Therefore, today's article has selected some of the best drawing apps for Windows 10 so you know exactly what you need. See what each app offers and which one best suits your needs.

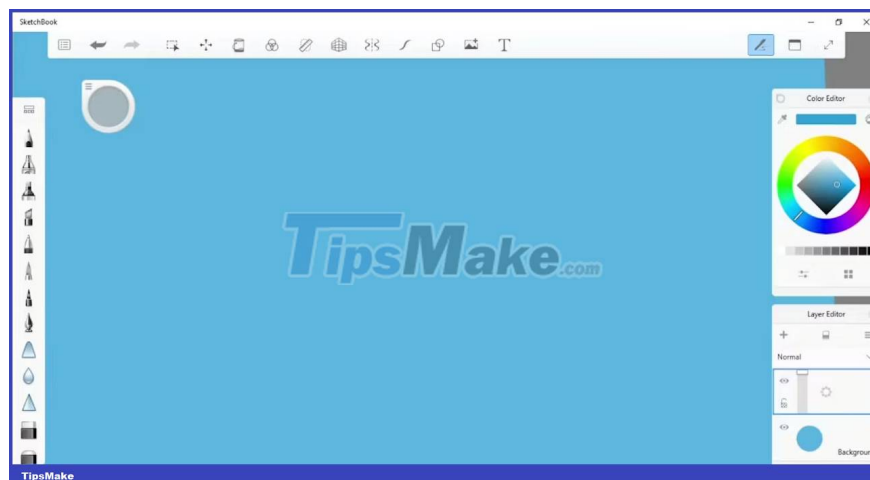
1. Krita

Whether you are a professional painter or an amateur, Krita is the software to choose if you do not want to spend money buying drawing tools. The program supports flexibility in the creative process, that's why it offers a flexible interface and custom panels that you can set up to your liking.

The stabilization tool helps keep the lines smooth, and to change the style of your sketches, you can import free brush packs from the Krita community and combine the tools you have at your disposal. Who knows, you might even find textures and patterns that suit you perfectly.

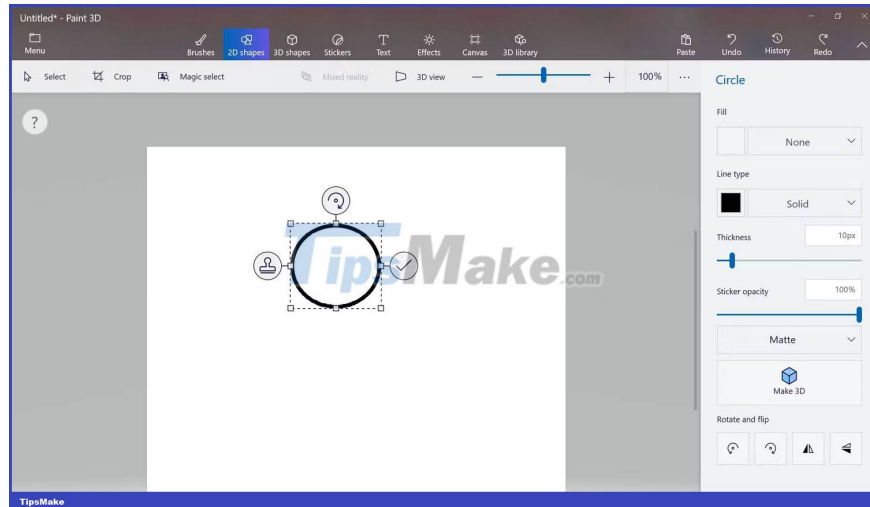
2. Autodesk Sketchbook Pro



Thanks to professional-grade drawing tools and interfaces, Autodesk Sketchbook Pro has become quite a popular drawing software for artists, designers and even architects. The app includes over 190 brushes that you can customize based on your preferences.

In the beautiful application interface, you can toggle the palettes and toolbars on and off to minimize distractions and focus on your work. Besides these features, you can experiment with blend modes and explore a vast palette of colors. Furthermore, Sketchbook supports a wide variety of formats, from PNG to PSD.

