

AAG cable breakdown will be fixed on October 1

Accordingly, the latest repair schedule is as follows: 17 hours on September 26, the repair ship will arrive at the fault cable location. 19 hours on September 28, began welding the cable. It is expected that by 1 am 1.10, the cable will be soldered. At this time, the Internet signal connecting to the world will be stable.

Then, at 4 am 1.10, the unit began to bury the cable and the repair work ended at 6 am 3.10.

Earlier, at 23 hours 41 minutes on September 15, there was a problem that caused the AAG international optical cable line to fail on the S11 cable segment, 64 km from the station of Hong Kong shore. This incident caused the traffic of telecommunication service providers in Vietnam operating on this route to be affected. This is the second time this year that the AAG submarine cable has broken.

Currently, according to *FPT Telecom* 's recommendation, users should only use the Internet to connect internationally for important services, other services should switch to domestic sites to optimize the transmission capacity.
