Do not eat cookies on Christmas

In 1644, **Oliver Cromwell** banned Christmas organization because he thought it was " *immoral* " *behavior* . Many unique features of the holiday are also officially banned, including pastries, biscuits, and Christmas only. This is recorded in the books of Oliver Cromwell's time in power. However, the British are not very interested in this. In a poll, the British put this in the list of " *the most ridiculous laws in the UK* " .

Do not touch the whale

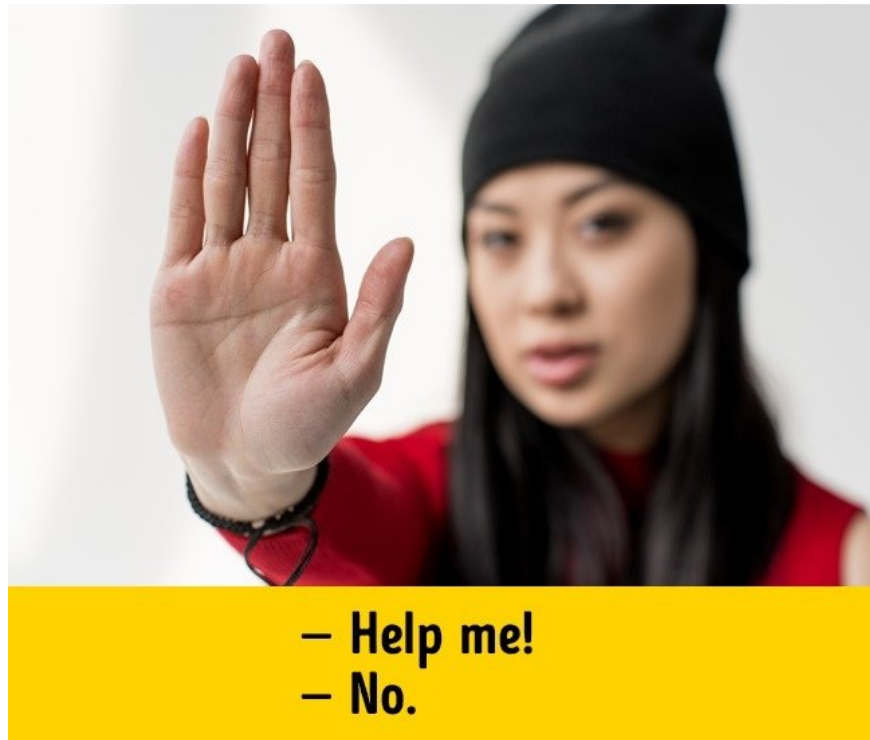

This is another strange law in the UK. All whales, dolphins and other mammals that live in a 3-mile radius are considered property of the queen, so you are not allowed to touch them.

Do not save drowned people

China

The mysterious spiritual aspects of the East have a significant impact on Chinese people. One of them said it was illegal to save drowned people.

This law is related to Eastern philosophy, that interfering with the fate of others is an immoral act. However, many are skeptical that the Chinese government only tries to control population by this provision.

Do not kiss at the train station

France

This law applies in France and some UK stations: **Couples cannot kiss at the train station** . This odd rule first appeared in France in 1910, when trains were often delayed by couples, the couple did not want to leave each other. As a result, the government banned kissing on the platforms but still created a special " *kissing area* ", a place for lovers who could spend some time together.

Do not feed pigeons

It is a good thing to give pigeons a piece of bread, but in Venice, Italy is an illegal and fined act. This law was issued to prevent birds from dirtying statues and structures.

Prohibited egg-shaped toys Kinder Surprise

The famous Kinder Surprise chocolate eggs have been banned all over the US since the date of sale. The reason is that, according to US law, putting food inside toys is prohibited because of fear of choking children by small objects.

In 2013, the country finally allowed to sell Kinder Surprise egg-shaped toys on their shelves. The government allowed the Eggs of Kinders to be sold as long as there were large toys inside the eggs, not food.

Do not pay completely in coins

In Canada, you can't just buy something entirely in coins. A law that has been in effect since 1985 prohibits full payment of coins when buying goods that cost more than Canadian dollars.

Not forgetting his wife's birthday
