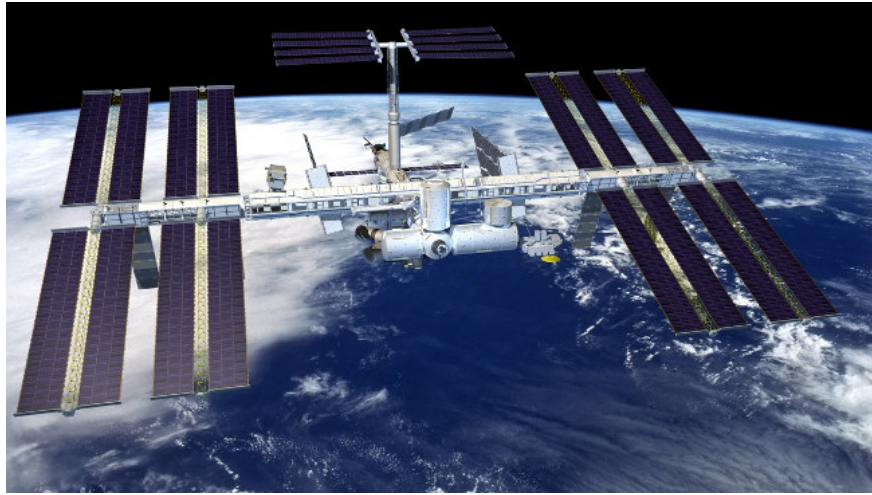
In 1958, after the US Congress passed the National Aeronautics and Space Act, the US Aeronautics and Space Administration was established, the full English name is the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, abbreviated to NASA.



NASA was founded with the aim of studying all aeronautical problems including flights in and out of the Earth's atmosphere, while ensuring that US space activities would benefit and peace for humanity.

So far, NASA has been in operation for nearly 60 years and has achieved many world-recognized achievements:

1. 1969: Taking the first human to set foot on the Moon.
2. 1981 - 2011: Shuttle program.
3. 1997: Cassini spacecraft launches to study Saturn.
4. 1993 - present: International Space Station (ISS) is a joint program of NASA's Freedom Space Station project with the Soviet / Russian Mir-2 station, ESA's Columbus station, and Kib?'s lab module. Japan.
5. 2010 - present: The program flies out of low orbit around the Earth. NASA deployed the Space Launch System (SLS), a Saturn-V class missile, and the space ship Orion capable of carrying two to six astronauts flying out of low orbit.
6. Launching unmanned spacecraft with cooperation and participation of private companies.

1. Insurance for astronauts

NASA cannot register life insurance for Apollo astronauts due to government regulations.

Life magazine agreed to pay \$ 100,000 for every Apollo astronaut in exchange for the right to post their personal stories. This contract lasts until the Apollo 11 mission.

2. Earth's "Song"

In 2012, NASA released a recording of the "song" about Earth with sound as a series of radio waves. This "song" was discovered by a NASA spacecraft as it flew through **the Earth's Van Allen radiation belt** .

3. Does Neil Armstrong go "back door"?



Neil Armstrong was the first astronaut to set foot on the Moon.

Neil Armstrong, the first person on Earth and also the first American astronaut to set foot on the Moon on July 20, 1969.

Many people believe that Neil Armstrong applied for a two-week delay as an astronaut and was helped by a friend at NASA by inserting his application into the currently pending application. NASA has not given any comment on this incident.

4. The owner of Super Soaker water gun

Super Soaker, a super-powerful water gun, is among the world's top 20 best-selling toys invented by Lonnie Johnson.

Lonnie Johnson was a scientist at NASA, helping develop the US Air Force stealth bomber.

5. Where is the giant rocket of NASA assembled?



US missiles are housed in the Vehicle Assembly Building (VAB), the largest one-story building in the world with an area of up to 32,374 m², volume of 3.66 million cubic meters, height of 160m.

This building, built in 1966, has 4 doors of 139m high and has separate weather.

Even on wet days there are rain clouds forming under the ceiling. It was installed with 10,000 tons of air conditioning equipment including 125 roof fans to control humidity in the building.

6. Great rewards for astronauts

In the 1960s, NASA astronauts were given two new cars each year. This is the idea of Jim Rathmann, owner of car dealership Chevrolet and Cadillac in Florida, USA.

Neil Armstrong was awarded a Chevy Corvette for his great efforts and contributions to space exploration.

7. Sculptures are left on the Moon



In 1971, Apollo 15 astronauts secretly left an art sculpture on the Moon, used to commemorate all astronauts and astronauts who had died during the journey. space exploration.

The senior manager of the Apollo 15 mission didn't know anything about it until it stayed on the Moon.
