

6 Best Dropbox Alternatives

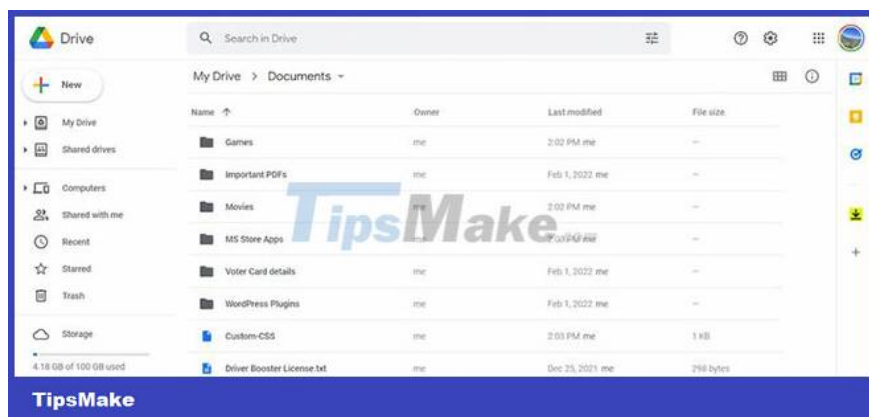
While Dropbox is a well-known name in the cloud storage space, there are plenty of great alternatives out there.

Google Drive Home

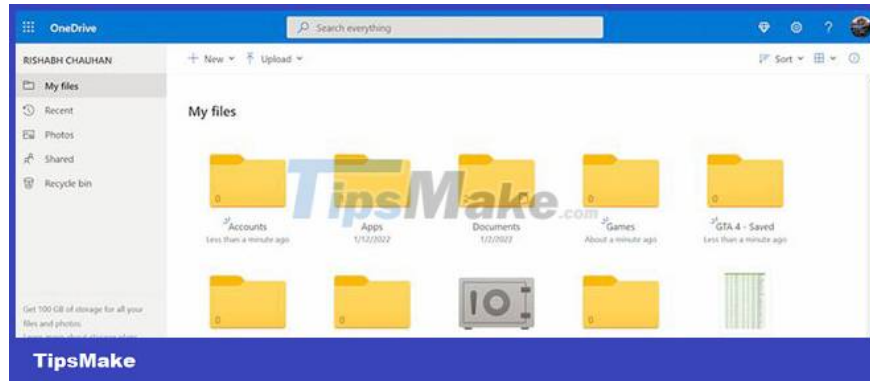
Surely you have experienced the wonders of Google Drive if you have a Gmail account. Google Drive is a full-featured solution that combines cloud storage, email, and productivity.

2. Microsoft OneDrive



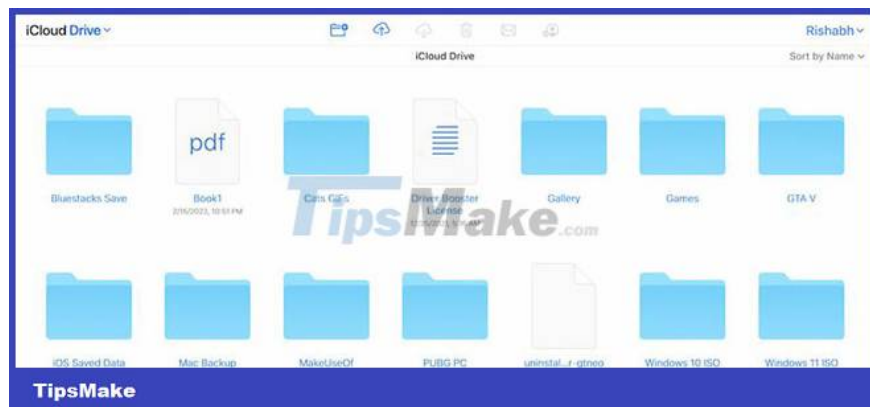
Microsoft OneDrive is a fairly popular Dropbox alternative. Chances are, if you're using this company's operating system, you already know how to use OneDrive.

4. MEGA



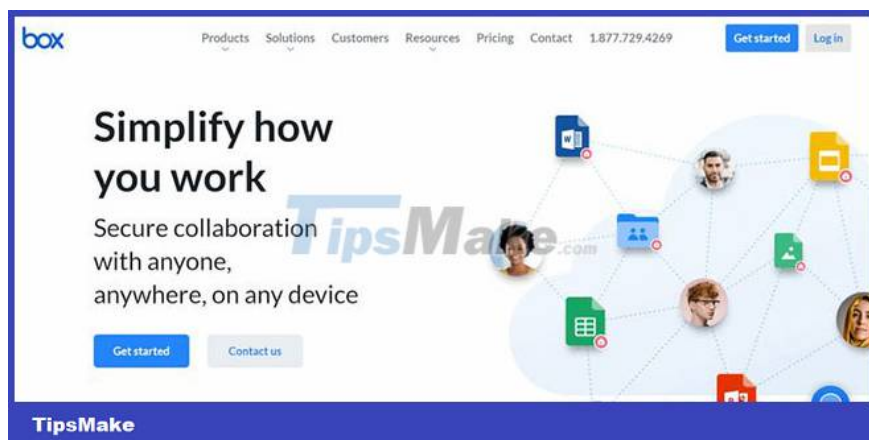

5. Box



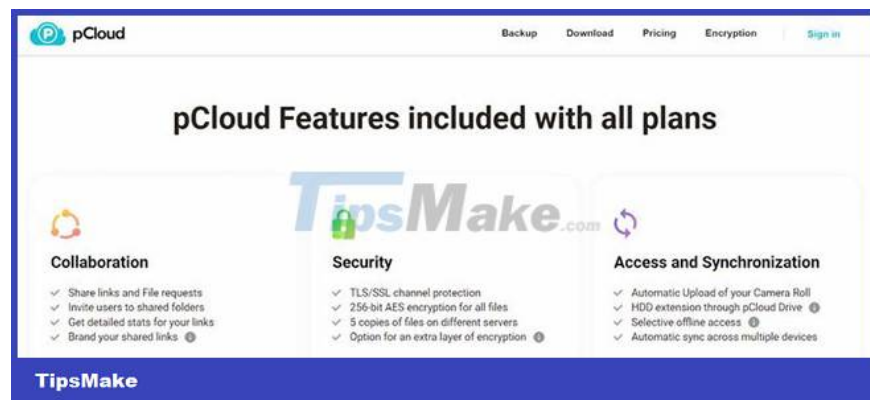

However, Box has another trump card that no other provider has. In addition to Microsoft 365 and Google Workplace, you can also create and edit Apple iWork documents.

6. pCloud



pCloud is another inexpensive Dropbox alternative. You can keep your data in pCloud for future access by uploading files via the share button on your smartphone. Compared to Dropbox, pCloud's free plan includes 10GB of storage.

As a bonus, pCloud offers new customers 5GB of additional storage when they refer a friend. Premium plans start at \$4.99/user/month. Unlike other providers where you choose to have to choose a monthly or yearly subscription, you can pay \$175 for lifetime access.

In return, your pCloud account will receive a 500GB upgrade in online storage. It also includes automatic camera upload and selectable offline access, as well as device synchronization.

Thankfully, like the other alternatives, pCloud doesn't compromise security. During and after the transfer, files stored in pCloud are protected with AES 256-bit encryption