3. Paint 3D

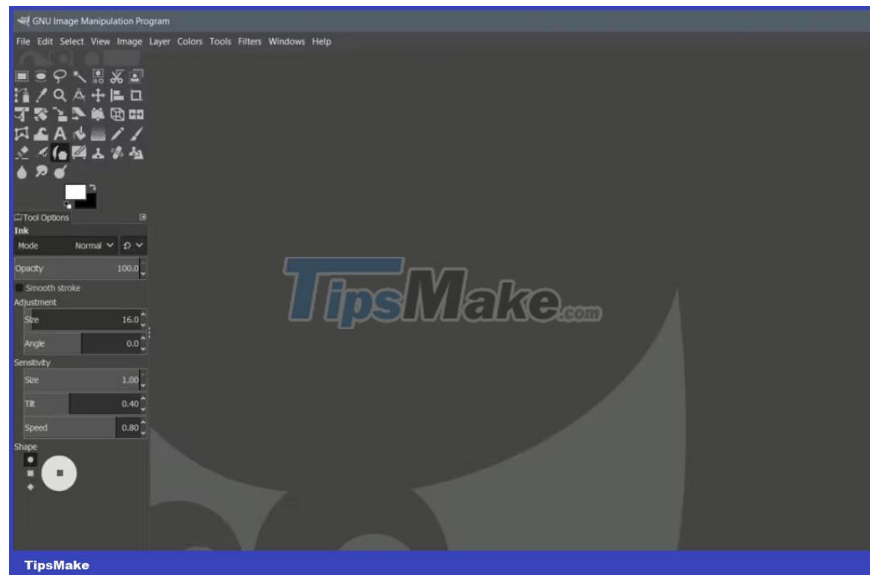


Paint 3D is a new version of MS Paint that can create 2D or 3D objects regardless of the user's skill level. There are already models available to use, and you can also create your own if you're creative enough.

Paint 3D offers realistic textures and filters that you can incorporate into your illustrations to give them life. You can even turn your doodles into 3D drawings using the tools available in the app.

One of the best features of Paint 3D is the resizable canvas. It allows you to resize an existing window instead of opening a new one. Finally, since it's a built-in Windows app, it's completely free.

4. GIMP



Photoshop and GIMP are quite similar. Most of their features are best for editing, but you can also use it as your main drawing and illustration tool. GIMP allows you to create beautiful artwork with unlimited textures and brushes, customizable to fit your taste.

GIMP offers a variety of tools for editing images. Last but not least, you can easily enhance your artwork by adding third-party plugins to GIMP. GIMP is a free image editing software, which is a huge plus.

5. Sketchable

Sketchable serves as a two-in-one illustration and journaling app. You can scribble a note or draw a masterpiece, depending on your creativity. For artists to focus on their work without distractions, Sketchable features an intuitive user interface.

You can plan magazine covers, font types, resolutions, etc. in Sketchable. By using the Journal file format, you can easily export and share your journal with others. Furthermore, this tool allows creators to improvise brush stabilization tools and use symmetry.

Sketchable is a free tool that you can download from the Windows Store for basic sketching.

6. Paintstorm Studio

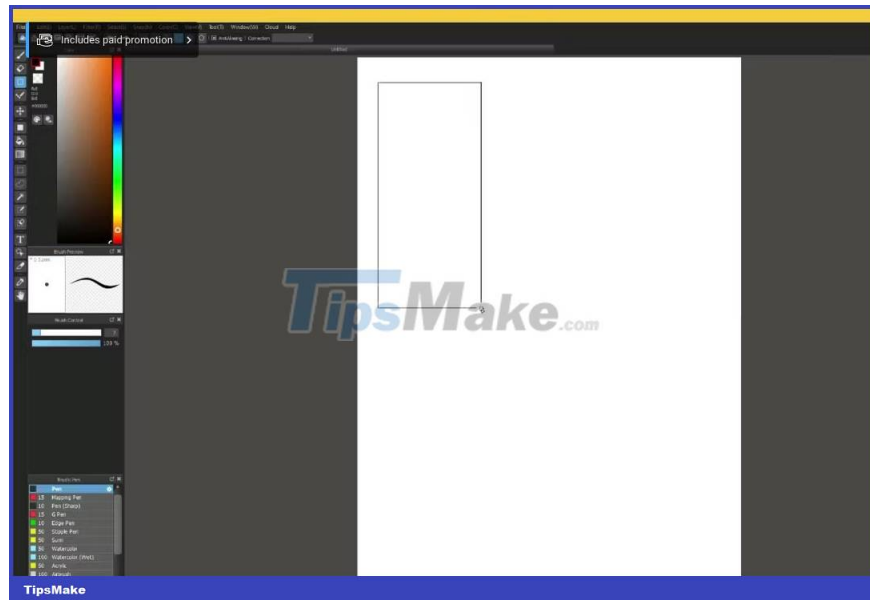
Paintstorm Studio is a beginner-friendly drawing software with lots of brushes, canvas and color wheel. Canvas is high resolution, with options for a variety of sizes, from millimeters to inches.

