

7 Reasons Copilot is Worth Using

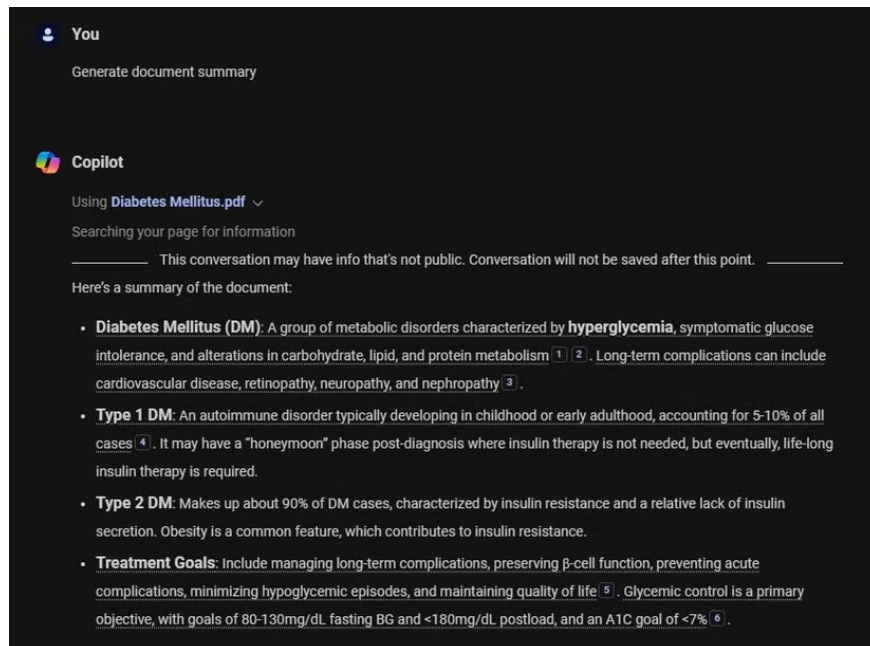

7. Powerful image and PDF reading capabilities

In my personal experience, Copilot is better than ChatGPT at reading images and PDFs. This opinion remains unchanged despite the significant upgrades to GPT-4o.

When you upload a PDF or image to Copilot, it doesn't take long to figure out what's going on. The software's descriptions are usually accurate, too.



ChatGPT is still better for deeper inference, such as using reverse image search. However, for general PDF and image reading, Copilot is a great choice.

6. Copilot Labs

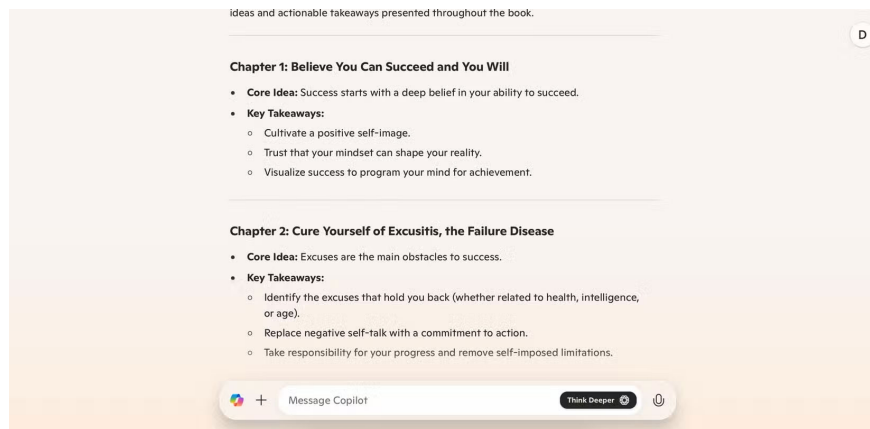
Copilot Labs is a collection of cool features that make your experience much more enjoyable. For example, you can use Copilot Podcasts to create podcasts about topics that interest you. If you're having trouble finding something to listen to on Spotify or Apple Podcasts, this is a worthwhile alternative.

You'll also find Copilot Vision in the **Labs** section, and it's also available in Edge, as well as Windows if you have the free plan. Using Copilot Vision, you can ask the software to make recommendations for a variety of tasks, such as photo editing.

Copilot Labs also has other features, such as Gaming Experiences.

5. Cleaner interface than ChatGPT

One of the biggest reasons to use Microsoft Copilot is that its interface is easier to navigate than ChatGPT. It's less cluttered and the overall user experience is good, even in longer chats.

