Use Passcode Lock feature



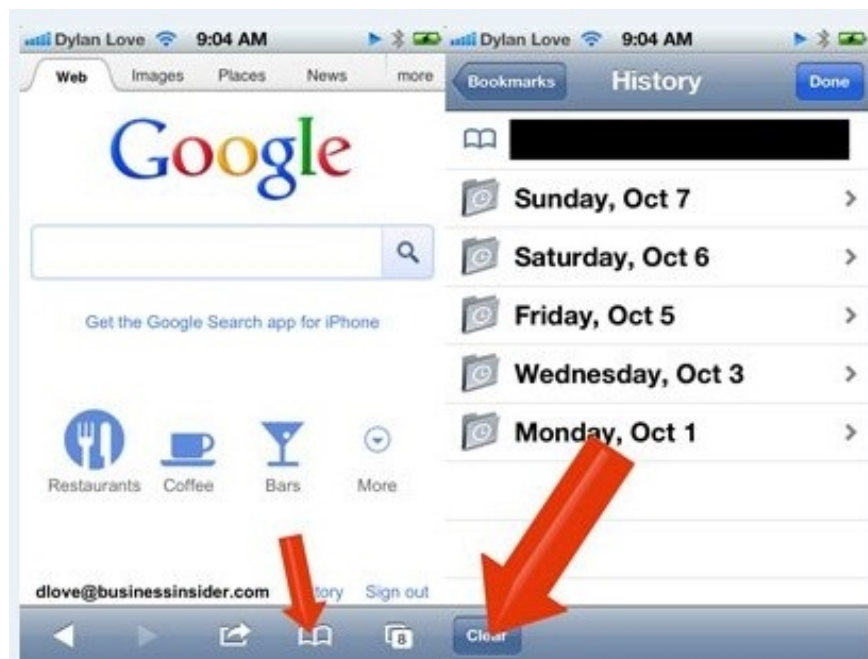
This is the simplest way for users to protect data and personal information on iPhone. To activate this feature, from the **Home** screen, go to **Settings> General> Passcode Lock** menu. Then click the **Turn Passcode On** button in the new window, then enter the 4-digit security password in the **Enter a passcode** box to apply. You can even enable the **Erase Data** option to remove all information if someone enters the wrong password 10 times.

Use a password including letters and numbers



In case you want your security password including letters and numbers that are not numbers as above, you turn the **Simple Passcode** option from **ON** to **OFF** in **Passcode Lock** menu, then press **Turn Passcode On** button. to use secure passwords including numbers and symbols. So your password will be more complex and harder to find.

Delete your browser history



If you use your phone's web browser to make commercial transactions such as important transfers, purchases, and email exchanges, when sharing your phone with someone, You need to delete your browser history inside **Safari** by clicking on the **Bookmarks** icon, navigating to the **History** section and then clicking the **Clear** button

in the bottom left corner.

Clear cookies and browser history



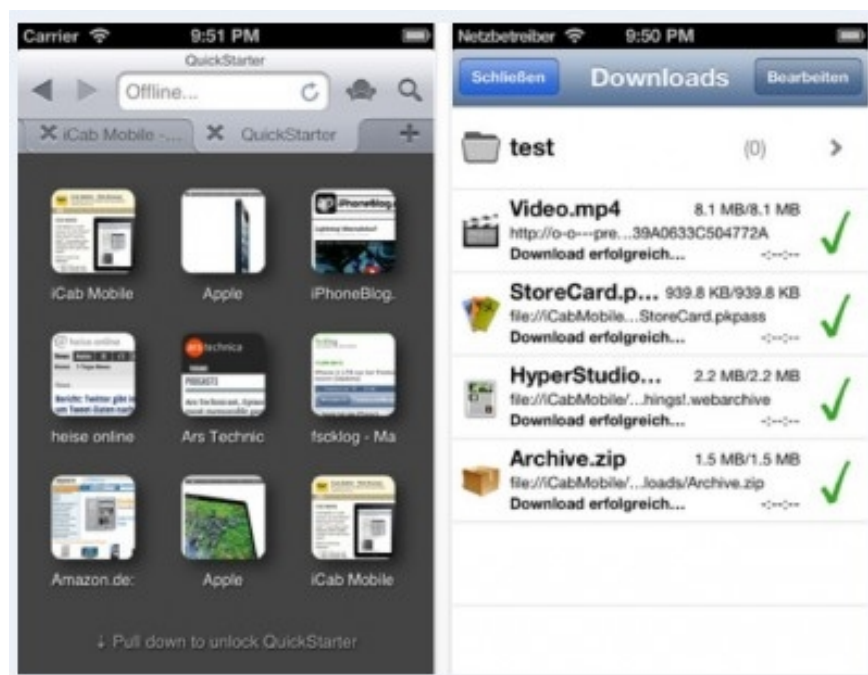
There is another way to clear your browsing history and delete all cookies and browsing data left on Safari. From the **Home** screen, go to **Settings**> **Safari** menu. Then click the **Clear History** button to delete the entire browsing history and the **Clear Cookies and Data** button just below to clear all cookies and browsing data left.

Enable private browsing



Instead of deleting browsing history, cookies and manual browsing data, you can enable Safari's private browsing (Private Browsing) feature and so Safari will not save history, search, cookies, or sample data. From the **Home** screen, go to **Settings**> **Safari** menu. Then activate the **Private Browsing** option from the **OFF** state to the **ON** state under the **Privacy** box.

Use a web browser with more privacy options than Safari



Although in Safari, you can maintain privacy when browsing the web, but if you want some more advanced options, you can use an alternative web browser, **iCab Mobile** (Web Browser), available. Download it at: <http://tinyurl.com/cgf2gy5>. With this application you can configure iCab Mobile to automatically delete history

and cookies every time you close the application, and you can even protect the entire application with a password. The version of Google Chrome browser for iPhone is also integrated with incognito mode and private browsing feature.