The wide range of tools in Paintstorm Studio are designed for different types of artwork, such as contemporary artwork, traditional portraits, or a comic strip.

The software has a wide selection of brushes, stable tools and a clean interface with customizable panels for easy illustration. Paintstorm Studio is one of the best drawing apps; however, keep in mind that Windows versions often tend to be 'strange'.

Paintstorm Studio offers a free trial for 30 launches, after which you will have to pay.

7. Mediabang Paint



Mediabang is another great option for those interested in comics and illustration. Preloaded with over 50 brushes, you can customize them to your liking. Comic artists can be as creative as they want by providing a number of free fonts, 800 pre-made tones and backgrounds, and easy collaboration with the team.

Plus, the software is cloud-compatible, meaning you can access your drawings from any device that's synced with the same account. Plus, compatibility with iPhone, Android, and Mac makes Mediabang Paint perfect for syncing with almost any device you own.

Also, it's free to use and unlike Paintstorm Studio, it's super lightweight and won't slow down your computer. Mediabang should be the right choice regardless of your level of expertise

8. Inkscape

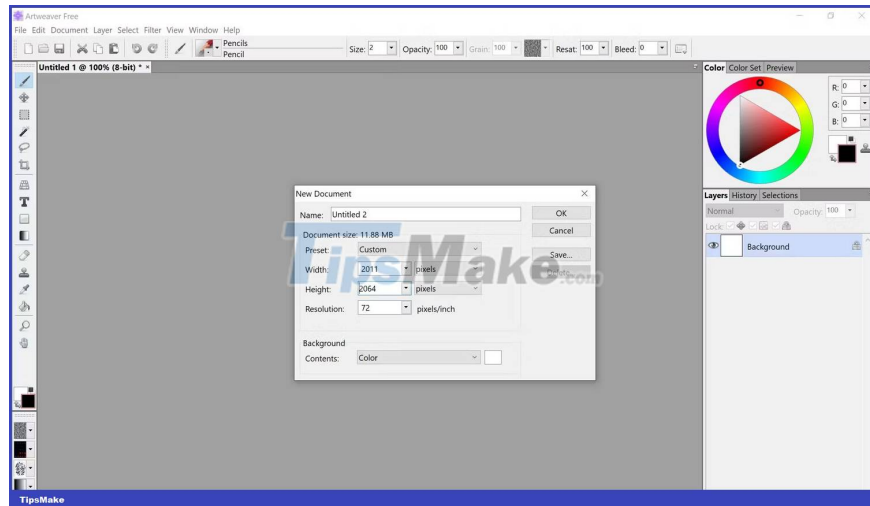
Inkscape is a great choice for those who want to try out the advanced drawing features for free. The tool boasts an intuitive interface, supports multiple sizes, and allows you to export your works to a variety of formats. Whether you are a designer or a novice, you will find it equally useful.

In Inkscape, you can sketch your ideas using the following features:

1. Pencils, pens and calligraphy tools to draw objects from scratch.
2. Pre-added shapes and options for adding text and copy make drawing a breeze.
3. Customizable layering, adjustment, and grouping options are available to transform created objects.
4. Several coloring tools to change the look of your drawing.
5. Control trajectories and alignments through the use of calibration tools.

6. Support to incorporate text into the design as needed.

9. Artweaver 7



Artweaver offers a good variety of brushes and allows users to customize them as they like. Its interface is very easy to use. You can choose from pre-added themes to change the look of your canvas. The tool also supports customizable keyboard shortcuts.

Artweaver can also record the drawing process, which other drawing tools do not provide. Users can replay how they created a great drawing and recommend it to others. Furthermore, the tool supports tablet brushes, allowing professional designers to unleash their creativity. Users can also add add-ons to extend the functionality of the software.

Artweaver also excels at collaboration; you can add new team members and work on a drawing at the same time. While Artweaver offers a free version to use essential drawing tools, advanced features are only available in the paid version (which you can purchase from Artweaver's product listing page).
