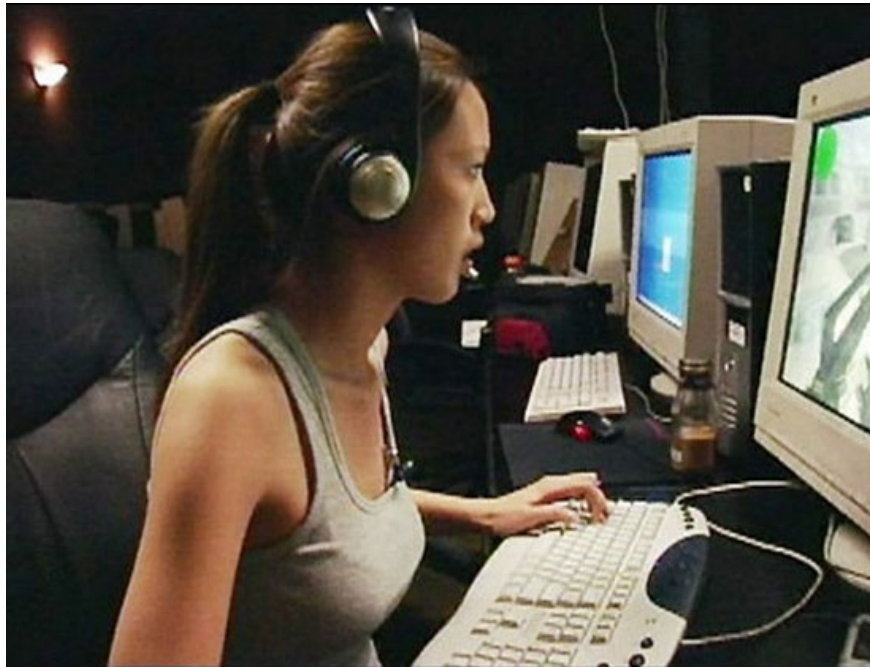
3. Macs are more expensive

In addition, there are also super-expensive MacBooks like the MacBook Pro Retina screen, with a starting price of \$ 2,200.

It is the highly customizable ability that helps Windows computers win gamers. You can increase your computer's performance with better graphics cards, or add more memory to large-scale games.

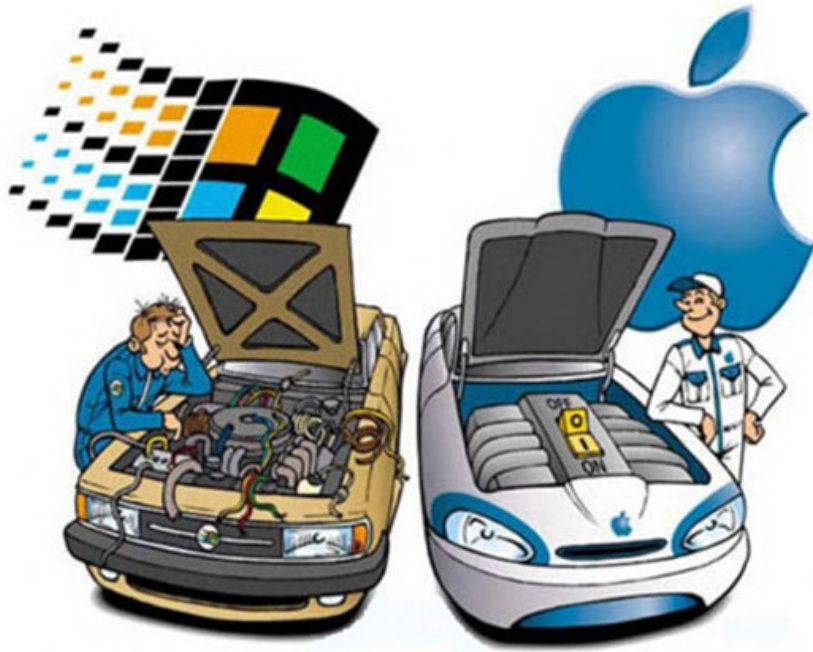
Mac computers often cannot compete with Windows PCs on games unless you are willing to spend huge amounts of money.

LuckyCat takes advantage of a flaw in Microsoft Word documents, allowing an attacker to remotely access a computer that has been infected and stolen data manually.

Apple's recently launched operating system, Mountain Lion, has increased some security features. However, it is certain that this operating system will increasingly attract hackers.

8. Windows PC has more hardware options

There are many different PC manufacturers, offering customers a wide range of options.

While Microsoft only developed software, companies such as HP, Acer, Lenovo, Dell and many others produced hardware. This creates diversity that can meet the needs of many customers with different pockets and interests.