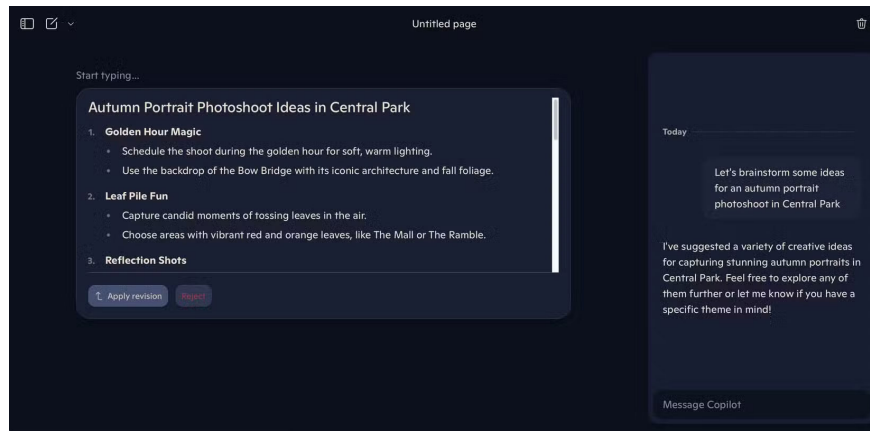


Copilot's contrasting colors make it easier to find conversations and navigate the app, and its daily chat categories are better than ChatGPT's. You can skip specific days when you last visited a chat.

While Copilot could use a few more features, it's nice that you can easily navigate around the app.

4. Pages feature

While casual discussions can get you the basics, sometimes you'll want to dig deeper. AI tools are great for generating ideas, and Copilot's Pages feature is the perfect place to do it.

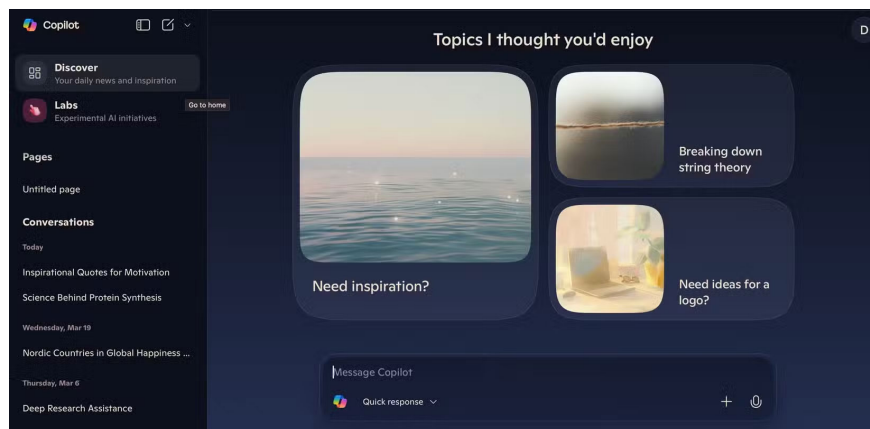


To use Pages, you'll first enter your prompt. Once you're done, Copilot will give you feedback. You can decide on the right side whether you want to apply or reject the revision, giving you complete control over your drawing.

You can use Pages for brainstorming, editing, and a number of other tasks. Consider using it alongside some of Copilot's lesser-known features .

3. Suggested topics

AI chatbots can be great tools to help you brainstorm when you're feeling uninspired. But even opening one of these apps can leave you stumped on thoughts and topics. However, Copilot has a feature that can help; **Topics I thought you'd enjoy** .

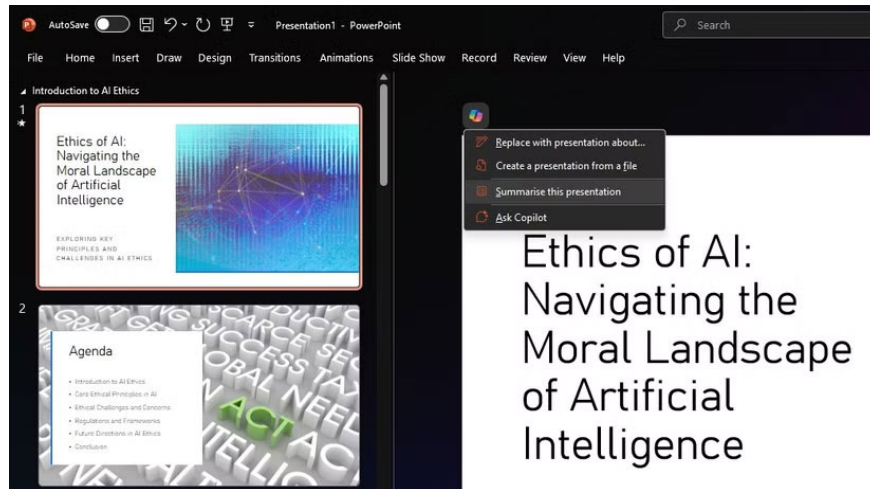


In this section, you'll find a few topics that the app thinks you'll want to explore further. There's also a **Need inspiration?** section if you're still completely out of ideas.

