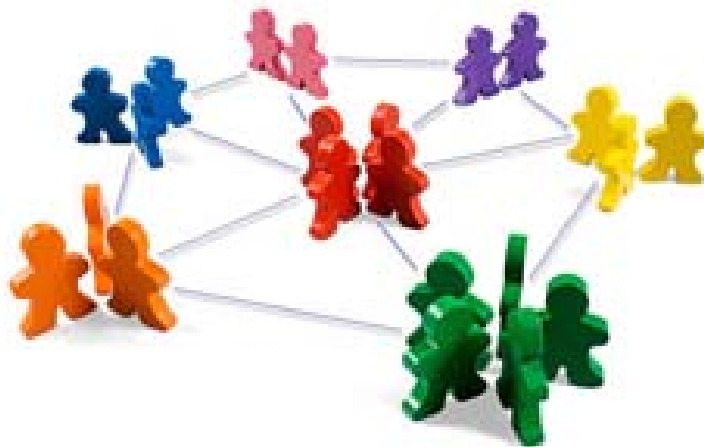


7 tools to better manage social networks

If you are determined to make your social networking sites more organized, refer to the 7 tools we introduced in this article.



Network administration - When you become a member of several social networking sites - such as Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter - catching up with them can be a pain. *Tweet this, upgrade the status , or share the link here.* If you are determined to make your social networking sites more organized, refer to the 7 tools we introduced in this article.

1. 8Hands. The desktop application allows organizing profiles on social networking sites you join (such as Facebook, WordPress, Flickr, Twitter and YouTube) into one location. It will send you notifications when you receive new comments, messages, friend requests or videos; create summaries and statistics about your social network actions; especially a chat window, where you can drag and drop YouTube videos or Flickr photos to share with others.

2. Atomkeep. This service allows you to import, synchronize and merge your profile data from social networking sites like LinkedIn, Facebook, Twitter, Yelp, Digg and Plurk. It also makes it easy to upgrade items - such as email addresses - in these social networking platforms: Upgrade certain Atomkeep profile fields (instead of having to visit each site one way). Sporadic) and push it to all or select sites.

3. FriendBinder. FriendBinder will consolidate your existing friends list from different networks and display them in a general flow of information. It will sort your direct messages and Twitter mentions, show when someone *likes* a photo of you on Flickr or invite you to attend an event on Facebook. FriendBinder also displays topics in the direction and Twitter conversations, making them easier to understand.

4. FriendFeed. This tool displays a real-time and personalized feed of what your friends are sharing on different social networks. You can *comment* or ' *like* ' items that appear in your feed, have real-time conversations with your friends about posts. You can also choose from a list of about 50 pages that you can subscribe to and share items with your friends.

5. Ping.fm. Basically, a site will allow you to upgrade multiple states simultaneously, Ping.fm will group services into three categories - status updates, blogs and microblogs. You can configure your account to gather content from several services, such as Delicious, Facebook, Laconica, LinkedIn, Twitter and WordPress.

6. Pond. The Pond publishing and publishing tool allows you to keep up with friends, select information about them and share content. Pond also allows you to integrate your friends' online identities - such as if someone (out of your friends) is a member on Twitter, Facebook and Flickr, then you can see updates from These services follow an integrated timeline. Pond also allows you to publish information to multiple sites with an upgrade.

7. Shareaholic. Shareaholic is a customizable browser add-on that allows you to share content with about 60 other social networks. By clicking on the Shareaholic icon, you can share the fashion you are currently accessing (it will shorten the link for you automatically). In addition Shareaholic also displays topics in real time, allowing you to find the latest news, videos and blogs.
