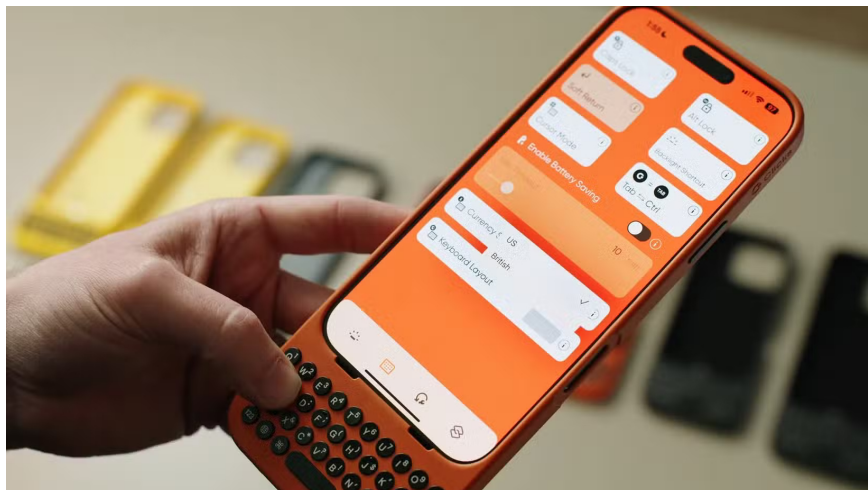

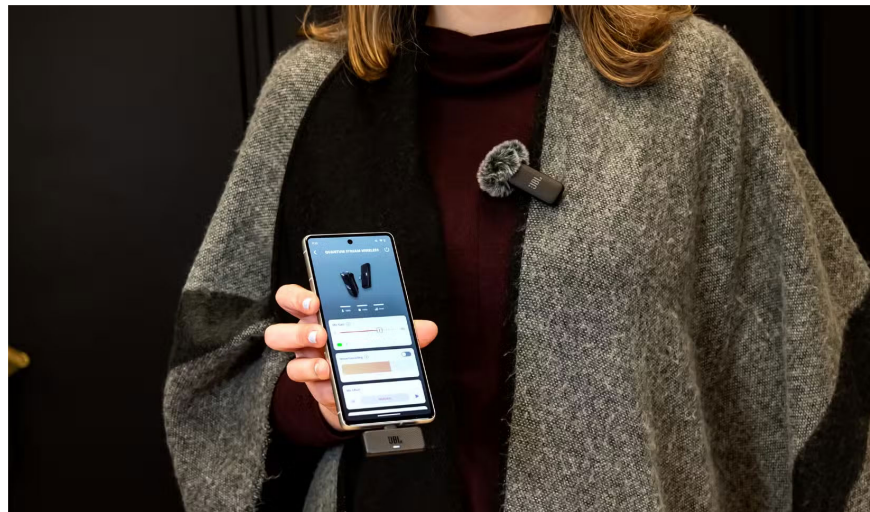
7. USB OTG
