## Low Disk Space Notification

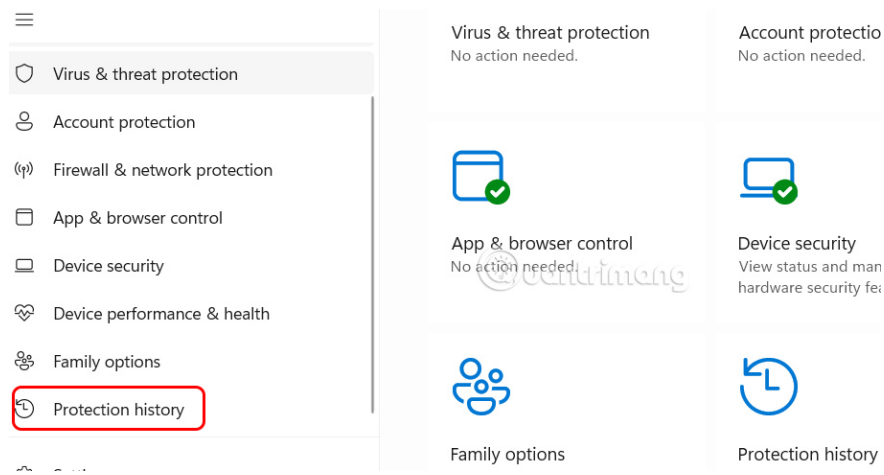
The Low Disk Space warning appears when your C drive is running out of storage space. Windows needs free space to handle tasks like saving temporary files, installing updates, and managing memory. Without enough space, your system may slow down, freeze, or even crash. Important security updates may also fail to install, compromising the security of your computer.

## Windows Defender: Threat Detected

Windows Defender displays a "Threat Detected" alert when it finds malware or potentially harmful software, such as viruses, trojans, spyware, or ransomware, on your computer.

When you see this warning, go to **Settings > Privacy & Security > Windows Security** and click **Open Windows Security** . Then, click **the Protection History tab** to see recent threats.



## Blue Screen BSOD

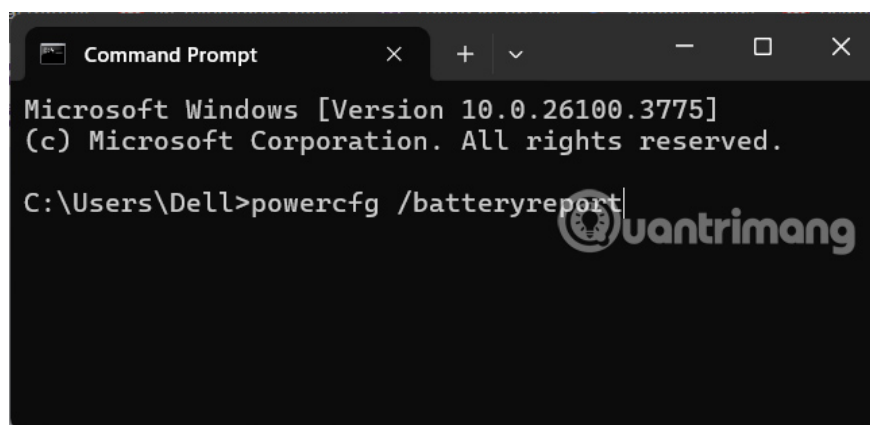
The Blue Screen of Death (BSOD) appears when Windows encounters a serious error that cannot be recovered from. If BSOD errors occur frequently, it is likely that there is a serious hardware or software problem.

## Battery warning signs

When you see a yellow warning symbol on your battery, it could be an incompatible charger or low power, a faulty or damaged battery. Sometimes, it could also be a driver issue. When you see this sign, generate a battery health report to check the health of your battery.

Open Command Prompt, run the command `powercfg /batteryreport` and view the battery report.



## Drive error message

When Windows displays the message **There's a Problem With This Drive**, there is a problem with the storage drive connected to your computer. However, this error can also be caused by a corrupted system, malware on the

drive, or a hardware problem.

When this error appears, Windows will offer to scan the drive and repair any damaged file structures. If the problem is minor, such as an incomplete write operation, then the scan will usually fix it. But if the warning persists, then you will need to back up your data and reformat the drive. Finally, if the error is not resolved, consider replacing the drive. If the problem persists, then it may be a hardware issue and you may need to replace the drive.

## Unusual login warning

When Microsoft notices a suspicious sign-in, such as from a new location, an unknown device, or after multiple failed sign-in attempts, Microsoft will send an alert via pop-up, text message, or email. Since your Microsoft account is linked to Windows and Microsoft services like OneDrive, Outlook, and more, it's important to double-check the sign-in device to keep your account secure.
