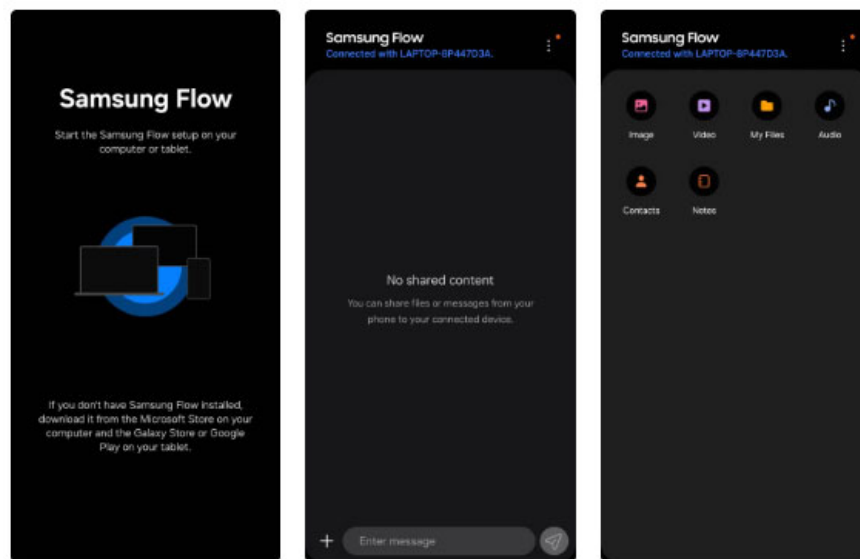


8 Useful Samsung Apps That Don't Come Pre-Installed on Galaxy Phones

8. Samsung Flow



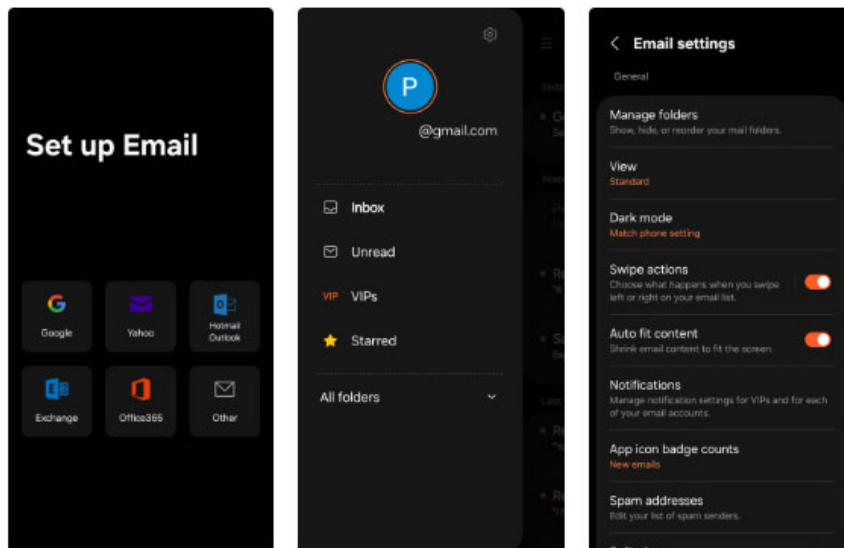

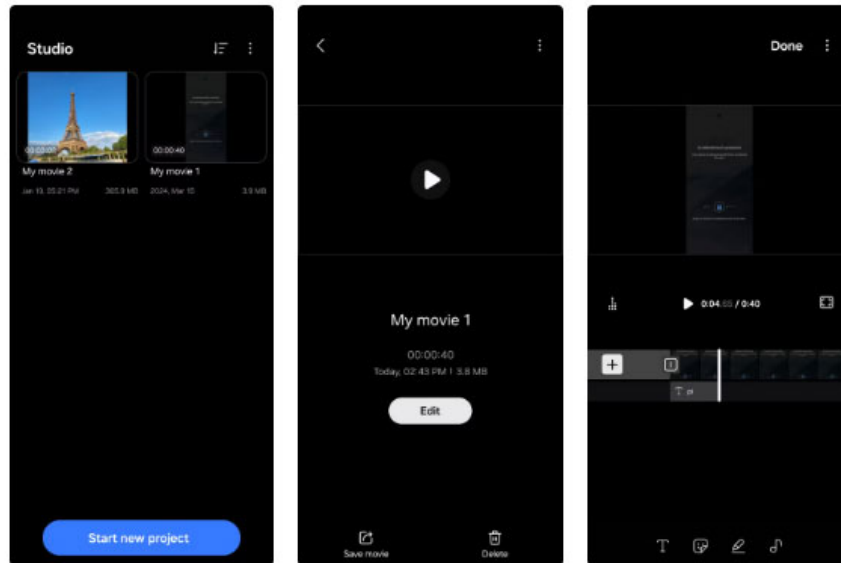

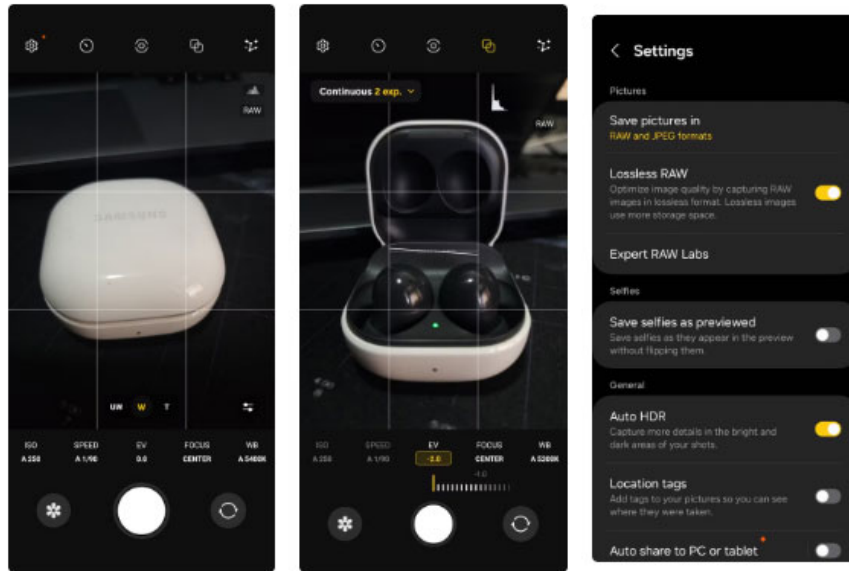

You can add, combine, or rearrange multiple clips, apply effects or text to each segment, and insert smooth transitions between scenes. Samsung Studio also has all the essential editing tools available in the Gallery app.

Samsung Studio is ideal for anyone who wants to create vlogs, Instagram Reels, or fun family videos – straight from their phone without having to transfer to a computer.

5. Expert RAW



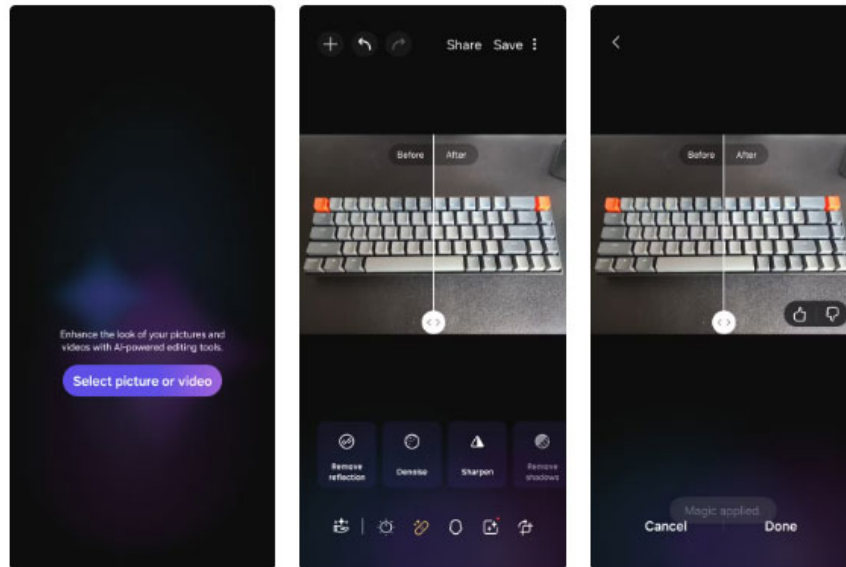
The Camera app on Samsung phones offers some useful features like scene suggestions, a built-in GIF recorder, adding watermarks, and more. But if you have a high-end Galaxy device and know your way around manual camera settings, Samsung's Expert RAW app is a must-have.

One of the biggest advantages of using Expert RAW over the default Camera app is image quality. Unlike JPEG, which compresses images to reduce file size, RAW files retain the original, uncompressed data captured by the camera sensor. This gives you much more flexibility and detail when editing your photos in post-production.

Expert RAW also supports advanced features like multiple exposure photography and astrophotography. For enthusiasts who want full control over ISO, shutter speed, and white balance, this app can turn your Galaxy phone into a professional photography tool.

