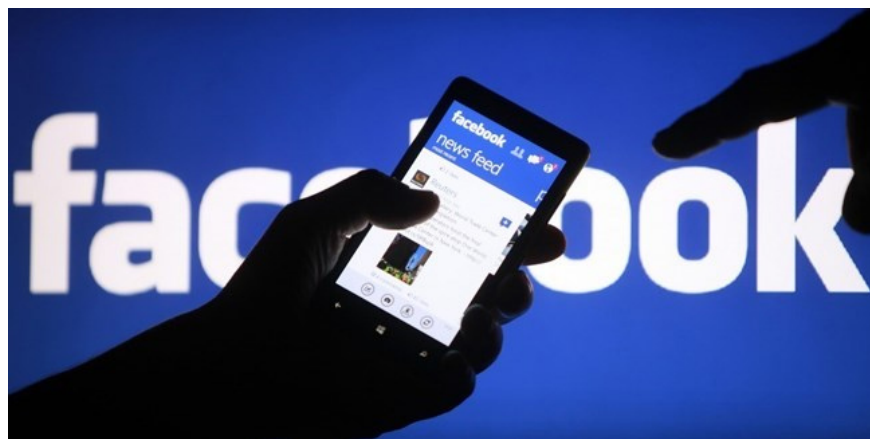


Cambridge Analytica contributed significantly to the presidential campaign of Donald Trump in 2016. (Source: Wnolondon).