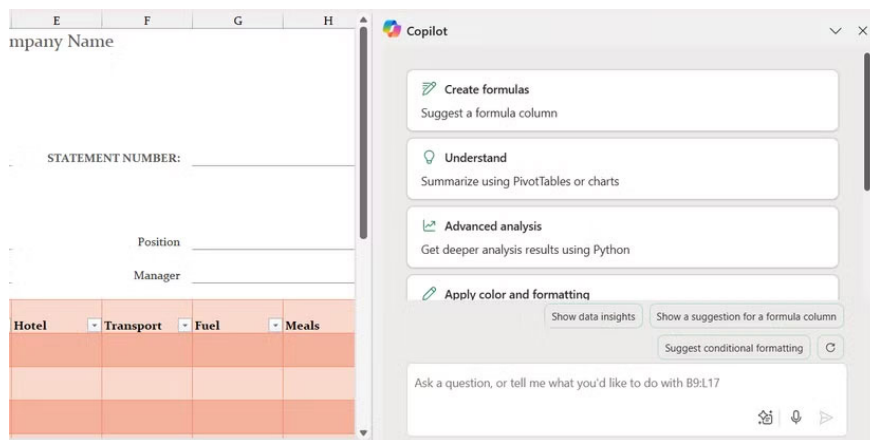

2. Integration with Microsoft applications

One of the biggest advantages of Copilot over ChatGPT is its great integration with other Microsoft apps. It works well across the entire Microsoft 365 suite, including Word and PowerPoint. You can easily use Copilot in PowerPoint to complete any presentation, whether you need to present something for school or work.



Copilot also integrates well with Excel. You can use it to create formulas, which is great if you have little manual experience. Plus, Copilot can drill down into your data. If you're thinking about making the switch from Google Sheets to Excel, Copilot might be enough to justify your choice.



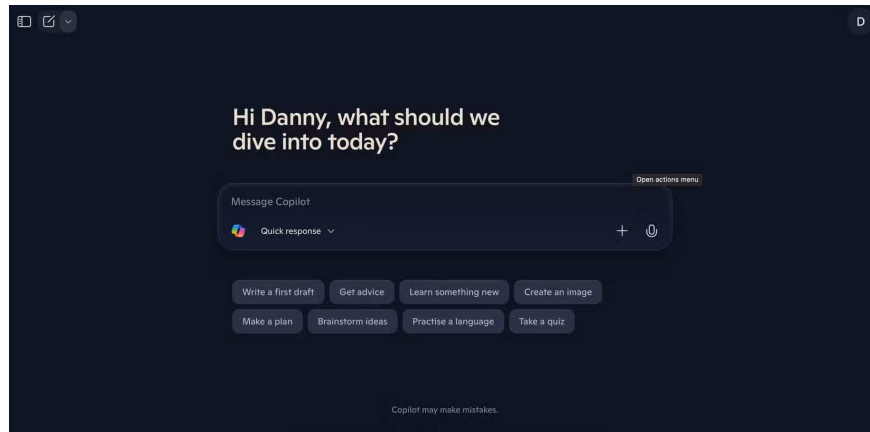
If you use Outlook, you can also use Copilot to improve your in-app experience. For example, it can generate short email summaries, allowing you to quickly understand what someone has sent you.

1. Better initial prompt suggestion

While many people thought ChatGPT did a better job of providing more detailed feedback, they weren't the biggest fans of its prompt suggestions. They were often quite vague and many people definitely wouldn't look to them for inspiration.

Copilot, on the other hand, has much better initial prompts. Once you start a new conversation, you'll see several initial prompts. For example, the software will ask if you want to brainstorm ideas or take a quiz. From these,

you can then branch off in any direction you want.



Another advantage is that Copilot provides helpful follow-up prompts. In this sense, it works similarly to Perplexity. ChatGPT asks more follow-up questions now, but sometimes having a prompt available is nice.

Copilot has a lot of useful features that are still worth using, like being able to focus more with Pages. Meanwhile, having suggested topics can make research easier—along with the potential to pique your curiosity even further.