4. Galaxy Enhance-X



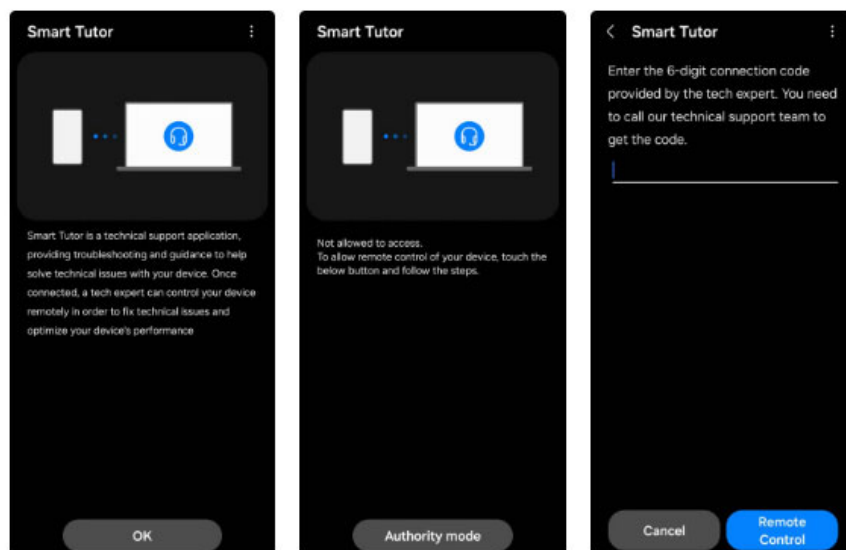

For those who prefer manual control, Enhance-X also allows for manual adjustments, so you can tweak the blur, noise level, and sharpness to your liking.

Galaxy Enhance-X also supports short videos. Single Take analyzes 10-second videos and uses AI to create the best stills, boomerangs, filtered photos, and slow-motion videos. Meanwhile, Long Exposure mode can add a smooth, dreamy motion blur effect that looks like it was shot with a DSLR camera.

3. Smart Tutor

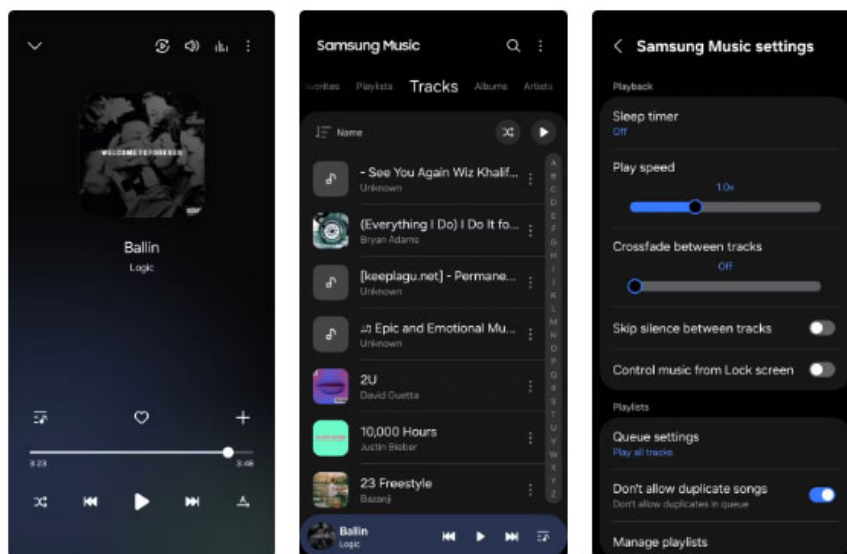
When you contact Samsung Technical Support, the Smart Tutor app can allow them to diagnose and fix your phone remotely. It's not pre-installed on Galaxy devices (because most users probably never need it), but it can save you hours of frustration when dealing with technical issues.

While the idea of remote access may seem invasive, Samsung designed the app with privacy in mind. After setting up the Smart Tutor app, you'll need to provide a unique code to Samsung's technical support team.

Even if they gain remote access to your device, you have the option to block access to sensitive apps like Messages, Photos, or banking tools. Plus, you can end the session at any time. This is especially useful for non-tech-savvy users or anyone who is tired of calling customer service over and over again.

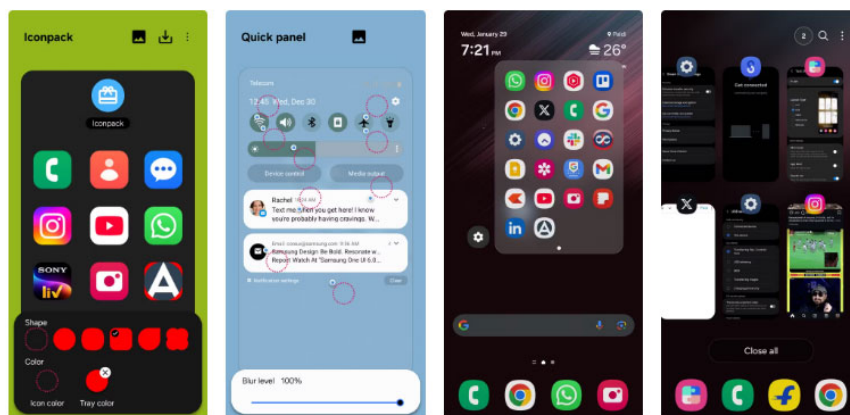
