

# 7 tools which will raise your poker game to the next level

Year on year, poker tournaments are getting more and more difficult. For serious tournament players to stay ahead of the curve, they must continuously analyse and improve their strategy, or simply face being left behind.

Not everyone can afford a designated poker coach, so one way this can be achieved is by using various poker tools. There are hundreds available, so knowing which one is right for you can be difficult.

## Types of Poker Tools and Software

Here are some of the best poker tools and software on the market that can help you improve your gameplay and win more often.

### 1. Trackers

Trackers help you gather all the necessary information on your opponent, so you're in with a better chance of beating them. They range in price from being totally free to professional tools that can cost a significant amount of money.

If you're a high stakes player, there are some specific features you should look out for.

Firstly, quick import speed is essential, allowing you to go through more hands per second and switch between tables more quickly.

Dynamic Huds are also useful as they display various useful stats on other players. Such as showdowns and the number of different bets per street.

Several Poker Hud technologies feature a colour coding system, allowing mistakes to be spotted immediately. Pop-Ups also highlight areas where mistakes are made, and various other stats are also visible.

Many are available on the market, at a reasonable price. Brand names to look out for include Notecaddy Edge, Time Mojo and Table Ninja. All of which are packed with useful features.

### 2. Calculators

This kind of tool is beneficial for both experienced and rookie poker players. The poker odds calculator enables players to gauge how far ahead or behind the competition they are, through displaying the odds in any given situation.

Equilab and Flopzilla are other useful calculators on the market at the moment.

If you're a fan of Hold'Em, you'll want to look at Oranges calculator. At \$15, it is very affordable, and you won't be disappointed with what it offers.

Other calculators you might want to look at are ICMIZER and StarsHelper.

ICMIZER is possibly the best solution for MTTs and SNGs.

It features an advanced calculator to make the best preflop decisions at later stages. It also simulates how players could play in different situations, like the right time to push or fold.

StarsHelper is best when playing multiple limits at once. All values on the table are converted to a big blinds count.

It indicates stack sizes and total count, allowing players to bet without actually seeing money on the table.

### 3. GTO Simulators

Be aware that GTO simulators use a lot of time and computing resources, as their maths are complicated. Players also need to invest time in understanding the simulations.

For beginners, Simple Postflop might be the best choice as it's quite basic.

Operating in the cloud, it offers players calculations for equilibrium strategies on both turns and rivers. Mapping strategies are displayed in a calculation tree, and all potential or significant flops are considered.

Other GTO simulators to consider, include Simple GTP Trainer, PokerSnowie and ProSOLVER.

Simple GTP Trainer is a standalone trainer which can analyse pretty much any situation.

Time can be saved thanks to the packers available, which have pre-calculated games and situations. Users can train and conveniently learn strategies as the platform is packed with loads of tools to help advance your game.

## Other Tools to Consider to Improve Your Poker Game

4. **Player Stat Services.** Sometimes when playing, you may find that you're playing against an opponent who has no information in the tracker software you're using. Thankfully, stats services are available, which provide the information you need to make the best decision possible. Statname is perhaps one of the best and is totally free. It's quick, available in multiple languages and very easy to use.

5. As you use different poker clients, you'll realise that most are far from perfect. Software exists, enabling players to change the experience of the game, and the table's appearance. You'll find that the type of software being used will vary by room, so the user experience is usually very different between sites.

6. **Table Scanners.** Table scanners allow players to find tables where weak players exist. Remember, though that many rooms restrict these apps. Luckily, Smart Table Scanner exists to solve this issue. All tables can be checked with the 'hand history', allowing you to discover the weakest lineups and play against fishes.

7. They serve a basic purpose: to manage player time, increase blind levels and cover all different scenarios. They work great on iOS and Android, taking away the confusion surrounding missed increases of blinds or the tournament stage. In other words, everything is managed effectively without causing the player to struggle.
