

9 worst tips that new graduates should not listen to

As a graduate student, you get a lot of advice but be smart enough to realize that not all tips are useful.

The mentality of a graduate student often feels hesitant about the options: graduate study, study abroad, go home, apply for a "normal" job to strive for a higher position. accept "don't do anything" to focus on IELTS / TOEFL test in the hope that if you have this "international" license, you will find a job at a multinational corporation or a foreign company. . This is also the advice from many sources, be it parents, relatives, friends and even "older siblings". However, it is not true that all sharing is true for all new graduates and not always applicable.

1. Go to graduate school

Continue studying up. That's it.

Of course, learning up is also a good choice for many recent graduates. However, it is not for everyone. This is an **expensive delaying tactic** if you only do it because you don't know what your goal is.

"If you really are passionate about pursuing a career that requires additional qualifications, that's one thing, and if you study it just because you listen to other people's advice or stereotype, it can make you suffer. The debt is extremely large without receiving any potential benefits in the long run, even studying up makes you delay many of the bigger goals in life. "

2. Go to an office and ask to work

Are you a graduate student with dreams and want to learn from experience? Are you interested in a specific career? So go to any office and offer to work! They will be impressed with your style and maybe, you will get.

Really not! They may not accept you. This is a groundless advice that someone has "accidentally" given you.



In an article on **Ask A Manager** Blog, **Alison Green** contrasted with a number of resumes sent to her office randomly and said: *"It's annoying and doesn't respect other people's time. This action represents a lack of understanding of recruitment activities (because candidates do not decide whether or not they are interviewed) and they also show a lack of understanding of how organizations operate. (because in most areas, everyone is very busy and you have to make an appointment to talk to them - with consent - instead of going directly to the office without any set of facts. Let's set up first).*

3. Hide tattoos

If you are a graduate student with a tattoo on your people and relatives who hate this, then they may recommend that you remove tattoos because it can ruin your career.

According to **Ryan Kahn** - career coach, **The Hired Group** founder and author of **Hired! The Guide for Recent Graduates** (*A job guide for graduates*) says that it is best to avoid confronting "conservative factions" in job interviews.

"However, in some areas, tattooing can give you certain advantages if it suits your corporate culture , " Kahn said. "Learn about the company before the interview." , ask the people who are working there or call the receptionist to find out the information and choose the right outfit. "

4. You must get a job in the right field after graduation

According to Kahn, in the current market context, new graduates should be mentally prepared that they will not get the dream job immediately.



"Using your creativity to find a job in another area will help you develop relevant skills and competencies. For example, if you can't get the desired position in public relations. Let's try to find a job in journalism, marketing or social media, learn as much as possible and when the opportunity comes, you've got everything to be ready to apply. Great choice "

The path to goal is not always straight and clear. So think briefly!

5. Teach

People with degrees are more and more and everyone can become "teachers" in some way. Perhaps, it is for that reason that many graduates choose to teach. Don't listen to these impractical tips because what you learn is not enough to stand on the podium.

6. Participate in enrichment courses

Have you heard of the "fire" people in enrichment courses? Are they characters coming out of sitcom shows? They are not the best people to give you the right advice.

"If you're smart, you'll get a license from a land tomorrow because the property is booming, that's the next great thing! If you don't do that, give all your money. Save on a company I know, you'll get a much bigger amount in a very short time " . Any advice that promises "a shortcut" to becoming rich or predicting such a future trend must be carefully considered. "There are many studies that show that even experts can make inaccurate predictions about a particular economic trend or failed investment," Kerr stressed. You need to consider what is best in the long term. It was not a marathon, it was a sprint.



7. Work at full capacity, even 100%

No matter if sometimes, you don't use your full capacity to work.

"You rarely hear someone suggest not to work as hard as you can but sometimes, that's exactly what you need to do. In today's modern work environment, most of us want to try it all. I can do it anytime, anywhere, but it is not really effective in the long term".

Why?"**Burnout**" syndrome ("clean burning" syndrome) is real. Kahn suggests that new graduates take 10% of the days in each month to "relax" and refresh themselves.

"Reduce your speed and try to focus on an array of work," Kahn said, "you will find that when you reduce all the other troubles, you can successfully complete a small list of work with the least effort. "

8. Pursuing passion

Passion does not always come with a high salary.

Kerr stressed that: **graduates don't worry too much about money because everything will be okay in its way, advice is not good at all.**



"The earlier you start earning money, taking responsibility for your personal finances and planning a sustainable life with the ability to pay for everything yourself, the more happy you will be. Big deals for many young people and they will soon regret this, so when it comes to money, it's like money saying someday, a fairy tale will happen to you or a long financial plan The best term is to invest in lottery tickets "

Basically, the best thing is to take the risk and find the job you love. However, the more important thing is to think carefully about it and need a specific plan.

9. Make sure you have a stable job

Having a stable career is important. But that is not everything, especially when you are "supported" to get a job.

"Of course, the person who gave this advice was well-intentioned but it could be very dangerous," Kerr said, "often, this advice comes from people who have stabilized, dare not reach their dreams and give messages. to emphasize is not alright if it is settled early ". Because it is necessary to feed yourself, there will be times when you want to take a job and wait for the miracle to happen to bring better things. However, this advice sometimes becomes a "trap" that makes you never think of your dream.

You can pursue your goals without a dreamer, unrealistic person or someone who just likes "stability" and accepts a boring life. You just need to be honest with yourself, consider all options and be open to every oncoming opportunity. Sure, you get what you want. Believe so.
