

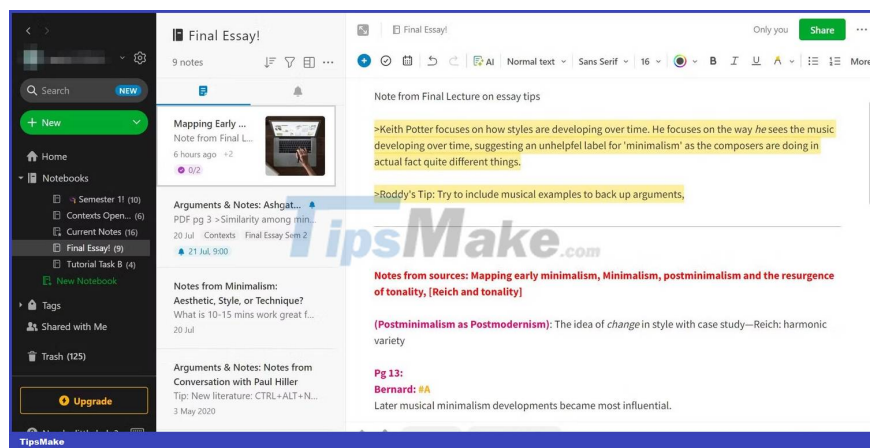
# 7 best note-taking apps for students

## 1. Evernote

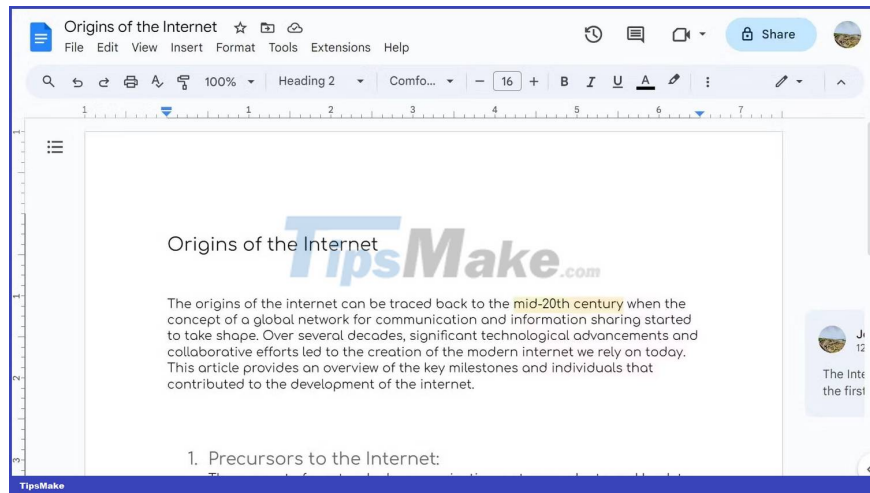

## 2. Google Docs

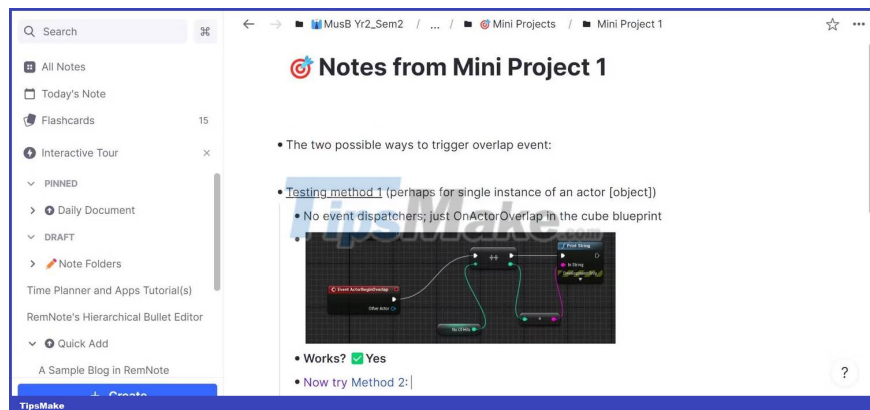

### 3. RemNote



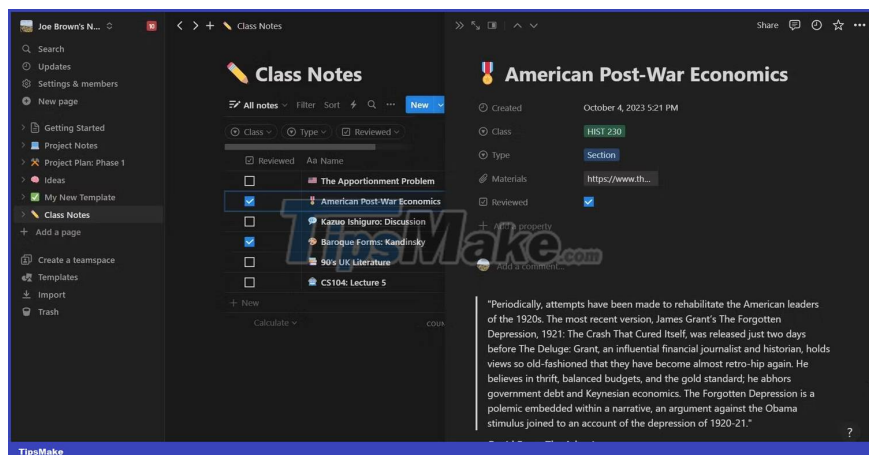
RemNote offers a great selection of tools to increase your productivity as a student. Its unique note-taking approach allows you to link ideas together in a tree-like hierarchy.

## 4. Notion

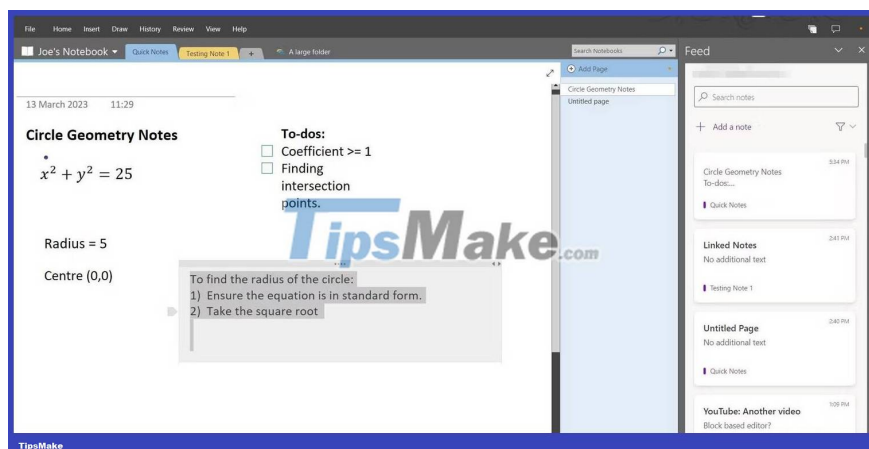

## 5. Microsoft OneNote

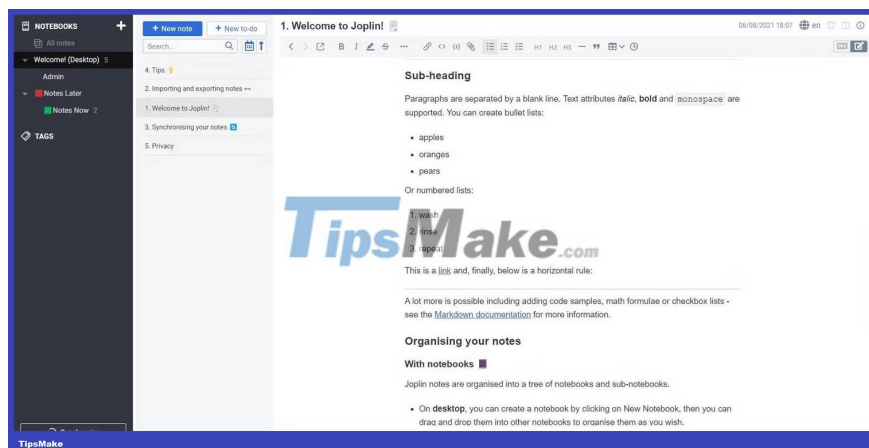

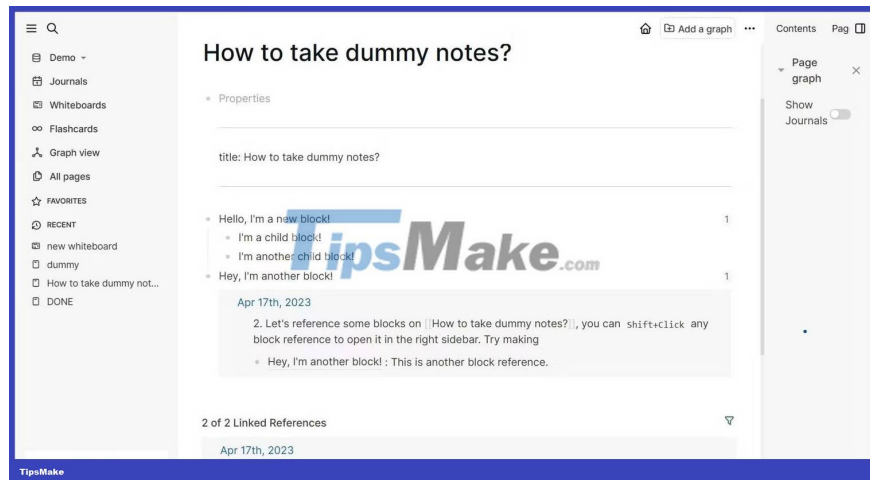
## 6. Joplin



Joplin is a distraction-free note-taking app for Windows and Mac, ideal for focusing on studying. Notes are categorized on the sidebar in a tree structure. There's no limit to the number of folders you can create and nest, which makes Joplin ideal for heavy use.

This application offers a variety of note-taking tools for students found on the formatting ribbon. You can insert quotes, add links to web pages and attach PDF files. If you're learning programming, you can insert code blocks. Joplin also supports Markdown. You can easily switch between Markdown view and the standard editor with the click of a button.

## 7. Logseq



If you're looking for a note-taking app that offers more than just a simple text editor, Logseq is a top choice to consider. This app has a daily journal page, whiteboard tool, and flashcards, making it a great choice for students.

Whiteboard tool helps add diagrams to your study notes. The tool offers basic capabilities for adding shapes and text, but perhaps most impressive is the ability to add existing pages to a whiteboard. Using a whiteboard, you can attach class notes and edit them while creating sketches.

Logseq relies on two-way links to link notes. Although it may seem complicated at first, all that is needed is one command to link two pages together. You can easily navigate to the linked page by clicking on the link. This way, you can make connections between topics as you study.
